Diplomacy

UK & France lead <u>Coalition of the Willing</u> to support future security UK-Ukraine <u>100 Year Partnership</u> fosters cross-sector collaboration incl. defence & security, science & tech, economy & trade [Jan 25] FS hosted FM Sybiha for <u>UK-Ukraine Strategic Dialogue</u> [13 Nov] Supported <u>UNGA resolutions</u> condemning Russia's: invasion [Feb 25, Feb 23, Mar 22]; attempted annexation of 4 Ukrainian regions [Oct 22]; & attacks on Ukraine's energy infrastructure [Jul 24] At <u>UNSC</u>, we hold Russia to account & reaffirm support for Ukraine At OSCE, we call out Russia weekly & co-fund Support Programme for Ukraine. <u>5 fact-finding missions</u> reported on human rights abuses. Minister Doughty spoke at the <u>Ministerial Council</u> [3-5 Dec] At IAEA, we support efforts towards nuclear safety in Ukraine. UK jointed 56 countries in joint statement to Board of Governors [21 Nov]

Military

Non-military

£5.3bn in non-military commitments since Feb 22. This includes:

- up to £4.1bn in fiscal support through World Bank loan guarantees
- up to £1.2bn in bilateral assistance. Up to £283m in 25/26 will fund humanitarian, energy, stabilisation, reform, recovery & reconstruction

Humanitarian

Committed >£577m assistance to Ukraine and the region [12 Sep] At least £100m in 2025/2026, incl. £10m for Ukraine Humanitarian Fund & £8m for targeted winter assistance [3 Dec & 12 Nov] £12.9 million for HALO Trust for mine action, incl. £4.3m for 2025/26. Over 772,808m² land cleared (May 22 to end Sep 25)

Recovery & Reconstruction

War risk insurance via MIGA & EBRD boosts inward investment £3.5bn cover limit via UKEF for reconstruction projects supported reconstruction of 6 bridges & delivery of mine countermeasure vessels British International Investment, with EBRD has provided €30m for MHP to protect jobs & boost resilience in the agriculture sector [10 Jul] Up to £10.5m for Governance Reform Programme supports efforts on rule of law, justice and anti-corruption [10 Jul]

£25m to strengthen Ukr social protection system & services [7 Feb] £50m economic recovery programme helps SMEs [16 Jan & 5 Feb]

In total, up to £21.8bn committed in support of Ukraine



Energy

Over £450m for energy security and resilience through grant, in-kind support and loan guarantees

£133m for the Ukraine Energy Support Fund including £47m for vital electricity network repairs and critical protection for gas & power infrastructure [12 Nov & 12 Sep]

£1m for Ukraine's Green Transition Office in 25/26 [10 Jul] £17m to support UK and Ukrainian innovators through a second round of UK's Innovate Ukraine Green Energy Competition [5 Feb]

Sanctions

>2,900 individuals, entities & ships sanctioned under the Russia sanctions regime, incl. >2,700 since Putin's full-scale invasion >545 'Shadow Fleet' vessels sanctioned for transporting Russian energy in violation of the Oil Price Cap. With EU, we are lowering the Oil Price Cap to \$47.60 a barrel, directly hitting revenues [18 Jul] UK, US and EU sanctions have denied Russia access to at least

\$450bn since Feb 2022 - equiv. to ~2 years funding for the invasion 99.6% drop in UK goods imports from Russia in 2024 vs. 2021 This Government has imposed sanctions against:

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- <u>24 targets across Russian oil, military and financial sectors</u>. Incl. largest remaining unsanctioned oil companies, after UK sanctioned 2 largest producers <u>Rosneft & Lukoil</u> in October [18 Dec & 15 Oct]
- 7 entities & individuals for their role in destabilising Ukraine [9 Dec]
- the GRU in its entirety & 11 actors behind Russian-statesponsored hostile activity [4 Dec]

War Crimes & Justice

£4.5m new funding to support Ukraine's domestic war crimes investigations - total funding now £11.5m [Dec 24]

Additional £2.3m to the International Criminal Court

>£2.8m to support return & reintegration of forcibly deported Ukr children - 600 identified by pilot tracing mechanism since Sep 25

Support establishing <u>Special Tribunal for the Crime of Aggression</u> - Ukraine ratified bilateral agreement with CoE [15 Jul]

Register of Damage for Ukrainians to record war-related losses. UK chairs governing body & signed CoE Convention on the establishment of a Claims Commission to assess claims [16 Dec]

229,900 Ukrainians have arrived in the UK, including 170,400 via Homes for Ukraine [as of 30 Sep]

<u>Ukraine Permission Extension Scheme</u> opened Feb 25 & <u>extended</u> by 24mths [1 Sep]. 110,792 applications granted [as of 30 Sep]
