HUMBLE ADDRESS: APPOINTMENT OF LORD MANDELSON AS HM AMBASSADOR TO WASHINGTON

That an Humble Address be presented to His Majesty, that he will be graciously pleased to give directions to require the Government to lay before this House all papers relating to Lord Mandelson's appointment as His Majesty's Ambassador to the United States of America, including but not confined to the Cabinet Office due diligence which was passed to Number 10, the Conflict of Interest Form Lord Mandelson provided to the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), material the FCDO and the Cabinet Office provided to UK Security Vetting about Lord Mandelson's interests in relation to Global Counsel, including his work in relation to Russia and China, and his links to Jeffrey Epstein, papers for, and minutes of, meetings relating to the decision to appoint Lord Mandelson, electronic communications between the Prime Minister's Chief of Staff and Lord Mandelson, and between ministers and Lord Mandelson, in the six months prior to his appointment, minutes of meetings between Lord Mandelson and ministers in the six months prior to his appointment, all information on Lord Mandelson provided to the Prime Minister prior to his assurance to this House on 10 September 2025 that 'full due process was followed during this appointment', electronic communications and minutes of all meetings between Lord Mandelson and ministers, Government officials and special advisers during his time as Ambassador, and the details of any payments made to Lord Mandelson on his departure as Ambassador and from the Civil Service except papers prejudicial to UK national security or international relations which shall instead be referred to the Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament.

GOVERNMENT METHODOLOGY IN COMPLYING WITH THE HUMBLE ADDRESS

Summary

1. In order to provide transparency to Parliament and the public, below is set out the process by which the Government gathered, processed and published material in relation to the Humble Address of 4 February 2026. This includes the publication of Volume I on 11 March and this publication of Volume II.
2. The scope of the motion is very broad and has required the discovery, assessment, analysis and preparation of thousands of individual documents and messages. This is a task that has involved every Government department and goes far beyond the scope of any Freedom of Information Act request or Parliamentary Question. From the beginning it was recognised that the Government's response would be more similar in scale to a public inquiry. In addition, it has been necessary for the Government to navigate the added complexity of an ongoing police investigation, which it has been consistently clear it will not prejudice in its response to the Humble Address.
3. The Government's guiding principle in responding to the Humble Address has been to comply as fully and transparently as possible with the motion and Parliament's will, as swiftly as possible. Other than the redaction of individual email addresses and contact details, the majority of redactions are those which the Government has agreed with the Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament (ISC). The only other redactions made outside the ISC process have been where there is a clear rationale, informed by the FOI Act or other legal frameworks, and in line with the clear precedent set by previous administrations. The application of such redactions has been deliberately limited, targeted, and the subject of detailed consideration on a line-by-line basis. The reasons for redaction have been clearly marked.
4. The Government has invited and received comprehensive assurance at every stage of this process, from making the initial decisions on scope, to the minutiae of specific redactions. This includes advice from leading Counsel on the principles followed and the detailed underpinning methodology, and the Chair of the Public Administration and Constitutional Affairs Committee reviewing the information which has been withheld in order not to prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation.
5. The result is the largest ever Government response to a Humble Address. It represents thousands of hours of work from officials across the Government to deliver an unprecedented piece of Government transparency.

Commissioning

6. A disclosure exercise of this size required multiple commissions to every government department, in order that the Government could be assured that it was discharging Parliament's will. These are explained below.

