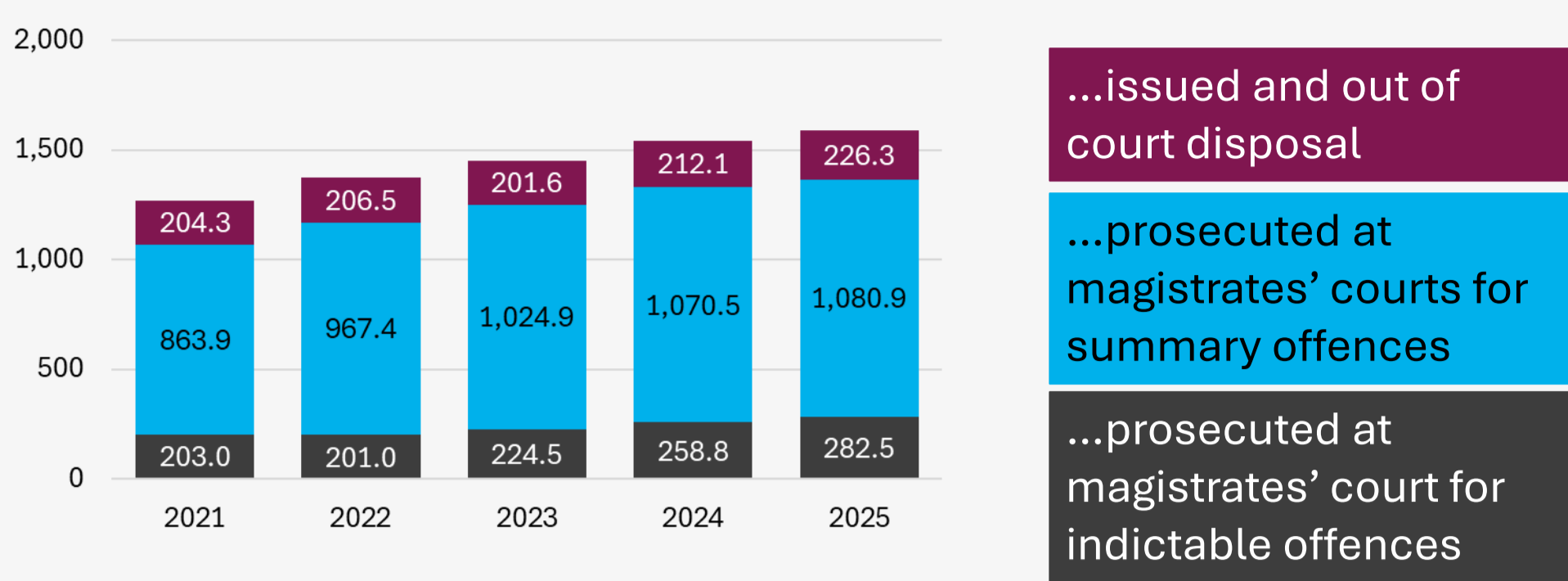

## Overview

1.59 million individuals were prosecuted or given an out of court resolution in 2025

Number of individuals (in thousands) who were:



