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1. Introduction

Children of the 2020s (COT20s) is a national study following the lives of around 8,500 children (and their families) born in England at the start of the 2020s. It is DfE's Education and Outcomes Pathways Study of the Early Years (EOPS Early Years). The study has been commissioned by the Department for Education (DfE) and is being led by University College London (UCL). The independent research organisation Ipsos is carrying out the data collection.

As a longitudinal survey, data collection will be carried out over five waves, when the children are aged 9 months, then at age 2, 3, 4 and 5 years. By following the same families over time, this study aims to answer important questions about children's learning and development, and the findings will be used to improve early education and childcare services.

This report covers the second wave of the study conducted in 2023-2024, when the children were aged 2 years old. It aims to give a detailed description of each of the key stages of wave 2, including the development, implementation, administration and data management.

2. Background

2.1 Summary of Children of the 2020s Wave 1

The mainstage fieldwork for the first wave of the study took place between June and November 2022 and featured a number of key elements.

Firstly, a CAPI interview with the cohort child's primary caregiver (defined as the parental figure who spends the most time caring for the child, e.g. feeding them, or changing their nappies). As the first wave of a longitudinal survey, the intention was for interviews to be conducted face-to-face to maximise response and build engagement with the study. However, due to the impact and uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic, alternative methods were put in place allowing interviewers the option of administering the survey in person (where safe to do so, in line with guidance from the government and the Market Research Society) or administering the survey remotely over MS Teams or telephone.

As part of the interviewer-administered survey, primary caregivers were asked (where applicable) whether they consented to their child's other caregiver(s) (resident and/or non-resident) being invited to take part in the online survey for non-primary caregivers. The primary caregiver had the option of choosing whether they preferred to act as a gatekeeper, who would share the invitation for the online survey on the study's behalf, or whether they were happy to share direct contact details instead.

The surveys asked primary caregivers and non-primary caregivers about linking their survey responses to administrative records held about them and their child by the Department for Education and NHS England (a process known as data linkage).

In addition to the surveys, primary caregivers and non-primary caregivers were invited to download and take part in the BabySteps study app. This is a free smartphone app that was designed by child development researchers to help parents capture their child's learning and development through questionnaires, comments, photos, and video recordings. The app was introduced as part of the individual survey. Interviewers encouraged primary caregivers to download and register the app during their interview. Non-primary caregivers were given information on how to download and register the app as part of their online survey, and for those who provided an email address, a follow-up email was sent containing their unique login information. Registered users were invited to take part in short monthly research activities.

Ethical approval for wave 1 mainstage was granted by UCL Ethics (ref: 0186.002).

Wave 1 mainstage fieldwork resulted in 8,628 productive interviews with primary caregivers and 2,199 online responses from non-primary caregivers.

2.2 Summary of Children of the 2020s Wave 2

The mainstage fieldwork for Wave 2 of the study took place between 4 October 2023 to 2 Feb 2024 when the cohort child was approximately 2 years old.

Wave 2 consisted of an online (CAWI – Computer Assisted Web Interview) survey of the cohort child’s primary caregiver (known as the ‘primary informant’ or PI) from wave 1. Those who did not respond to the online survey were telephoned to do a CATI interview (Computer Assisted Telephone Interview) . If a second parent or resident partner (known as the ‘non-primary informant’ or NPI) took part at wave 1 they were also invited to participate in an online survey for non-primary informants at wave 2 along with any new non-primary informants who were identified via the primary informants’ survey.

In addition to the surveys, primary informants and non-primary informants were reminded to download and take part in the BabySteps study app. The app was available to participants since they took part in the wave 1 interview.

3. Wave 2 pilot

In advance of the mainstage launch for wave 2, a small-scale pilot was carried out between 6 March and 14 April 2023. The pilot aimed to replicate the processes and procedures that would be implemented at the mainstage. Findings from the pilot were reported separately to DfE.

The pilot sample included a mix of those who participated in the wave 1 pilot (sampled from Child Benefit Records held by HMRC) when their child was around nine months old (referred to as 'longitudinal sample') and newly recruited sample to boost the overall number of pilot participants (referred to as 'newly recruited sample').

The primary informant of the child from the longitudinal sample and the newly recruited sample was invited to complete an online survey via an introductory letter and a follow-up email/SMS. If they did not complete the survey after a series of reminders, they were contacted by phone and could either complete the survey over the phone (immediately or by appointment) or were reminded to complete the online survey. The online interview was designed to last around 30 minutes and the telephone interview 35 minutes. The primary informant was offered an e-voucher if they completed the survey. Using the IMD distribution from the wave 1 sample, participants living in the four highest IMD quintiles were eligible for £5 and those living in the lowest IMD quintile were eligible for a £10 voucher¹.

In total, the pilot yielded 125 primary informant interviews, 114 by Computer-Assisted-Web-Interviewing (CAWI) and 11 by Computer-Assisted-Telephone-Interviewing (CATI), and 38 non-primary informant CAWI completes.

Ethical approval for the pilot was granted by UCL Ethics (ref: 23805/001).

Including partial cases, wave 2 mainstage fieldwork resulted in 4,758 productive interviews with primary informants and 1,065 responses from non-primary informants.

¹ Participants who were newly recruited received a slightly higher incentive – a £20 voucher for the primary informant and £10 for the non-primary informant.

4. Overview and scope of Wave 2

4.1 Primary informant (PI) and non-primary informant (NPI) definition

At wave 1 PIs (known as primary caregivers) were defined as the parental figure who spent the most time caring for the child. Often this was the named Child Benefit recipient, though this wasn't a requirement. The PI did not have to be somebody with legal responsibility for the child. For example, a step-parent with no legal responsibility for the child could have been eligible if they met the other criteria.

However, the PI had to be a parental figure. For example, a professional nanny or a grandparent (who has not adopted the child) would not be eligible, even if they were the person who spent the most time caring for the child.

The wave 2 PI was the same as the wave 1 PI except in a very small minority of cases (e.g. if we were contacted and told the wave 1 PI no longer had contact with the child or had passed away), then the wave 1 non-primary informant (NPI) was invited as the Wave 2 PI.

At wave 1, NPIs were defined as the child's other parental figure(s). To be eligible, they needed to be the PI's cohabiting partner, the child's other biological parent, or both. There were two types of NPI: resident and non-resident.

Resident NPIs were a parental figure that lived in the same household as both the PI and the child. They needed to be the PI's partner, the child's biological parent, or both.

Non-resident non-primary caregivers were the child's biological parent who did not live in the same household as both the child and primary caregiver.

Each household could have had up to two non-primary caregivers – each would have been eligible to complete the non-primary caregiver online survey. Non-primary informant eligibility was determined via the CAPI script, which asked primary informants a series of questions about household composition to determine the presence of NPIs in the household that could be invited to complete the online survey.

In addition to NPIs who took part at wave 1, new NPIs (identified in the PI survey) were eligible to take part in the NPI survey at wave 2.