7. To prepare the first volume of published material, an initial set of documents relevant to the appointment and withdrawal of Peter Mandelson was provided to the Cabinet Office Humble Address team by the Prime Minister's Office, following which the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) was commissioned to provide further specific documents relating to Peter Mandelson's appointment and withdrawal. These documents were subject to the same series of checks as outlined below.
8. In addition, all Government departments (including the Prime Minister's Office) received an instruction to retain all potentially relevant information shortly after the Humble Address motion was passed, to ensure that nothing in scope of the motion would be lost before departments were formally commissioned.
9. On 23 February, the the Senior Responsible Officer (SRO - the Permanent Secretary to the Cabinet Office) commissioned all departments to search for and return all electronic communications and minutes of meetings in scope of the Humble Address, in order to return information mainly within scope of the limbs of the motion concerned with messages and meetings during Peter Mandelson's tenure as Ambassador and the six preceding months. This focused on obtaining electronic communications directly between Peter Mandelson and Ministers, Pay Band 3/4 Special Advisers, Permanent Secretaries and Directors General, and minutes of meetings between those same individuals, where they were the principal attendees, rather than where they were one member among wider cast lists (for example not including formal committee meetings such as COBR or the NSC). This did not include wider groups or distribution lists, therefore excluding FCDO Diplomatic Telegrams, regional updates, thematic notes and briefing materials, press lines, corporate updates and newsletters.
10. In addition to this request, a further specific commission was made to the FCDO on 24 February, in order to target information in scope of the limbs of the motion most relevant to the FCDO. This included information relating to Peter Mandelson's withdrawal and severance.
11. Departments were asked to provide assurance on their returns on 6 March, in order that the central Humble Address team could be sure that all relevant information had been collected and to understand where further commissions may be required.
12. Departments were asked to undertake a search for any further non-corporate communications on 13 March, given the significant interest in this limb of the motion. This commission specified that all relevant non-corporate communications, except where they were purely personal in nature (for example relating to family matters or medical information), were required to be shared with the Cabinet Office. This included group messages.
13. A commission was sent to departments on 27 March which provided a further opportunity to share any additional material that departments believed should be considered in scope of the Humble Address motion. The commission also requested confirmation from departments that their initial return had captured all minutes of

meetings in scope. Such confirmation would be taken to mean that departments had cross-referred to specific individuals' calendars as well as their inboxes.

14. There were two specific commissions to relevant departments to check that all material relating to Peter Mandelson's National Security Vetting had been returned, on 21 April and 8 May.
15. Departmental Permanent Secretaries were responsible for assuring the Cabinet Office that they had taken reasonable steps to comply with the commissions and provide all relevant information. Departments were responsible for contacting all relevant current and former Ministers, Special Advisers and officials in their departments in scope of the request. Throughout the process there was an ongoing dialogue between the central team and departments, with specific sessions held with relevant private office officials to answer any questions.
16. Where individuals in scope had subsequently left the Government, the department which last employed them was responsible for contacting them and assuring their return. Where Ministers had occupied other Ministerial posts in the period between the six months prior to Peter Mandelson's appointment as HMA Washington and the date of the Humble Address motion, the Minister's current department was responsible for contacting the departments where that Minister had previously served.
17. The Cabinet Office Humble Address team used a secure portal to process returns from departments. These returns were instructed to be unredacted and undoctored.

Scope of searches

18. In order that the Government could respond swiftly and transparently to discharge the spirit and letter of the Humble Address, search parameters were included based on the limbs of the Humble Address motion. These were as follows:
 - a. Individuals in scope of the limbs of the motion seeking direct correspondence with Peter Mandelson (via email and other electronic messages) were specified as all Ministers, Pay Band 3/4 Special Advisers, Permanent Secretaries and Directors General. This was on the basis that these were the individuals most likely to have come into contact with Peter Mandelson.
 - b. These individuals were instructed to search their work devices and personal devices for any relevant information.
 - c. Minutes of meetings between those same individuals and Peter Mandelson where they were the principal attendees were requested, not where they were one member among wider cast lists (for example not including formal committee meetings such as the National Security Council).
 - d. Electronic messages involving Peter Mandelson that were exchanged as part of a group were requested, as well as those directly between an in-scope individual and Peter Mandelson.
19. While commissions to departments did not specifically request invitations to meetings or schedulers from individuals' calendars, where these have been provided to the

Cabinet Office Humble Address team and where relevant, they have been included in the publication.

20. Some material has been included in the publication where it does not meet the above criteria but includes content relevant to areas where Parliament has expressed a significant interest, such as Peter Mandelson's campaign to become Chancellor of Oxford University. Material of a party political nature is included in the publication, contrary to usual practice and precedent for information 'held' by the Government, in order to demonstrate the maximum possible transparency.
21. Some information was deemed out of scope via the commissioning process so as to keep the returns focused on the most relevant information:
 - a. Obvious ephemera - for example press cuttings, out of office replies, FCDO internal corporate messaging.
 - b. Anything which was clearly related to the corporate management of British Embassy Washington (e.g. FCDO personnel decisions and discussions, individual performance reporting, embassy staffing and management plans, estate issues).
 - c. Routine Embassy business (such as consular work and copylists containing FCDO Diplomatic Telegrams, regional updates, thematic notes and briefing materials, press lines, corporate updates and newsletters).
 - d. Purely personal information that would not usually be considered 'held' by the Government (for example relating to family matters or medical information).
22. On 31 March the SRO wrote to Peter Mandelson - via his solicitors - to request any information held on his personal phone. Peter Mandelson declined to comply with this request. The Government has no further recourse to search the personal devices of Peter Mandelson.

