Dear Planning Inspectorate,

I would like to **object** to the planning application for 8 CCTV camera masts to be erected on Stoke Lodge Playing Fields.

Below are my particular objections:

- Loss of privacy to my property.

Camera [REDACTED] will likely have a direct line of sight into my garden and property. I do not consent to being filmed on my own property. This will reduce the privacy of my property dramatically. I do not consent for me or my children to be filmed or watched while in my garden or house. I am worried that I would not know who will be the viewer or the keeper of filmings of me and/or my children on my own property. I strongly object to this application on these grounds.

- Aesthetic damage caused by 6m tall masts

The park, the trees and the grounds are beautiful and in my opinion in the curtilage of a listed building (Stoke Lodge). No consideration for the damage to the natural beauty of the area has been considered in this application. I strongly object to this application on these grounds..

- Damage to trees and wildlife

Trenches dug across the park to provide power and communications to the cameras would cause damage to the park and particularly the tree roots. This can cause irreversible damage to the trees, some of which are hundreds of years old. Damaging trees and bushes also has a big knock on the wildlife who depend on them. I strongly object to this application on these grounds.

- Objection to the filming of local children in the playpark.

Camera #8, near the children play park will have a full view of the public playing area. It is unknown who will be viewing, and who will have access to recordings of children in the play park. I do not consent to the filming of me or my children while they are in this public area. This will dramatically reduce the privacy of this area and facilities. I strongly object to this application on these grounds.

I would be able to make an oral submission of the above if a hearing is arranged.