4.2 Primary informant: online and telephone survey

Primary informants who completed the wave 1 survey were invited to take part in the online CAWI survey. The CAWI was estimated to take approximately 30 minutes to

complete and could be completed on a device of the respondents' choosing (smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop computer).

The CAWI consisted of questions on a range of topics, including collecting information about the members of the household, their child's health and development, parenting and the home environment, childcare service use, and parental health, background and finances. Some of these topics included more sensitive questions, such as about their mental health, social support and relationships.

The primary informant CAWI also included modules for placing the BabySteps App and identifying new non-primary informants to invite to complete the non-primary informant CAWI. It also collected details for recontact, provided information on incentives, and contained open text boxes for questionnaire feedback.

Primary informants who did not complete the CAWI by the last week of fieldwork were eligible to be followed up with a call from Ipsos telephone interviewers and given the option to complete the questionnaire over the phone (CATI). The CATI questionnaire contained the same content as the CAWI.

4.3 Non-primary informant: online survey

For the purpose of this study, a non-primary informant (NPI) is defined as the partner of the primary informant, or the child(ren)'s other parent.

All eligible non-primary informants were invited to take part in the wave 2 non-primary informant online CAWI survey. This included non-primary informants who completed the wave 1 CAWI, and non-primary informants newly identified via the primary informant's CAWI or CATI survey. Non-primary informants were invited directly using the contact details provided by either themselves in the wave 1 CAWI or the primary informant's wave 2 CAWI/CATI.

The non-primary informant CAWI was estimated to take approximately 20 minutes to complete and could be completed on a device of the respondents' choosing (smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop computer).

Non-primary informants were told the survey would contain questions on a range of topics, including household composition, parent-child relationship, parental health and wellbeing, background and finances. Demographic information was collected for non-primary informants who did not complete the wave 1 CAWI. Respondents were also reminded of/invited to download the BabySteps app.

5. Sample

5.1 Primary informant sample and sample management

Wave 2 aimed to include all eligible primary informants who took part at wave 1. Wave 1 respondents were able to contact the study helpline by telephone or email between waves, allowing them to update their contact details or opt out of further participation. They were also sent a re-engagement email in August 2023, in which they were encouraged to update their contact details if they had changed.

The wave 2 primary informant sample consisted of wave 1 primary caregivers who completed or partially completed the wave 1 interview, minus any who had opted out or were out of scope between waves (see Table 1). Of the 8,628 partial or full respondents to the wave 1 primary caregiver interview, 16 left the study between waves either because they withdrew (13) or moved out of England (3), leaving 8,611 eligible households in the wave 2 sample.

¹ This figure includes a very small number of households in which: the wave 1 NPI became the PI for future waves. It also includes former PIs who became NPIs at wave 2 but were invited as PIs. An asterisk (*) represents fewer than 5 cases in this category.

Between waves 1 and 2, 72 primary informants contacted Ipsos to update their contact details. 11 of these updated their name; 52 their postal address; 14 their email address; and none their mobile or home phone numbers. In 16 other cases, we deleted the email address we had on record due to bounce-backs from pre-fieldwork communication, indicating an error in the email address or the account no longer being active.

5.2 Non-primary informant sample

Since the wave 2 non-primary informant interview consisted of a subset of the questions that were asked of primary informants, both components were set up in

the same online interview script. The wave 2 sample therefore consisted both of primary informants (the caregiver who had completed the main wave 1 interview) and non-primary informants. Wave 1 non-primary informants who had completed the wave 1 non-primary informant online questionnaire were included in the initial sample and invited at the beginning of fieldwork, i.e. regardless of the respective primary informant's participation. Wave 1 non-primary informants who had not completed the wave 1 non-primary informant online questionnaire, as well as new non-primary informants (e.g. a new partner of the primary informant), were identified during the primary informant interview, where contact details and consent to contact them were collected. These cases were then added to the sample and invited to take part during fieldwork.

The non-primary informant sample therefore consisted of two broad groups:

1. 'Longitudinal' NPI sample: Non-primary informants who participated in the w1 NPI CAWI survey
2. 'Fresh' NPI sample: Non-primary informants who had not participated in the w1 NPI CAWI survey, identified in the w2 PI interview. These might be:
 - a) 'New' NPIs identified at wave 2 (e.g. a new resident partner of the PI who had moved in since the wave 1 interview)
 - b) NPIs identified at wave 1 for whom consent to contact had not been given during the wave 1 interview
 - c) NPIs identified at wave 1 and invited to the NPI CAWI at wave 1 but who had not responded (or had partially completed and not answered the contact details collection questions).

Across these two groups, the NPI sample consisted of three types of NPI: resident partners; resident non-partner parents; non-resident parents (including former resident partners who were reported as having moved out since wave 1, regardless of biological relationship to the cohort child(ren)).

The overall composition of the wave 2 NPI sample is presented in table 2 below.

It was also possible for wave 1 primary informants, included in the wave 2 PI sample described above, to report at the start of their wave 2 interview that they were no longer living with the cohort member(s), and therefore to be ineligible to complete a Primary Informant interview. These respondents were instead directed along the NPI CAWI route. This occurred in five cases, with some going on to complete the NPI CAWI and giving new contact details for the new primary carer for future use in the wave 3 sample. Wave 1 non-primary informants, however, could not be directed down the primary informant route as a result of any change in family situation at wave 2, since the wave 2 PI interview was designed to be conducted with the same person as completed the wave 1 primary caregiver interview.

5.3 Accuracy of sample information

As wave 2 data was collected primarily online we have less information on the accuracy of sample information than from the face-to-face data collection at wave 1, since it is impossible to consistently differentiate between, on the one hand, a potential participant who did not receive our invite letter and email and, on the other, one who simply decided not to take part.

Nevertheless, some data is available that pertains to the accuracy of the sample information attained at wave 1.

Of the 8,611 primary informants in the sample, 8,431 had email addresses to which invitation emails were sent. From these, 21 email "bounce backs" were received, indicating that the email address in the sample was either misspelled or that the email account in question had been closed or their inbox was full. No such bounce backs were received from the 3,299² non-primary informants that were invited to the NPI survey. These figures do not allow us to judge whether there were any cases for whom the email address was misspelled or closed but which did not send bounce backs, or any cases where the misspelled email address was a valid one for somebody else.

Respondents at wave 2 for whom we had an email address in the sample were also asked whether it was correct or the best email address for us to use.³ Of the 4,271 primary informants who were asked this question, 114 answered "No". Of these, 48 appear to have corrected a typo or mistake in the email address in the sample; 56

gave a completely new email address, e.g. following a name change or setting up a new email account; eight typed in an identical email to that in the original sample file; two declined to give an updated address. Of the 855 Non-Primary Informants asked this question, two said the email address in the sample was not the best to use, each giving a new email address they would prefer to be contacted on in future.⁴

Similarly, respondents at wave 2 for whom we had a mobile number in the sample were asked whether it was correct or the best number for us to use in future. Of the 4,251 PIs asked this question, 148 said "no"; as did five of the 372 NPIs asked this. Of these, most (122 PIs, five NPIs) gave completely new phone numbers, with a small number amending typos or mistakes in the number in the sample (16 PIs) or refusing to give a new number (10 PIs).