Cabinet Office assessment

23. All documents submitted to the Cabinet Office underwent a series of checks including:
 - An assessment to determine whether the material submitted was in scope of the Humble Address motion.
 - A first stage assessment to determine whether material contained information which may prejudice UK national security or international relations. Where so, it was subject to a further process as outlined below.
 - A team of Civil Service reviewers conducted checks to examine whether the documents contained: junior officials' names; legally privileged information; third party information; commercially sensitive information; or, personal data (e.g. phone numbers or email addresses). Such material was flagged for potential redaction ahead of final publication.
 - A review team of senior officials, overseen by the SRO, has made the final

decisions on scope, commissioning, and fine judgements on specific principles and documents.

24. As the Government has consistently set out, documents have been withheld from publication if they could potentially prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation. As set out below, these are intended to be published at a later date.

National security and international relations

25. The motion required that any papers prejudicial to national security or international relations would be referred to the ISC. Consequently, a subset of the material above was subject to an additional process to comply with that aspect.
26. Although the ISC was operating under the authority of the Humble Address in fulfilling this task (as opposed to its normal statutory remit), the process largely followed the usual process for requesting and agreeing national security redactions (although in this case, the ISC was also agreeing to international relations redactions as well as those relating to national security). Departments were asked to indicate where their searches identified material that would be prejudicial to either national security or international relations (or both). Departments then prepared pro formas that specified the text which required redaction, and the rationale for requesting that redaction. The pro formas, alongside the unredacted documents, were submitted to the ISC to seek their approval. In undertaking this process departments were supported by the National Security Secretariat for national security material, and the FCDO for international relations material. Over 300 documents were submitted to the ISC to seek their approval for the Government's proposed redactions.
27. Following the initial process, the Government and the ISC were in agreement on a number of the redaction decisions. The remaining documents were subject to a contested redactions process with a hearing held between senior officials and the ISC. This hearing led to the successful resolution of redactions relating to all of the remaining documents.
28. The ISC's statement of 15 May makes clear that it has considered all redactions proposed in the documents referred to the Committee, in order not to prejudice UK national security or international relations. The decisions determined by the Committee were final following the contested redaction hearing on 14 May. The Government is extremely grateful to the Committee for their work.

Preparation for publication

29. Following these processes, the Cabinet Office Humble Address team prepared the documents for publication. The documents include a mixture of emails, submissions, hard-copy files, and electronic messages such as WhatsApps, some of which required formatting choices to be applied for intelligibility.
30. WhatsApp and other instant messages were transcribed in a standard format to ensure intelligibility. Where material such as WhatsApp messages was submitted to the Humble Address team with incomplete details (for instance regarding dates), the

Cabinet Office Humble Address team followed up with departments to request the remaining material. Material has been published with the maximum amount of available information, and some messages which are not strictly in scope of the motion have been included in order to provide context, where such context was necessary, or where they respond to particular areas of interest from Parliament.

31. Documents have been de-classified to enable publication. Where documents show a classification marking, this no longer applies.
32. The publication is structured according to each limb of the motion. Within this, documents are ordered chronologically.

Redactions

33. It is a longstanding practice across successive administrations that, when the Government responds to a Humble Address motion, it has a responsibility to consider whether it is in the public interest to place certain information into the public domain. In line with practice across successive administrations, this is done using the principles of the Freedom of Information Act, and in line with the Ministerial Code and the resolutions on ministerial accountability, passed by both Houses in 1997 which state that "*ministers should be as open as possible with Parliament, refusing to provide information only when disclosure would not be in the public interest, which should be decided in accordance with relevant statute.*"
34. As set out above, the Government's overriding priority in responding to the Humble Address has been to respond fully, transparently and swiftly in order to meet the will of the House. Clearly, the scale of the Humble Address disclosure goes far beyond any usual Freedom of Information Act or other transparency request. However, the principles the Freedom of Information Act sets out have been used by previous administrations when responding to such motions - for example when responding to Humble Addresses relating to Radox and the Westferry Printworks. That means that, outside the process for managing papers prejudicial to UK national security or international relations, a number of targeted, specific redactions have been made in order to prevent real-world harms.
35. Specifically, these targeted redactions are in order to protect:
 - a. Individuals' email addresses and phone numbers;
 - b. The identities of junior civil servants;
 - c. Third party data - including the personal or commercially sensitive data of third parties not relevant to the motion; and
 - d. Legal professional privilege.
36. A small amount of Peter Mandelson's personal data has also been redacted: his signature and the location of his home.
37. In the interests of transparency, third party individuals who are considered to be public figures have been named. Third parties who have a reasonable expectation of privacy, because they are not public figures, have not been named. No references to current or former UK politicians have been redacted on the basis of their being third

parties. Publication of the names of political figures from countries other than the USA has been limited to world leaders.