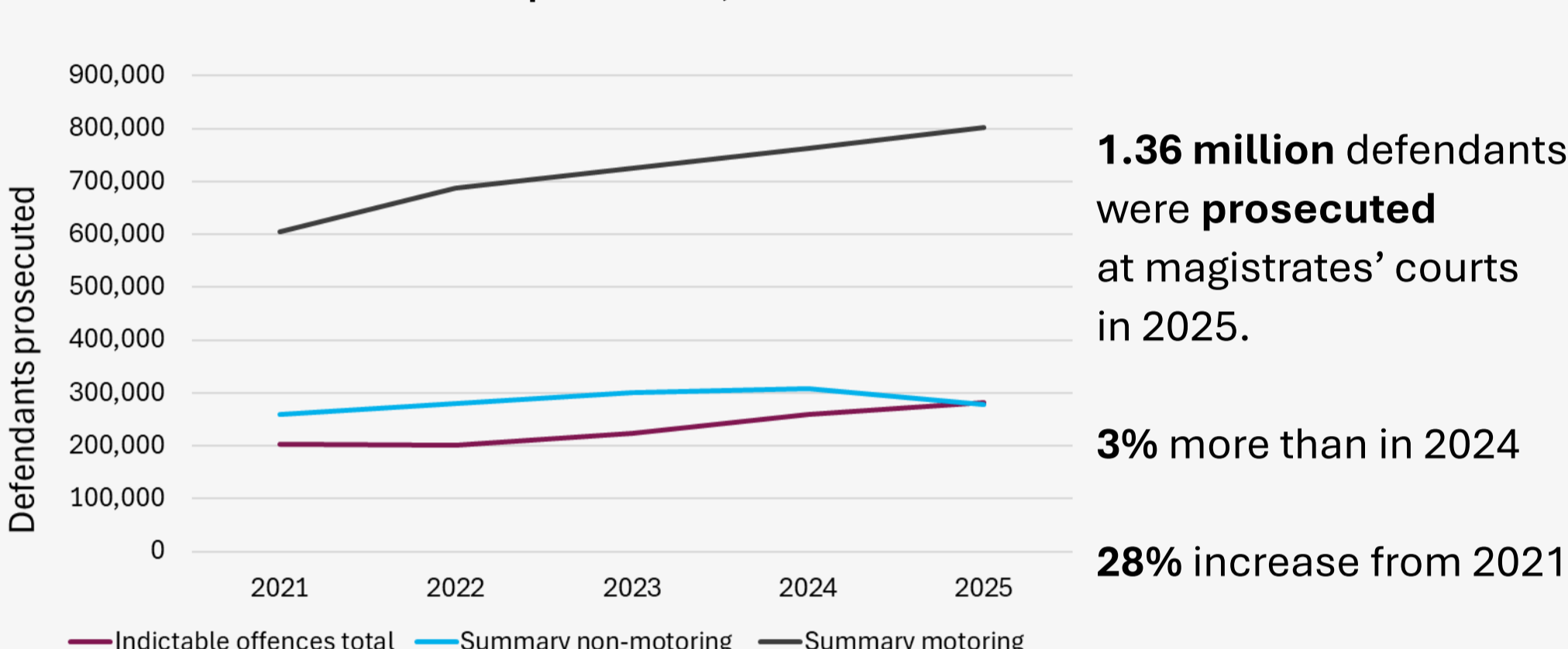
## Out of court resolutions

Out of court resolutions increased by 7% in the latest year, driven by community resolutions being 11% higher than in 2024.



## Prosecutions and convictions

Number of defendants prosecuted, 2021 to 2025



1.36 million defendants were prosecuted at magistrates' courts in 2025.

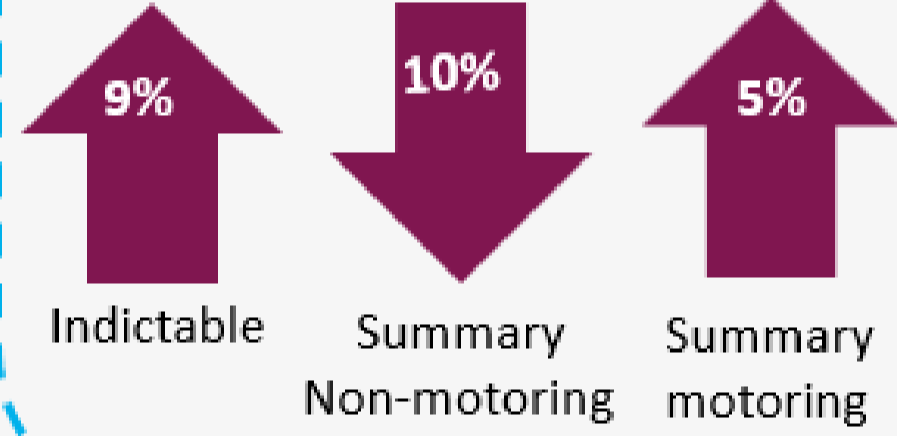

Prosecutions increased 3% in the latest year.