Finally, respondents at wave 2 were asked to check that the postal address we had on record for them was correct. Of the 4,439 primary informants asked this question, 505 reported that the address was in some way incorrect. Of these, 432 (10% of those asked) provided a completely new address, suggesting that they had moved since wave 1, while smaller numbers adjusted the address (e.g. amended a spelling mistake or added an additional piece of information; 17), gave an identical address (18), or refused to give a new or amended address (38). Of the 607 non-primary informants asked this question, 52 reported that the address was in some way incorrect, of which 46 (8% of those asked) gave a completely new address, one amended the existing address, one gave the identical address, and four refused to give an updated address.

⁴ Non-primary informants were only invited via email, such that a complete email does imply that the email address was functional.

6. Data collection

6.1 Allocation of sample to fieldwork tranches

To maximise responses when the cohort children turned 2 years old, and avoid the Christmas and New Year period, fieldwork was divided into four tranches (sub-sections of the sample). The starting date for each tranche was staggered, for example, respondents whose children were born in September received an invitation to take part in the Age 2 survey in October. For respondents whose children were born in November, we split the sample in two: (a) those born in the first half of the month and, (b) those born in the second half.

Fieldwork dates and primary informant sample size for each tranche is shown in Table 3. The non-primary informant sample size can be found in Chapter 4 Sample.⁵

6.2 Mode of completion: Online (CAWI)

The primary mode of completion for both primary and non-primary informants was online (CAWI), accessed via a link and unique login code. This login code corresponded to that participant's case in the sample file, allowing feedforward data to be used in determining the participant's W1 status (PI or NPI) and their route through the interview. Respondents were asked to confirm their name and date of birth at the start of the interview.

CAWI interviews could be paused and resumed later. The script had 'checkpoints' built in throughout. When a paused interview was resumed, the respondent would see an identity check question (to confirm their name again) and would then start from the last checkpoint they passed. Previously entered data in questions after that checkpoint would be deleted by the script.

⁵ Due to the rolling invitation process for new NPIs, NPI sample is not discussed in terms of tranches.

Respondents were unable to navigate backwards through the script to questions completed before the pause, in order to minimise risk of disclosure of answers to the survey in the unlikely event that somebody other than the initial respondent were to use their login code.

The non-primary informant interview was mostly a subset of the questions asked of primary informants, and both versions of the interview therefore used the same script, with routing determining which questions to ask of a given respondent. Wave 1 primary caregivers who, at the start of the wave 2 interview, reported no longer living with the cohort child(ren), and who were therefore no longer eligible to complete the primary informant interview at wave 2, were routed through the non-primary informant version of the interview. (Note that wave 1 non-primary informants could not be routed along the primary informant route, regardless of any changes in their household.)

6.3 Mode of Completion: Telephone interview (CATI) for Primary Informants

To boost the number of completions, primary informants who did not complete their CAWI survey after 3 to 4 weeks and for whom we had a working telephone number were contacted to complete the survey by telephone (CATI).

Due to the difference in interview length when administered by an interviewer over the phone, the CATI interview was a shorter version of the full CAWI interview (see 14 Technical report appendix).

The role and implementation of the CATI interview is discussed in more detail in Chapter 7 Contact and Communication during data collection .

7. Contact and Communication during data collection

7.1 Re-engagement email

In August 2023 primary informants were sent a news update by email to let them know the Age 2 Survey would be starting later in the year. The email contained early findings from wave 1, plans for the publication of the wave 1 report and a reminder of the monthly research activities they could complete in the Babysteps app if eligible. The email also included links to the FAQs section of the study website, details for the Helpline and information on how to provide the study team with any change of contact details.

7.2 Communications during data collection

Data collection for wave 2 took place between October 2023 and January 2024. During that period primary informants had up to six mailings – two invitations, up to three reminders plus a thank you mailing for those who completed the survey. Non-primary informants had up to five mailings – one invitation, up to three reminders plus a thank you mailing for those who completed the survey.

At the start of wave 1 the issued sample was divided into three tranches according to the birth month of cohort child(ren) – see Chapter 5 Data collection for more details. At wave 2, responding cases from wave 1 were allocated into their corresponding wave 1 tranche with the exception of tranche 3 which was further divided to maximise the number of CATI interviews as tranche 3 straddled the Christmas holiday period. Dates for each invitation and reminder were sent according to a detailed mailing schedule for each tranche.

7.3 Invitations

In total, 11,910 caregivers within 8,611 families were invited to take part in the wave 2 survey. This consisted of two groups:

- 8,611 eligible primary and 1,906 eligible non-primary informants who had taken part in wave 1 (see Table 1 for eligibility criteria). Letter invitations were sent by post a few days prior to the start of each tranche with a follow-up email (or SMS telephone number available but no valid email address) sent on the first day of data collection for that tranche.
- 1,393 new non-primary informants identified during the primary informant wave 2 survey, including non-primary informants who were known about at wave 1 but who did not participate in the NPI CAWI. New NPIs were invited

by email using the email address provided by the primary informants.(see Table 4)

Where a new NPI was identified during the Primary Informant survey, an invitation email was sent to allow them to join the study. The email contained more information about Children of the 2020s, how and why they had been chosen as well as their unique login code and instructions on how to take part.

7.4 Reminders

The first reminder mailing was sent approximately one week after the invitation mailing with the second reminder five days later. Subsequent reminders were sent throughout the data collection period. The reminder schedule was set up to vary the days of the week that the reminders were sent. The first and second reminders were sent by email or SMS if no valid email address was available or by postal letter if no valid email or telephone number was available. Subsequent reminders were sent by email/SMS only. The message of each reminder was tailored to appeal to different reasons for taking part. A final (mop-up) reminder was sent to all non-completers on 29 December 2023 and the survey link closed on 2 February 2024.

An additional reminder (before the final mop mailing) was considered but dropped as the later reminders were yielding slightly higher numbers of opt-outs.

7.5 CATI reminder calls

CATI calls started on 25 October 2023. The initial CATI call plan for each tranche was a two-stage approach where the first call from a CATI interviewer to non-responding primary informants was to check that they received the invitation and to

remind and encourage them to complete the interview online. If participants expressed a preference to complete the interview over the phone, interviewers would conduct the interview by telephone at that point. For those reminded to do the interview online, a second call, approximately a week later, was scheduled to those who had still not completed the survey online. The aim of the second call was to conduct the CATI interview or schedule an appointment to do the interview over the phone.

However, in mid-November, during the CATI phase for Tranche 1, it became apparent that the 'CAWI nudge calls' meant primary informants were less likely to answer calls on the second, interview-focused call. Consequently, the approach was changed such that the focus of the first call was to conduct a CATI interview straight away/make an appointment to conduct the CATI interview.

7.6 Thank-you email / letter

Eligible participants who completed the wave 2 survey were sent a thank-you mailing with details of how to redeem their incentive. These were sent by email or by post depending on the participant's preference and whether they supplied a valid email address. Further details about incentives can be found in Chapter 8 Incentives. Thank-you mailings were sent daily throughout the data collection period.