38. There has been particular public interest in information involving Global Counsel and Palantir. No redactions have been made to references to Global Counsel, other than to protect the privacy of individuals who are not public figures - their connection to Global Counsel has been made clear in those emails. References to Palantir and Anduril have only been redacted in cases where the redaction has been agreed with the ISC, i.e. on the grounds of being information that is prejudicial to UK national security or international relations.
39. Some company names other than Global Counsel and Palantir have been redacted where this is not relevant to the motion. The Government does not consider it to be in the interests of the taxpayer to damage the Government's relationship with companies, to damage ongoing Government commercial negotiations, or to potentially damage those companies' commercial prospects, if they are not relevant to the motion.
40. Where material that has been submitted to the Cabinet Office Humble Address team is already in the public domain, no redactions have been applied to that material.
41. The redaction process has been overseen by the Cabinet Office and, where relevant, in conjunction with the ISC. No Government Minister or Special Adviser has determined any of the redactions.
42. The following labels have been used for redactions in Volume II:
 - a. Redactions made with the agreement of the ISC have been labelled with asterisks '(***)
 - b. All email addresses and phone numbers have been redacted with the label 'PERSONAL'
 - c. A small amount of personal data contained in the body of documents has also been redacted with the label 'PERSONAL'
 - d. All junior civil servants' names have been redacted with the label 'JCS'
 - e. Third party material not relevant to the motion and relating to individuals who are not public figures have been redacted with the label 'THIRD PARTY'
 - f. Information relating to companies, where disclosure of the information would be commercially damaging, has been redacted with the label 'THIRD PARTY'
 - g. Material attracting legal professional privilege has been redacted with the label 'LPP'

Independent assurance

- 44. The Government has taken several measures to ensure independent, external assurance of the process it has followed.
- 45. The Senior Responsible Owner has taken advice from leading Counsel, senior Government lawyers, and other Government experts throughout this process.
- 46. As confirmed by Ministers to Parliament, the Chair of the Public Administration and Constitutional Affairs Committee, Simon Hoare MP, has reviewed information that has been withheld from publication on the basis of not wishing to prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation, in order to provide as much transparency to Parliament as possible, albeit in a closed setting.
- 47. Finally, the Cabinet Office Humble Address team has taken advice from an independent Kings Counsel - including reviewing the methodological approach followed by officials - and acted on that to inform their approach. This has helped ensure that the Government is confident that its approach is compliant with the Humble Address and the Government's legal obligations.

Police process and third publication

- 48. The Government has now discharged its duties under the Humble Address when it comes to identifying relevant material within scope of the motion and preparing it for publication. With the exception of the material being withheld in order not to prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation, all these documents have now been published in either Volume I or II. There will be a final publication by the Government at the conclusion of the Metropolitan Police Service investigation, or before, if the Metropolitan Police Service confirms that doing so will not prejudice their investigation.

Dear Iain,

We have spoken twice today. For wider awareness:

- Cabinet Office Government Security Group Director, Tom Bramley, called me this morning about the security clearance requirements for Lord Mandelson, HMA-designate Washington.
- Although Gerard McGurk had been in touch with GSG late last week, and GSG had stated that the 'fit and proper person' clearance exemption for Lords and MPs should apply, CO had reflected over the weekend, and judged that the exemptions policy had not envisaged the unusual situation of MPs/Lords being appointed to Ambassadorial positions.
- ESND have checked the precedent, and can confirm that clearance was previously required of an MP appointed to an HMA position.
- Additionally, we all recognise that the US are strict about clearance matters, and will likely check Lord Mandelson's clearance with ESND ahead of any sensitive discussions he will be invited to upon arrival in Washington. Failure to report the correct clearance could have an awkward impact, which we would want to avoid.