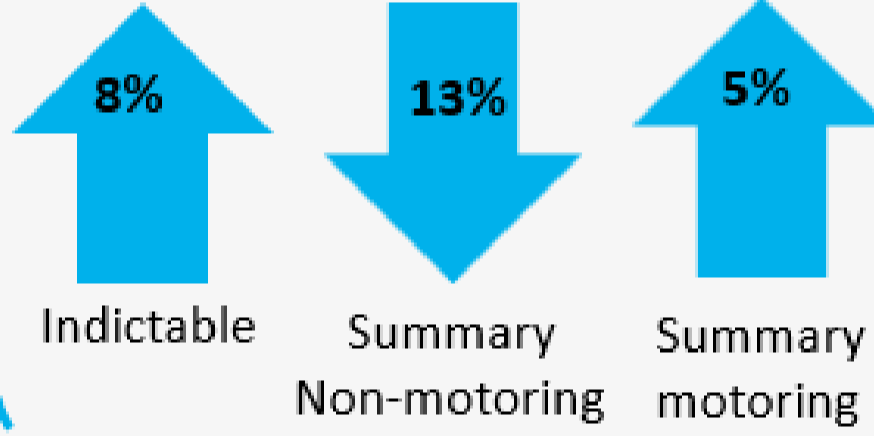
Prosecutions by offence type:



Convictions increased 1% in the latest year.

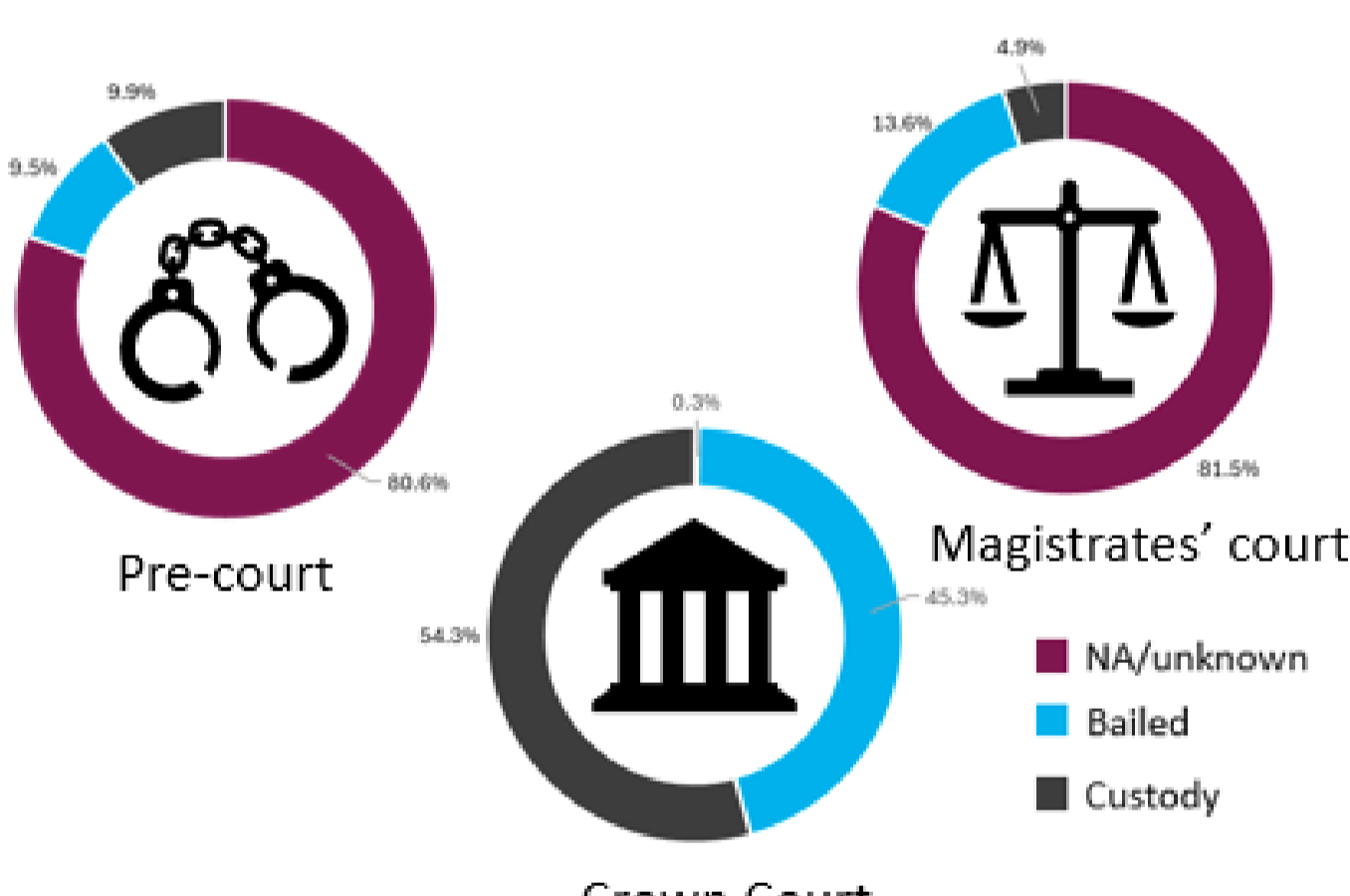


Convictions by offence type:



## Remands

The proportion of defendants remanded in custody at Crown Court increased from 53% in 2023 to 54% in 2025.