7.7 BabySteps

The section of the re-engagement email relating to BabySteps was an opportunity to thank those who had been using the app and to remind new users about the app, how to register and get a reminder of their unique login code.

Monthly activities continued to be released throughout the interwave period between wave 2 and wave 3, alongside data collection for wave 2.

Further details about BabySteps engagement and activities can be found in Chapter 13 The BabySteps App and the separate BabySteps technical report.

8. Response

Table 5 below summarises the overall response to the wave 2 survey as a whole, incorporating both CAWI and CATI data collection.

Of the 8,606 issued primary informant cases (excluding those known to be ineligible), 4,438 completed an interview either online (CAWI) or via the shorter telephone interview (CATI), giving a 52% response rate. A further 320 respondents partially completed the primary informant interview. For the purposes of this report, a "partial" interview is defined as any interview that completed at least the first section on their living situation and household composition, but who did not get to the end of the interview. (Cases who started an interview but did not complete this first section are classified as unproductive.)

Amongst those from whom we had no response, it is not possible to estimate what proportion might be classed as "refusals," what proportion might no longer be eligible to participate, and what proportion did not see our invitation to participate due to, for instance, changed contact details.

Of the 3,307 eligible non-primary informants invited to participate in the non-primary informant interview, 1,016 completed it, giving a 31% response rate. A further 49 partially completed the non-primary informant interview (giving a response rate including partially complete interviews of 32%).⁶

Note that the number of eligible cases does not match the number of issued cases exactly. Questions at the beginning of the interview checked respondents' eligibility to be a primary informant by asking whether they still lived with the cohort child(ren). In cases where the wave 1 primary informant no longer lived with the cohort child(ren), they were deemed ineligible to be primary informants at wave 2. 8.1 CATI non-response

The wave 2 survey script was set up to not only enable responses from primary and non-primary informants, but also to allow completion both by the respondent themselves online (CAWI) and by a telephone interviewer (CATI). The CATI team selected eligible primary informants to call from the live sample (either to encourage them to complete online or to complete it by phone then and there), and the survey responses fed into the same dataset via the same interview script that they would have accessed online, with appropriate formatting differences and additional instructions textfilled for the mode used.

The advantage of this approach was that it ensured that interviewers did not call primary informants who had recently completed online, as would have occurred if separate CATI sample files were produced and were worked through independently

of the live CAWI sample. The disadvantage of this approach is that it makes interpreting CATI outcomes more difficult and specific CATI response rates impossible. In particular, when using this approach primary informants who were included in the CATI sample but who went on to complete by themselves via CAWI (either before or after call attempts were made) become indistinguishable from respondents who participated via CAWI without having been passed to the CATI interviewers.⁹ Thus, while we have comprehensive outcome codes for those respondents phoned by the CATI team and who either completed the interview over the phone (presented in Table 5 above) or who did not participate (presented in Table 6 below), calculating the overall CATI sample size is impossible, and we are thus unable to calculate detailed CATI-specific response rates. Respondents moved out of the CATI sample as they completed online and moved into the CATI sample as the length of time since their invite reached 3-4 weeks; as such the CATI sample was fluid rather than a fixed number.

Table 6 presents the unproductive CATI outcome codes for primary informants. By far the most common unproductive outcome was "No answer after maximum number of attempts" (2,917). Of course, it is impossible to know how many of these were telephone numbers that respondents no longer used (and had been reallocated to other people, thus not being flagged as unusable) and how many were ignored or not answered by the primary informants themselves. A further 709 primary informants refused to participate by phone, while 53 made appointments which did not lead to a successful interview, and 58 said they would complete online (but did not). A relatively high number (315) were identified as unusable telephone numbers, although again the proportion of these that were mistyped versus the proportion that had been disconnected due to the respondent changing their telephone number is impossible to identify. 122 respondents who did not complete the survey online had not provided telephone numbers at wave 1.

9. Incentives

As a thank you for taking part, primary and non-primary informants were offered an incentive. Those who took part in wave 2 and lived in the four highest (least deprived) IMD quintiles received a £5. e-voucher code, and those who lived in the lowest (most deprived) IMD quintile received a £10 e-voucher code.

Respondents were asked at the end of the interview whether they would like to receive their e-voucher.

Table 7 shows the number of e-voucher codes administered to eligible primary and non-primary informants, as well as the number turning down the offer of an e-voucher. E-codes could be redeemed using the study's incentive portal where respondents could select from a range of retailers what e-voucher brand they preferred.

Respondents were offered the option to choose whether they wanted their voucher sent by email or by post. If they chose to receive their incentive by email but did not

provide a valid email at the start of the survey, a letter with the voucher e-code (and instructions on how to redeem it) was sent instead.

E-voucher codes were administered by Ipsos via email (e-codes were provided to Ipsos by a supplier). Respondents could redeem their e-codes into e-vouchers that could be used at a variety of shops.

Respondents who complete eligible research activities in the BabySteps app are also offered incentives at the household level to encourage ongoing participation and engagement. These activities consist of mini questionnaires which participants complete in their own time. By participating in these activities, users accumulate reward points within the app that can be redeemed for e-vouchers. Please see Chapter 13 The BabySteps App for further information.

10. Primary Informant Interview

Primary informants (PI) who completed the wave 1 survey were invited to take part in the online CAWI survey. The CAWI was estimated to take approximately 30 minutes to complete and could be completed on a device of the respondents' choosing (smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop computer).

The CAWI consisted of questions on a range of topics, including collecting information about the members of the household, their child's health and development, parenting and the home environment, childcare service use, and parental health, background and finances. Some of these topics included more sensitive questions, such as about their mental health, social support and relationships. For the full questionnaire please refer to Chapter 14 Technical report appendix).

The CAWI also included modules for placing the BabySteps app and identifying new non-primary informants to invite to complete the non-primary informant CAWI. It also collected details for recontact and provided information on incentives.

PIs who did not complete the CAWI or who preferred to complete the survey over the phone were offered the option to complete a CATI interview. The CATI consisted of questions that were a subset of the CAWI (see CATI content section below for full list) and was estimated to take about 20 minutes to complete.

A total of 4,758 primary informants took part in the survey: 4,438 complete responses and 320 partial responses. Please refer to Chapter 8 Response for response by mode.

10.1 Eligibility

Primary informants at wave 2 were the caregivers identified as "primary caregiver" at wave 1, defined as the parental figure who spent the most time caring for the child. Often this was the named Child Benefit recipient, though this wasn't a requirement. The primary caregiver did not have to be somebody with legal responsibility for the child. For example, a step-parent with no legal responsibility for the child could have been eligible if they met the other criteria.

To be eligible to complete as a primary informant at wave 2, participants needed still to have the cohort child(ren) living with them. Questions at the start of the interview established whether this was the case; where it was not, and where the cohort child(ren) was living elsewhere, participants were interviewed as non-primary informants instead. There was no mechanism by which non-primary informants could, by virtue of a change in circumstances identified in the interview script,

become primary informants. Prior to the start of fieldwork, in cases where we knew the primary caregiver was ineligible, the wave 1 non-primary caregiver was transferred to become a primary informant at wave 2.

