At 2145 hours members of C Coy brought an Iraqi detainee to the RAP. He had collapsed in their EPW cage where he was being held following his earlier arrest in a joint operation with [REDACTED] SMU [REDACTED] Time of collapse 2111 hrs.

The Company medic had attended and told me that on his arrival the patient was not breathing and had no palpable pulse. He began CPR on site and then arranged evacuation to the RAP. Throughout the transfer he was unresponsive, not breathing and had no palpable pulses.

Airway: Oro-pharyngeal airway already passed, no passage of air despite chin lift, jaw thrust and extension of the neck to open the airway.

Breathing: No movement of the chest, no breath sounds, no reading on Oxygen saturation monitor. Bag, valve, mask ventilation begun with 100% oxygen attached.

Circulation: No pulses central or peripheral, no heart sounds or apex beat. CPR begun.

Disability: Pupils fixed and dilated, no reaction to light.

Exposure: Cold to the touch, covered in dust, no obvious injury noticed.

#### Resuscitation Log:

- 2145 Patient arrived.
- 2147 CPR begun.
- 2148 Defibrillator applied. No shock advised.  
Continued CPR.  
IV access obtained.
- 2149 1mg Adrenaline IV.  
3 minutes CPR.
- 2152 Defibrillator applied. No shock advised.  
1mg Adrenaline IV.  
3mg Atropine IV.  
3 minutes CPR.
- 2155 Defibrillator applied. No shock advised.  
1mg Adrenaline IV.  
3 minutes CPR.
- 2158 Resuscitation efforts terminated.  
Death confirmed

Despite good CPR and Adrenaline as per ALS protocols there was no response. There was no identifiable reversible cause of his Non-VF/VT arrest and therefore the cause of death is unknown.