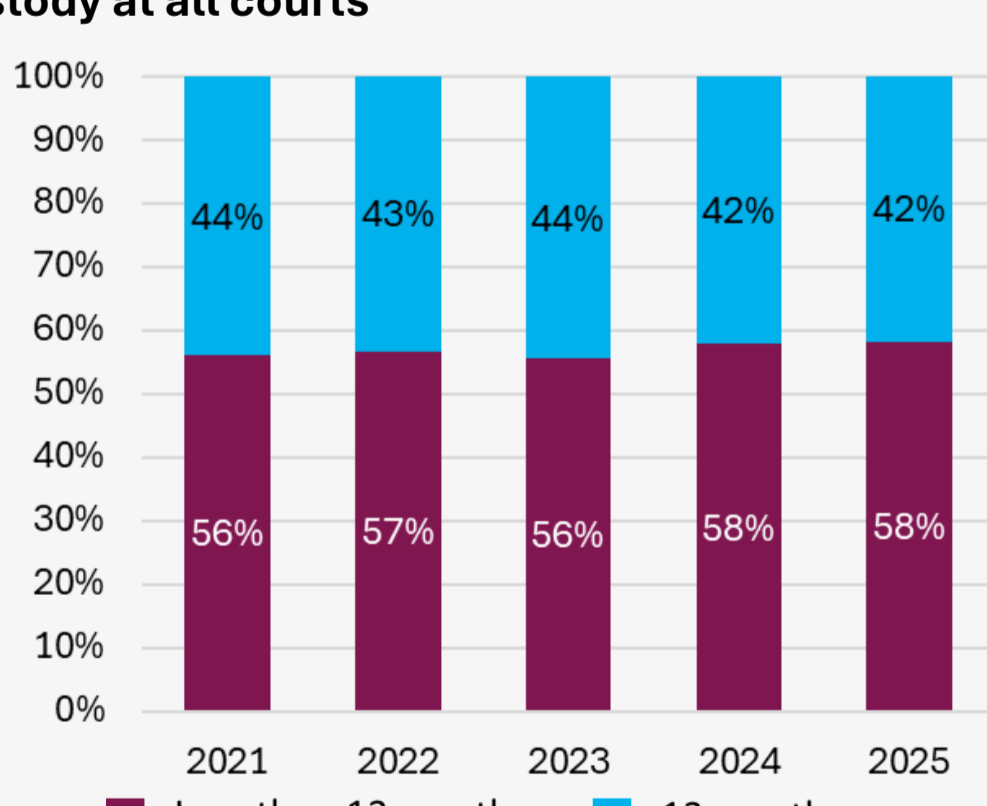
Of those remanded in custody at Crown Court, 71% were sentenced to immediate custody.

At all criminal courts, 24% of defendants that were sentenced after being remanded in custody received a non-custodial sentence.

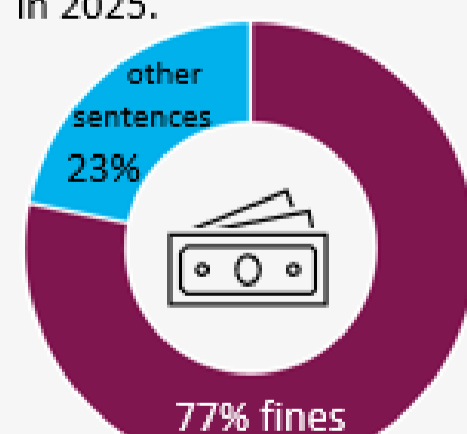
## Sentencing

The number of offenders sentenced at all courts rose by 1% in the latest year.

