Declaration

1. It is declared that on 31 October 2024, the respondent made an unauthorised deduction from the claimant's wages in the sum of £1500 and further that the claimant was entitled to holiday pay in the sum of £634.
2. It is further declared that the claimant is entitled to recover from the respondent the sum of £58 pursuant to section 24(2) Employment Rights Act 1996.
3. The claimant must give credit to the respondent for the payments made by the respondent to the claimant in November 2004 and October 2025 totalling £2192.
