II. Health information

I, the undersigned official veterinarian hereby certify that the captive bird(s) of the consignment described in Part I meet the following requirements:

II.1.1 Country/Territory of origin

- i) The country or territory described in boxes I.7. and I.8 is a member country of the World Organisation for Animal Health.

II.1.2 Premises of origin as described in box I.11

- i) is [approved] or ¹ [registered]¹ by a competent authority in the third country of origin;
- ii) is not subject to national restrictions for animal health reasons;
- iii) has a system in place to maintain and to keep records;
- iv) receives regular animal health visits from a veterinarian;
- v) within a 10km radius of which, including where appropriate, the territory of a neighbouring country, there has been no outbreak of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) or infection with Newcastle's disease virus (ND) for at least 30 days prior to the date of loading for dispatch to Ireland;
- vi) For psittacidae only¹, in which:
- either* [avian chlamydiosis has not been confirmed for a period of at least 6 months prior to the date of loading of the captive birds for dispatch to Ireland;]²
- or* [avian chlamydiosis has been confirmed during the last 6 months prior to the date of loading of the captive birds for dispatch to Ireland, but not during the last 60 days and the measures provided for in Article 55 (e)(i) of Delegated Regulation (EU) 2020/692 have been applied;]²
- or* [the animals have been kept under veterinary supervision for the 45 days prior to the date of loading for dispatch to Ireland and were treated against avian chlamydiosis;]²

II.1.3 Captive Birds

- i) have remained in the establishment indicated in Box I.11 since hatching or for a continuous period of at least 21 days prior to the date of loading for dispatch to Ireland;
- ii) either
- [have not been vaccinated against HPAI]³;
- Or
- [have been vaccinated against HPAI where the captive bird is moving to an establishment where vaccination of captive birds is performed and with the prior approval of the competent authority in Ireland]³
- iii) for ND virus vaccination:
- either* [have not been vaccinated against infection with Newcastle disease virus;]²
- or* [have been vaccinated against infection with Newcastle disease virus with vaccines that comply with both the general and specific criteria of Annex XV to Delegated regulation (EU) 2020/692;]²
- iv) during the 21 days immediately prior to loading for dispatch to Ireland have remained in isolation in officially approved facilities, under the control of the competent authority
- v) have been subjected to a virus detection test⁴ for highly pathogenic avian influenza and infection with Newcastle disease virus with negative results within the period of [7 to 14 days]⁵ [72 hours]⁶ prior to the date of loading for dispatch to Ireland (laboratory test report must be attached)
- vi) have been subjected to a clinical inspection⁷ on / / (dd/mm/yyyy), within the 24 hours prior to loading for dispatch to Ireland, and showed no signs indicative of the occurrence of diseases;
- vii) are moved for the purpose of a conservation programme approved by the Irish Competent Authority and this movement has been authorised in advance by agreement of the Irish Competent Authority (Licence No.:)

II.1.4 Animal transport attestation

I, the undersigned Official Veterinarian, hereby certify that:

Arrangements were made to transport the animals in compliance with Council Regulation (EC) No. 1/2005, IATA guidelines and/or CITES guidelines for transport, where applicable or of other recognised international standards for transport of animals, in particular as regards watering, feeding and the use of the transport container where applicable and it/they is/are fit for the intended transport; ii. The person in charge of the transport of animals submitted a signed written statement, which demonstrates that suitable arrangements have been made for the feeding, watering and care of the animal(s) during transport in accordance with the international standards recognised for the transport of animals; iii. A correctly authorised transporter will be used to transport this/these animals to Ireland; iv. Any transport box or container in which animals are loaded into, is used for the first time or it has been cleaned and disinfected before loading with an officially authorised disinfectant; v. Arrangements have been made to load the animal(s) for dispatch to Ireland into the transport box/container above, which has been so constructed that the captive birds cannot escape or fall out, visual inspection of the space where the bird(s) is kept is possible, and the escape of animal excrements, litter, feed or feathers is prevented or minimised during transportation; vi. The transport box/container is closed in accordance with the instructions of the competent authority of the country or territory of origin to avoid any possibility of substitution of the consignment; vii. The transport box/container only contains captive birds of the same species coming from the same establishment; viii. The transport box/container bears the following information: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (i) name and ISO code of the third country or territory of origin (ii) the number of animals (iii) the name, address and approval number of the establishment of origin (iv) the specific identification number of the container.