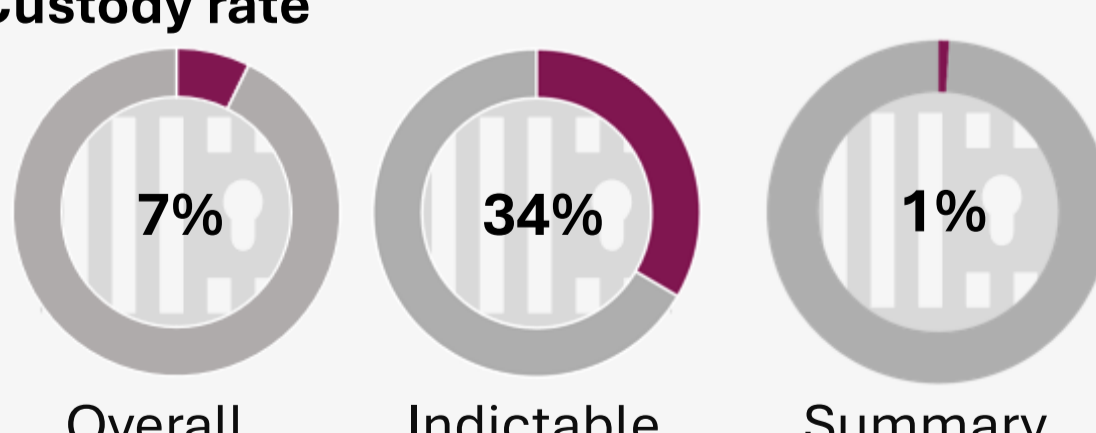
Percentage of offenders sentenced to immediate custody at all courts



Fines remained the most common sentence overall in 2025.



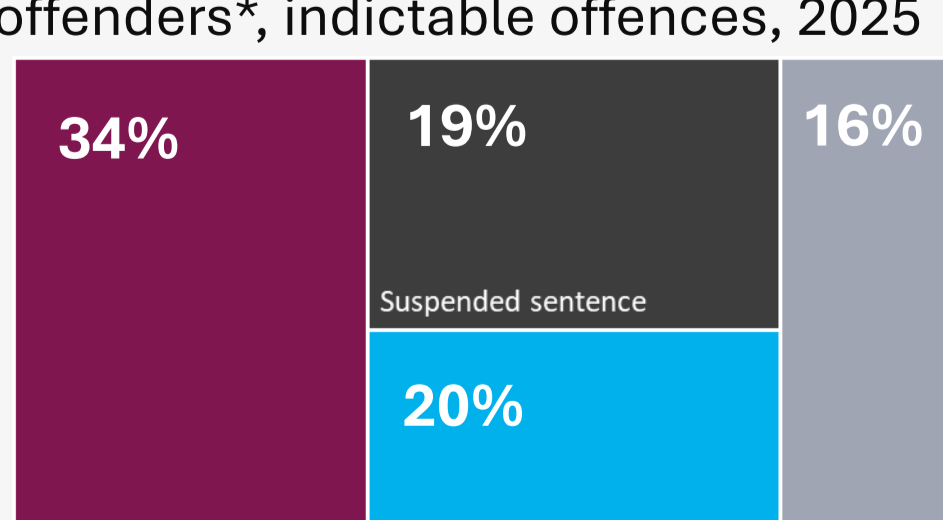
Custody rate



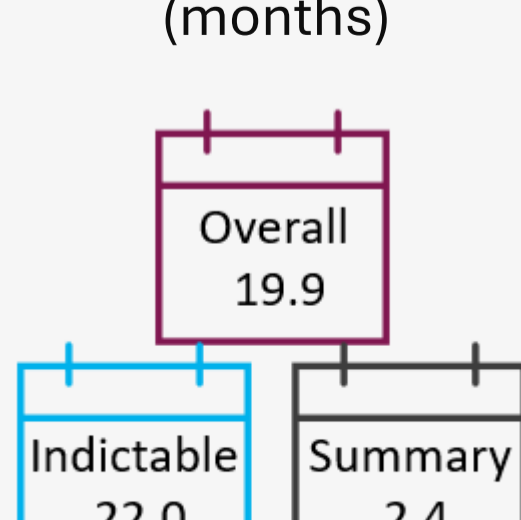
Custody rate increased slightly from 33% to 34% in 2025.

Average custodial sentence length (months)

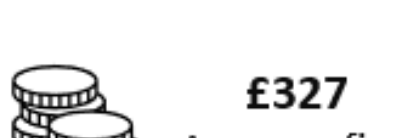

## Motoring

Prosecutions are at a series high, with both prosecutions and convictions for motoring offences increasing by 5% in the last year, with sentencing following the same trend.

95% of motoring offences were dealt with by a fine in 2025