PIs were invited to participate in the CAWI in the first instance. However, provisions were made for respondents who preferred to complete the survey over the phone or who were unable to complete the CAWI (e.g., due to the lack of appropriate technology). The option of completing the survey via a CATI interview was also extended to respondents who had started, but not completed, the online survey by a specified date for each tranche.

10.2 Questionnaire development

Initial questionnaire development was focused on the primary informants' CAWI. Once this was finalised, a subset of these questions was selected for inclusion in the CATI.

The questionnaire included both scientific content, i.e. questions designed to collect data necessary for the scientific goals of the study, and more process-oriented questions. The development of the scientific content, including the demographic information collected about each household, was led by UCL, in consultation with the DfE as well as the study's Steering Group and Technical Advisory Group consisting of advisors with a range of scientific, methodological and policy expertise. The development of process-oriented questions and the adaptation of the scientific content to the computer-assisted web interview environment was conducted by Ipsos.

Both the primary and non-primary informant questionnaires were piloted concurrently. Feedback from respondents who participated in the pilot, as well as analysis of the pilot interview data and further consultation with the DfE and the Steering and Technical Advisory Groups, informed changes to the mainstage questionnaire. Further details about the pilot are discussed in Chapter 3 Wave 2 pilot.

10.3 Questionnaire Content

A total of 4,115 respondents completed the CAWI, 293 completed the CATI, and 30 completed the survey across the two modes (i.e., CAWI and CATI).

The primary informant online questionnaire contained questions on the following topics:

- Primary informant's living situation and the household composition: This included verifying information about the living arrangement(s) of the cohort child(ren) and any resident or non-resident parent and/or partner.
- Child's health and development: This included questions around the child(ren)'s health; visits to accidents and emergencies (A&E) in the last 12 months; Child's sleep and language development; as well as socio-emotional development.
- Parenting and Home Environment: This included questions about the respondent's relationship with the child(ren); their experiences of parenting; activities they do with their child(ren); and the home environment.
- Childcare and Service Use: This included questions about use of childcare, if any, since wave 1; division of parental care responsibilities; and their experiences with service use.
- Parental Health and Wellbeing: This included questions about the respondent's mental health and relationships with their partners.
- Background and Finances: This included questions about the respondent's employment history; parental leave; any benefits they receive; as well as their household income and financial situation.
- NPI Survey Placement: Respondents were asked whether they consent to their partner (resident and/or non-resident) or the child(ren)'s other parent being invited to take part in the NPI CAWI.
- BabySteps App Placement: Respondents were reminded about the BabySteps app, and those who had not previously created an account were invited to download it and register an account using a unique log in code provided.
- Contact Details: Respondents were asked to update and/or verify their contact details which will be used to keep them updated about the study.
- Incentives: Respondents were asked if they would like to receive an incentive for completing the survey.

Where necessary, questions were adapted for an online interview environment. This primarily involved:

1. Arranging sets of similar questions into a “carousel grid” format, to ease data entry.
2. Removing interviewer instructions and placing additional information in “information buttons” that respondents could access if they had questions, but which would not distract from the main question wording.
3. Replacing “don’t know” and “prefer not to say” answer codes with responsive codes, which would appear only if the respondent attempted to move to the next page without having entered a valid answer. This largely replicated the way these codes would have been handled in a CAPI environment, where these answer options would be available for interviewers to use but which were not read out or displayed on showcards.

10.3.1 CAWI vs CATI Content

Table 8 shows the content of the CAWI questionnaire and the subset of topics in the CATI.

Where necessary, questions were adapted for a CATI environment. This primarily involved:

- Including interviewer instructions to read out any additional information which may help participants clarify a question

- Including instructions such as “DO NOT READ OUT” for “don’t know” and “prefer not to say” answer codes which would have otherwise been responsive codes in the CAWI

10.4 PI interview timings

Timestamps in the CAWI and CATI data allow us to calculate the length of each interview.

Interview lengths were calculated by subtracting the time at which the interview started from the time at which the interview ended. This overall interview length was then adjusted to account for the possibility of interviews being left for a period and returned to later in the day or on another day, which if not accounted for would artificially inflate the average interview length. Partially complete interviews and interviews carried out over multiple days were excluded from this calculation.¹¹ For interviews conducted within one day, the interview was split into 57 sections, with timestamps recorded between each section. Each section was analysed to identify outliers, defined as any case in which a particular section took longer than 20 minutes to complete.¹² Where such outliers were identified, the length of that section was replaced with the mean length of that section amongst non-outlier cases. This allowed these cases’ times for all remaining sections to still be included in the overall analysis, which was considered necessary given that those interviews that took a long time to complete are thought to be more likely to be paused and returned to, such that simply excluding cases with such pauses would likely artificially decrease the average interview length.

10.4.1 CAWI Timings

Table 9 below shows the mean and median timings for the primary informant CAWI. The mean interview length was 32.2 minutes and the median interview length was 28.8 minutes.

10.5 Characteristics of responding PI sample

10.5.1 Age of cohort member at completion of PI survey

The target age for wave 2 data collection was when the cohort child was at least 24 months. 82% of all interviews were conducted when the cohort child was aged either 24 or 25 months. A further 9% were interviewed when the cohort child was 26 months, 5% at 27 months and 3% at 28 months (Table 11).

10.5.2 Demographic characteristics of responding primary informants

The following tables show the demographic profile of primary informants who were interviewed as part of wave 2 mainstage fieldwork. Most of the information was collected as part of the Age 2 survey, except for the IMD and IDACI demographic data which was calculated for the issued sample at wave 1. These tables include information for partial and complete interviews.

In terms of the Index of Multiple Deprivation, the spread of participants at wave 2 broadly matches that of the issued sample at waves 1 and 2. Those in the most deprived decile were slightly less represented in the same, making up 16% of the achieved sample compared to 18% of the issued sample. Conversely, those in the least deprived decile were slightly more represented in the achieved sample, making up 8% of the achieved sample compared to 6% of the issued sample. All other groups were within 1% of the proportion in the issued sample. Those in the most deprived decile were also more likely to have participated in the CATI survey, making up 20% of that sample; however, the relatively small number of CATI interviews compared to the number of CAWI interviews means that caution should be taken when interpreting this, especially given the lack of a consistent pattern across the spread of deciles and the fact that this pattern is not reflected in the other deprivation measure presented below.

11. Non-Primary Informant interview

As at wave 1, non-primary informants were invited to participate in a separate online survey. All eligible non-primary informants were invited to complete the same online survey. Invitations specified that this online survey should take around 20 minutes to complete and could be completed on a device of their choice (smartphone, tablet, laptop, or desktop computer). They were also informed that the survey would:

- ask questions about their family life
- ask whether they consented to information held about them in government administrative records being added to their survey responses (for newly identified non-primary informants only)
- invite them to download 'BabySteps', a smartphone app that has been designed by academics to help parents capture their child's learning and development (if they had not done so already)

Overall, 1,065 non-primary informants took part in the online survey. 1,016 full responses and 49 partial responses were submitted during Wave 2 mainstage fieldwork.