- The upshot is that ESND and Government Security Group agree that **Lord Mandelson should undergo the normal DV clearance procedure.**
- I have discussed with the PUS, who is content that we proceed accordingly.
- ESND (JCS , in copy) has set up a profile for Lord Mandelson on the vetting system, and has emailed him today with details on how to complete the procedure.
- You will kindly flag it to him when you speak at 3pm today.
- Cabinet Office are ready to expedite the clearance. The quicker Lord Mandelson proceeds with the paperwork, the quicker we can get the clearance processed.

To note, while Lord Mandelson is in pre-deployment preparations in KCS during January, ESND are content to afford him the 'fit and proper' exemption to access the building unaccompanied, and to access Osprey IT and material up to Secret. I am sure the PUS will want to judge access to any material above Secret ahead of a formal DV clearance coming through.

For the purposes of the role in Washington, Lord Mandelson will have to apply for STRAP clearance in the usual way (once DV is secured). Again, ESND can seek an expedited decision.

Grateful if you can commission CO/UKSV to input into an Annex that will be shared with the FAC in response to their attached letter re. Mandelson. Grateful if we can have input by 2pm today please as we are aiming for FS to issue the letter today. Given FCDO do not own the security clearance process, the Foreign Secretary will not want to take responsibility for responding to the FAC on these matters. We therefore propose the FS write a short cover letter and an annex (owned by the Cabinet Office) with responses to their questions.

Mark, Catherine,

An outstanding issue is whether ESND should lapse, suspend or withdraw Mandelson's DV clearance? While practically it will make little difference, because Post have already removed his access to the embassy, taken his laptop, suspended his FCDO email account and stopped sharing any official information, there is a presentational aspect.

I can imagine, for example, a PQ that asks – presume you have taken his clearance away from him now? (And suggestions of incompetence if we haven't.)

But I presume there are also employment law issues still at stake? Hence, I don't want ESND to act precipitously. Grateful for views. Including ultimately from Olly, once we have considered advice for him.

Distinction (as I understand it) between different ESND options:

- Lapse – someone no longer works for FCDO; we put the clearance into abeyance (including on the official vetting system) and wouldn't confirm it is extant anymore
- Suspend – we have concerns about the clearance being active, and inform the individual we are taking the clearance from them (with commensurate implications) while concerns are reviewed
- Withdraw – we completely remove the clearance, again ordinarily informing the individual

In discussion with Foreign Office, Cabinet Office and No10 officials, I have looked into whether the correct process was followed for both the appointment of HMA Washington, Peter Mandelson, and the process around your decision to withdraw him from post. As you know this was a political diplomatic appointment, and therefore - as set out in the note from my predecessor, which you received before making this appointment - requires the necessary security clearances and doing due diligence on any potential Conflicts of Interest or other issues of which you should be aware.

In both the appointment and the withdrawal, I have seen no evidence that proper processes were not carried out adequately. In my discussions with officials I have reviewed or discussed:

- the Propriety and Ethics open source due diligence that you saw as part of the appointment process;
- the post appointment vetting which was completed post announcement but before he took up post; and
- your decision to withdraw HMA Washington once the content of the emails was known and HMA Washington was given the right to reply to his line manager, Oliver Robbins (FCDO Permanent Under Secretary)

As you know this was a political diplomatic appointment, and therefore - as set out in the note from my predecessor, which you received before making this appointment - requires the necessary security clearances and doing due diligence on any potential Conflicts of Interest or other issues of which you should be aware.

You received advice from my predecessor on 11 November 2024 before deciding on this type of appointment. That advice explained your right to make such an appointment and the process for doing so but did not give specific advice on candidates. The process that took place followed the advice my predecessor gave in particular “for them to acquire the necessary security clearances and do due diligence on any potential conflicts of interest or other issues of which you should be aware before confirming your choice.” All processes set out by my predecessor took place. Two actions, the security vetting and the process on conflicts of interest took place after the decision to appoint. I do not however consider that to be material as the vetting process was complete before the previous HMA Washington took up post on 10 February 2025, and it is more usual for security vetting to happen after appointment.

Following the advice from my predecessor, the Propriety and Ethics Team (PET) conducted an open-source due diligence report on Lord Mandelson. This identified his relationship with Jeffrey Epstein as a reputational risk. Your special advisers then obtained further assurances from Lord Mandelson on this specific issue. No evidence has come to light suggesting concerns were raised with you or my predecessor on national security grounds as part of the pre-appointment timeline. On 18 December 2024 your office wrote to the previous Permanent Under-Secretary at the FCDO

- We will need to inform him of our decision or advice ASAP this week so he can inform the organisers in good time.

