I am writing to object to the camera planned for Stoke Lodge, especially Camera [REDACTED], which will face my home on [REDACTED]

I am a parent of young children, and my family has several additional needs. We already cope with a lot at home and we need our house to feel private, calm and safe. A camera pointing towards our windows and front door will take away that sense of safety.

Camera [REDACTED] will look straight at the front of my home. This is where my children play and where we spend most of our time. My children struggle with change, noise and new things. They can become very distressed when something unexpected happens near the house. Having a camera pointed at us will make daily life much harder for them, and for me as their parent.

We are a vulnerable family, and we already work hard to manage anxiety, big emotions and day-to-day challenges. The idea of being filmed when we leave the house or when the children are in the front room makes me feel on edge. It will add stress to a home that already has a lot to manage.

Our road is peaceful, and the field is used in a respectful way by the community. There has never been a need for surveillance cameras here. Adding cameras will completely change the feel of the area and make families like mine feel watched rather than safe.

The cameras and equipment will also spoil the natural look of the field and disturb the wildlife that lives there. The community only needs the green space as it is, without surveillance.

For these reasons, I ask that the camera plans are refused.