11.1 Eligibility criteria

At wave 1, parental figures other than the selected primary caregiver were eligible for the non-primary caregiver survey if they were the primary caregiver's cohabiting partner, the child's other biological parent, or both. There were two types of non-primary caregivers: resident and non-resident.

Resident non-primary caregivers were a parental figure living in the same household as the primary caregiver and child. They needed to be the primary caregiver's partner, the child's biological parent, or both. Non-resident non-primary caregivers were the child's biological parent who did not live in the same household as the child and primary caregiver. Each household could have had up to two non-primary caregivers – each would have been eligible to complete the non-primary caregiver online survey.

The definition of a non-primary informant at wave 2 broadly follows on from this wave 1 definition of a non-resident caregiver, with two exceptions. First, at wave 2 up to three possible NPIs could be invited: the two potentially identified at wave 1, plus a potential new resident non-primary caregiver if applicable, such as a new partner of the primary informant. Second, considerations surrounding the invitation process necessitated a loosening of the eligibility criteria, described in more detail below.

As described in Chapter 4 Sample, the non-primary caregiver sample consisted of a mix of:

- Group 1. Those participating in the non-primary caregiver survey at wave 1.
- Group 2. Those identified as non-primary caregivers at wave 1 but who did not participate in the wave 1 non-primary caregiver survey.
- Group 3. New non-primary caregivers identified in the primary informant's wave 2 interview. This group consists of new partners of the primary informant who are not biological parents of the cohort child(ren).
- Group 4. Wave 1 primary caregivers who, at the beginning of the wave 2 interview, report a change in circumstances such that they are no longer eligible to be the cohort child's primary informant by virtue of no longer living with them.

Non-primary informants in group 1 were invited at the beginning of fieldwork, i.e. at the same time as the primary informant for their child was invited, and therefore before that primary informant had participated. Similarly, those in group 4 were invited as primary informants initially, having been transferred to the NPI survey based on the information reported at the beginning of the interview. Those in groups 2 and 3 were invited only after the primary informant for the cohort child(ren) had completed their interview, given consent for the non-primary informant to be contacted, and had given the non-primary informant's contact details.

Since groups 1 and 4 were invited at the beginning of fieldwork, and therefore before updated information about their status with respect to the cohort child(ren) had been collected from the primary informant, eligibility for inclusion in these groups was necessarily based on their wave 1 status. The consequence of this is that those informants invited as part of these groups who are not biological parents of the cohort child(ren) were invited at wave 2 despite the possibility of them no-longer living with the cohort child(ren) or being in a relationship with the primary caregiver. As such, the wave 2 sample – and therefore the wave 2 interview data – is likely to include a small minority of non-primary informants who would not have been eligible according to the eligibility criteria at wave 1, namely former resident partners of the primary informant or former primary informants who are not biological parents of the cohort child(ren).

For consistency with groups 1 and 4, and to avoid lengthy and complicated household composition questions in the wave 2 interview, this criteria for eligibility was carried over to group 2. As such, people identified as resident partners of the primary informant at wave 1 who did not participate in the wave 1 non-primary caregiver survey and who were no longer living with the cohort child(ren) were

included in group 2 (dependent upon the primary informant consenting and providing contact details) regardless of their relationship to the cohort child(ren).

11.2 Eligibility and placement

The placement of the online non-primary informant survey occurred near the end of the primary informants' CAWI script. Primary informants were asked for consent to invite the non-primary informant to take part in the online survey directly, via email.

If a household contained a resident and non-resident non-primary informant this process was repeated, first for the resident and then the non-resident non-primary informant. Consent, full name, email address and mobile number were collected individually for each non-primary informant.

Given the sampling approach described above, our picture of eligibility for an invitation to complete the wave 2 non-primary informant survey is somewhat complex. **Table 17** below presents how many non-primary informants were eligible to be invited amongst the four groups described above.

For NPI groups 2 and 3, figures are given separately for those potentially eligible, i.e. households in which a resident partner, resident non-partner parent, or non-resident parent who had not participated in the NPI survey at wave 1 were identified; for those households in which the primary informant was asked for consent to contact the non-primary informant; for those in which the PI gave consent and a valid email address for the NPI; and for households in which the non-primary informant was actually invited. Consent was not asked in some households because the interview was only partially completed (with these consent questions coming at the end of the interview), or because the primary informant interview was conducted too late in the fieldwork period for there to be time for the NPI to be invited and still have time to participate. Only NPIs associated with households in which the Primary Informant completed their interview were invited. In theory, households where both a resident and a non-resident non-primary informant were invited would be represented twice. However, there were no households in which more than one NPI was eligible to be invited at wave 2.

In total, across the different groups, 3,303 eligible non-primary informants were invited to participate. Amongst primary informants who were asked for consent to contact a non-primary informant at wave 2 (i.e. primary informants who identified non-primary informants in groups 2 and 3 above; 2,389 in total), 1,417 (59%) gave consent and provided a valid email address, with 1,393 of these actually being invited. Consent was higher when asked about contacting resident partners (65%) than resident non-partner parents (53%) and was low (26%) when asked about contacting non-resident parents.

10.3 Questionnaire development

Initial questionnaire development was focused on the primary informants' CAWI. Once this was finalised, a subset of these questions was selected for inclusion in the non-primary informants' CAWI.

The questionnaire included both scientific content, i.e. questions designed to collect data necessary for the scientific goals of the study, and more process-oriented questions. The development of the scientific content, including the demographic information collected about each household, was led by UCL, in consultation with the DfE as well as the study's Steering Group and Technical Advisory Groups. The development of process-oriented questions and the adaptation of the scientific content to the computer-assisted online interview environment was conducted by Ipsos.

Both the primary caregiver and non-primary caregiver questionnaires were piloted during the same period. Feedback from respondents who participated in the pilot, as well as analysis of the pilot interview data and further consultation with DfE and the Steering and Technical Advisory Groups, informed significant changes to the mainstage questionnaire. Further details about the pilot are Chapter 3 Wave 2 pilot .

10.4 Content

The non-primary informant online questionnaire contained a subset of questions asked of primary informants, with a few additional questions including those confirming their residency and relationship with the primary informant.

