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Planning applications revealed	During migration analysis was carried out on the planning applications and some have been removed from the Local Land Charges register as they were not registerable due to application type or decision.	<p><b>Before:</b> An unconditional planning consent may have been revealed on a search result</p> <p><b>After:</b> If a planning application is not registerable as a Local Land Charge it will no longer be revealed</p>																



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Spatial Extents	During migration spatial extents were added to all charges. For some historic planning applications where the plan was difficult to match to the current map a decision was made to plot a larger extent to make sure all potential land was covered.	<b>After:</b> Additional charges may now be revealed where the spatial extents cover more land