The non-primary informant online questionnaire contained questions on the following topics:

- Non-primary informants' living situation and relationship to primary informant (if non-resident)
- Child's health & development (child's sleep)
- Parenting & home environment (parental confidence, parent-child relationship, parenting (including languages spoken at home), parent-child activities, home environment and father's involvement)
- Childcare & service use (to resident non-primary informants, about the division of parental care responsibilities)
- Parental health & well-being (parental stress, parenting self-efficacy, social support, loneliness, couples' relationships and parental mental health)

- Background & finances (employment, parental leave, work-life balance, benefits, family income, housing tenure, managing financially, keeping up with bills, disadvantage indicators)
- Demographics (age, gender, biological sex, occupation, ethnicity, religion and education)
- The Children of the 2020s study app, BabySteps, introduction (if the non-primary informant had not set up an account)
- Data linkage to DfE and NHS Digital records (for new non-primary informants only)
- Contact information (asking for information necessary for ensuring recontact at later waves)

Where necessary, questions were adapted for an online interview environment. This primarily involved:

- Arranging sets of similar questions into a “carousel grid” format, to ease data entry.
- Removing interviewer instructions and placing additional information in “information buttons” that respondents could access if they had questions, but which would not distract from the main question wording.
- Replacing “don’t know” and “prefer not to say” answer codes with responsive codes, which would appear only if the respondent attempted to move to the next page without having entered a valid answer. This largely replicated the way these codes would have been handled in a CAPI environment, where these answer options would be available for interviewers to use but which were not read out or displayed on showcards.

10.5 Mode

Unlike the primary informant survey, which was designed to be conducted through a mix of CAWI and follow-up CATI calls, the non-primary informant survey was designed to be conducted exclusively via CAWI. NPIs were invited in the tranche allocated to the PI and the online survey link closed for all on 2 February 2024.

However, an error meant that for a brief period some of the NPI sample was included in the CATI call sample, and as a result 49 non-primary informants conducted their interview via CATI. Since the PI and NPI interviews were conducted using the same script, all adaptations for the CATI mode implemented for the PI CATI interview were

in place for these cases. Since the CATI interview was shorter than the CAWI, data will be missing for some questions for these cases.

10.6 Timings

Timestamps in the CAWI data allow us to calculate the length of each interview.¹⁵

For interviews conducted within one day, the interview was split into 57 sections, with timestamps recorded between each section. Each section was analysed to identify outliers, defined as any case in which a particular section took longer than 20 minutes to complete.¹⁶ Where such outliers were identified, the length of that section was replaced with the mean length of that section amongst non-outlier cases. This allowed these cases' times for all remaining sections to still be included in the overall analysis, which was considered necessary given that those interviews that took a long time to complete are thought to be more likely to be paused and returned to, such that simply excluding cases with such pauses would likely artificially decrease the average interview length.

Once adjusted in this way, the minimum time taken to complete the non-primary informant online survey was 6.7 minutes. The maximum recorded time taken was 104.1 minutes (Table 18). It is likely that interviews taking as long as the maximum length were completed with repeated small breaks, which would not have been excluded by the methodology described above. The mean interview length was 23.3 minutes; the median was 20.6 minutes.

Based on the length of the script, it was estimated that the survey would take non-primary caregivers with one cohort child 20 minutes to complete. As such, this was the survey length communicated in the invitation and reminder mailings. Non-primary

informants with more than one cohort child (i.e. twins/triplets) were expected to take longer to complete the survey. Table 19 outlines the minimum, maximum, mean and median time taken by number of cohort children. Please note outliers have also been excluded from this table; note also the small number of cases on which the timings for NPI's with two cohort children are based.

12. Data processing

Data processing for the primary caregiver and the non-primary informant online and telephone questionnaires was conducted by Ipsos. Data processing from the BabySteps app was led by UCL.

Data processing for Children of the 2020s can be seen as consisting of the following stages:

- Data checks during fieldwork
- Coding
- Data checking
- Data editing
- Production of derived variables

12.1 Data checks during fieldwork

Early data checking during fieldwork included analysis of timestamp data to calculate how long the interview was taking on average. This analysis excluded outliers on a section-by-section basis, to account for interviews that may have been paused during a particular module and enabled the study team to examine which sets of questions were taking longer than expected, informing decisions about necessary cuts.

General data quality checks were also carried out to identify any problems either in the script or in how questions were being interpreted. No problems of this kind were identified during fieldwork checks.

12.2 Coding

Many questions in both the primary and non-primary informant questionnaires had “other (specify)” answer codes, where participants could enter their answer in an open text box. These text answers were coded by Ipsos’s coding team. Where the answer given reflected a pre-existing answer code, these were “back coded” to the pre-existing code; where it did not, new answer codes were created.

The Ipsos coding team used the Ascribe coding system to code all free-text responses. As standard, five per cent of coded responses were validated by the Team Manager/Team Leader to ensure coding quality.

In the published dataset, original answer codes (including simply a numeric value for all those selecting “other (specify)” are included, alongside separate variables for

coded data (variables ending in “_coded”) and a combined variable containing data from both the original variable and the coded variable (ending in “_comb”).

12.3 Data checking and editing

Extensive post-fieldwork data checking was conducted. Unlike at wave 1, where the primary informant and non-primary informant datasets were completely separate, at wave 2 data from both were collected using the same underlying script and so could be checked together where the two interviews overlapped. Data for every variable in the dataset was compared to the data for those questions involved in its routing, such that any case that should have been asked a question but did not have a response, or any case that should not have been asked a question but did have a response, was identified.

This process identified some responses at questions where there should not have been. This was a result of off-path data being saved, which can occur when respondents go back in the interviewing script to change a previous answer, and as a result are routed along a different “path.” In such cases, any data which had been recorded in off-path questions (i.e. those questions which were no longer relevant given the respondents’ revised responses at earlier questions) were edited to be “not applicable.”

This process also identified a few minor errors in the interview script. These were:

- It was identified that a script error at W2_MCCJANP resulted in people interviewed on or after 02/01/2024 who said at W2_MCCAR that they did not use any childcare (W2_MCCAR11=1) were mistakenly not routed to W2_MCCJANP. Cases where this has occurred have been given a value at all W2_MCCJANP variables (W2_MCCJANP1 to W2_MCCJANP12) of -94 “Not answered – script error” for clarity. See the wave 2 Data User Guide for more information.
- The derived variable RPNP_WV2 was produced by the script to determine which Primary Informants reported there being a resident parent of the cohort member(s) who was not a partner of the PI at wave 2, for the purposes of routing within the script. An error in the way the script was set up for this variable meant that 2 cases were incorrectly identified as not having a resident non-partner parent, meaning that these 2 cases were incorrectly not routed to W2_ROPCAREH and W2_MDISNONPART, which used RPNP_WV2 in their routing conditions. For these two cases, the data was edited to use a value of -94 “Not answered – script error”. For analysis purposes, it is recommended to use DVCohabNotRelat which has corrected for this error. See the wave 2 Data User Guide for more information.

As mentioned in Chapter 8 Response, a small number of non-primary informants were mistakenly included in the CATI sample and some (n=49) of these completed interviews via CATI. This caused some inconsistencies in the data which were edited post-fieldwork.

Other inconsistencies in the data were identified as resulting from respondents completing their interview across more than one mode. Some data editing was required to account for this. See the wave 2 Data User Guide for more information.

A few checks flagged inconsistencies as a result of data change requests made by respondents after the interview.

Finally, checks were carried out of the derived variables computed by the interview script.

12.4 Production of derived variables

The published dataset contains a number of derived variables drawing on the interview data. These are listed in the User Guide to the dataset alongside the questions they are derived from and any pertinent notes on their derivation.

12.5 Weighting primary caregiver data

The approach for weighting the wave 2 data had three components:

- The final weights from the main wave 1 Children of the 2020s CAPI survey.
- Weights to adjust for whether a respondent participated in the wave 2 survey.
- Calibration weighting to ensure that the weighted profile of the responding sample perfectly matched the population estimates for the original three birth months of the study.

12.6 The final COT2020s survey weights

The weights from the main wave 1 sample were carried forward for all families. These weights adjusted the final wave 1 CAPI participating sample so that it was representative of the population of all families with a child born in the three-month birth period (September to November 2021).

Details of how this weight was produced are in the Technical Report for the main wave 1 survey.

12.7 Weights for participation to the PC CAWI survey

The second stage of weighting was to generate weights which adjusted for whether the wave 1 primary caregiver (PC) participated in the wave 2 survey and therefore became the w2 primary informant. This was done by running a stepwise logistic regression model. The outcome code was whether the PC participated or not, and the covariates were a combination of the measures used for the wave 1 CAPI weighting and measures from the survey itself. The model was then used to calculate an estimate of the propensity for participation in the wave 2 survey. The weights were then calculated as the reciprocal of those estimated propensities.

The model was fitted applying the wave 1 CAPI weights, scaled to have mean 1. The parameters for the non-response model are shown in Table 20.

The values of the non-response weights ranged from 1.15 to 11.42. Given that this was a fairly wide range, these weights were trimmed at the 1% and 99% percentiles (1.24 and 3.90 respectively).

12.8 Calibration Weights

The third and final stage of the weighting was to calibrate the combined weights from the first two stages to population estimates from the child benefit records which were supplied by HMRC for the initial three-month birth period. These were counts of: gender by region, and the number of children aged 0 to 15 in the household by region. More than one child could be included in the calibration weighting for the same household to allow for multiple births.

The starting weights for the calibration were calculated by multiplying the weights from the first two stages and then rescaling the combined weights so that they summed to 1 within each region. This was done so that the calibration weighting adjusted to the proportions in each group within region rather than to the counts themselves (Table 21); note that it makes no difference to the final weights whether proportions or counts are used.

The adjustment that the calibration weighting made to the initial weights ranged from 0.71 to 1.28. This is such a narrow range that no trimming of the weights was required.

As the weights were scaled for proportions within each region, they were re-scaled within each region so that the weighted profile by region matched the population counts. These grossing weights were then re-scaled again (but across the full sample) to have mean one as is standard for weighting.

The efficiency of the final weights is 87.0%. A component of that is due to the original disproportionate sampling by the deprivation of the area.

13. The BabySteps App

13.1 Overview

At wave 1, primary informants and non-primary informants were invited to download and take part in the study app called BabySteps. This is a free smartphone app that was designed for the Children of the 2020s study by child development researchers at UCL to help parents capture their child's learning and development through questionnaires, comments, photos, and video recordings.

The app functions as a data collection tool and a study engagement platform during and between study waves. It has the capability for remote data collection through short monthly research activities. These activities consist of mini questionnaires and video data collection, which participants can complete in their own time. By participating in these activities, users accumulate reward points within the app that can be redeemed for e-vouchers. Participants receive notifications within the app to alert them when a research activity becomes available. These activities primarily involve responding to short questionnaires covering topics related to child development. BabySteps data collection is expected to continue until wave 5

More detailed information about the app, the research activities involved, the level of engagement in the in-app activities, engagement attrition and other components of the app, can be found in the separate BabySteps app report as well as the wave 1 technical report.

13.2 Placement of the app

Primary informants were reminded of the BabySteps app in the re-engagement mailing sent prior to the start of wave 2. The mailing included a recap of the key features of the app, information on how to register and use the app. Links were also included to the FAQs page of the study website and the email address for the UCL team if anyone needed a reminder of their unique login code.

As at wave 1 families with twins or triplets were ineligible for completing the research activities as the app does not accommodate multi-birth families. Caregivers of twins or triplets were still encouraged to download the app/continue using the app to keep in touch with the research team and to use the 'Baby Diary' to record memories of their children as they grow and develop. They could also browse the 'News and Articles' section of the app, stay up to date with the progress of the Children of the 2020s study and find regularly updated articles on the science of child development.

Wave 2 primary informants were the same people as wave 1 primary informants,¹⁷ so therefore had been told about and invited to use BabySteps in the past, whereas the non-primary informant sample was made up of both those who had participated at wave 1 and those who had not. Amongst all informants who had participated previously, some had registered on the BabySteps app and some had not. Please refer to the wave 1 technical report for more information.

In the wave 2 interview, those who had been interviewed at wave 1 were asked if they currently use the app, and if not, whether they had created an account and then stopped using it or had never set up an account. Table 22 presents the status of users' accounts amongst respondents who had been interviewed previously, reported separately for primary and non-primary informants.

Those who were not currently using the app were reminded of the email address they used to register their account (if they had already registered) or given fresh account details if they had not already registered or had problems logging in with their previous details.

Those who had not previously set up an account, including non-primary informants who had not been interviewed at wave 1, were introduced to the app and asked if they were happy to take part in using the app. Of these, 44% of primary informants and 36% of non-primary informants agreed (Table 23). Those who agreed were given login details and asked to register on the app.

According to app data, a total of 6,828 BabySteps accounts had been created prior to the launch of wave 2 fieldwork on 4 October 2023. Of these, 6,238 were created by PIs and 590 by NPIs.

Between the start of wave 2 fieldwork and the beginning of wave 3 fieldwork on 7 November 2024, an additional 165 BabySteps accounts were created; 135 by PIs and 30 by NPIs. All of these were new users who had not registered an account prior to the launch of wave 2.

13.3 E-vouchers

In addition to the standard features in the app, short monthly research activities were released between the wave 2 and wave 3 interviews. The completion of one qualifying research activity accrued eligible informants one reward point. Upon completion, respondents were notified of the number of reward points earned on the 'activity completion confirmation page'. The total number of reward points accrued was displayed in the reward point meter shown on the app's home page.

Respondents became eligible for a £5 e-voucher each time they accrued five reward points. At the beginning of each month, UCL securely transferred the details of those eligible to receive a £5 voucher to Ipsos who administered the voucher codes by email. Voucher codes were purchased from an external supplier.

Families with twins/triplets were not eligible to take part in the research activities and were therefore not eligible to accrue e-vouchers but could still use the other features within the app.

13.4 Account deletions

If a user no longer wishes to use their BabySteps account, they may request for it to be deleted. Upon deletion, all personal data associated with the account will be permanently removed from the app servers. However, any anonymised data collected through the app, such as responses to questionnaires, will be retained for research or analytical purposes. Once an account is deleted, the user will no longer be able to access the BabySteps app.

A total of 38 BabySteps account deletion requests had been received prior to the launch of wave 2 fieldwork on 4 October 2023. Of these, 34 were requested by PI accounts and 4 by NPI accounts.

Between the start of wave 2 fieldwork and the beginning of wave 3 fieldwork on 7 November 2024, an additional 13 BabySteps account deletions were requested (the majority by PIs rather than NPIs).