It is not unusual to make political appointments in the diplomatic service and this is permitted under the Constitutional Reform and Governance Act 2010.

When does Karen leave?

Colleagues may have a view on terminology but I think we are ‘appointing’, subject to the conclusion of bilateral processes.

Head of Mission roles are usually advertised across Government. The FCDO's recruitment processes are underpinned by the principle of selection for appointment on merit, on the basis of fair and open competition. Recommendations for appointment for these roles are ratified by the Foreign Secretary and, for the most senior posts, the Prime Minister. Appointments are then approved by HMTK. The Constitutional Reform and Governance (CRAG) Act 2010 is the statutory basis for ensuring that Civil Service recruitment is fair, open and based on merit. Section 10 (3) of the Constitutional Reform and Governance Act allows for Head of Mission appointments to take place outside of the CSC's rules and allows for political appointments to be made to Head of Mission roles (or Governorships). Such appointments are few in number but have been used by successive administrations since 1945.

Dear All,

Lord Mandelson is due to take up his posting as the next Ambassador to the United States in January 2025 in succession to Dame Karen Pierce.

HRD Senior Appointments have informed me that Third Party and Lord Mandelson's is in progress. As we may not hear anything further until the New Year, there is a chance this will hold up the issue of Lord Mandelson's contract.

Our normal announcing process is to prepare and clear a standard draft announcement with the incumbent HoM, HoM-designate and geographical department, ask when they would like the announcement to be made, and if there is a need for wider clearance (through Special Advisers). We then clear the whole announcement and the timing with the PUS's Office, and then send it to Newsdesk to announce on the agreed date. We ask the HoM-designate to send us a suitable photo as the announcement cannot be made without a photo.

If the draft announcement has to be cleared with No 10, this could delay things so I thought it best to warn you. Karen Pierce's announcement wasn't in the standard format and was done by Americas/Comms with heavy involvement from No 10 <https://www.gov.uk/government/news/karen-pierce-appointed-as-her-majestys-ambassador-to-the-united-states-of-america> so we expect Lord Mandelson's will be similar especially given that his cv is non-standard.

Please let me know if you need anything further from me at this stage. As normal, the announcement shouldn't be made until agrément has been granted (though this is a moot point given the PM has already announced it).

Date: 11 September 2024

Attendees: Minister Vallance (PV), Lord Mandelson (PM)

PM opening remarks

- PM noted potential plans for an industrial strategy council and highlighted past experience with xWH initiatives of this sort after the 2008 crisis. PM added that he views the work on the S&T Framework as aligned with this approach to governance.
- PM added that he hopes R&D spending won't come under pressure and isn't clear on whether or not this government will protect it in the same way as may have been done in the past.
 - PV noted examples in the private sector that show maintaining R&D spend is important even in challenging times.
- PM briefly mentioned that the new CEO of UKRI, when appointed, should be working within direction/a policy framework from government.

PV opening remarks

- PV highlighted the importance of a joined up approach regarding procurement in relation to R&D spending, as this is important for company growth.

DSIT work broadly.

- PM noted the work of DSIT on being the digital centre of government and on AI.
- PV mentioned that DSIT is to play a very important role in these areas among others.

S&T Framework

- PV noted that the S&T Framework is still important and PV hopes there will be xWH collaboration across the different areas that S&T crosses over. PV added the importance of Prime Ministerial authority and a driver in the centre to ensure this, and briefly referred to the Cabinet Committee on S&T.

Regulation

- PM asked what the RIO is?
- PV highlighted that work on regulation is about getting regulators in specific areas to be pro-innovation in their approach as opposed to being solely focused on security.
- PV added that we can learn lessons from how the MHRA changed the way they did things in the years after 2019 to meet with companies early, understand pipelines etc.

I am planning to reschedule the roundtable you agreed to participate in just before the election was called - this time focussing on how the Clean Energy Mission can be an important lever for building out our industrial strategy . And I wondered if you would be willing and available to lead off a discussion on the topic? SSE will also give some initial remarks.

A number of industry people have highlighted to me that the new government's more ambitious decarbonisation agenda presents a major economic opportunity to onshore cable manufacturing, leverage the UK's geographical strengths in carbon capture and repurpose the UK's ports for offshore wind turbine making . The challenge will be identifying where the UK can compete with its international counterparts on green manufacturing and ensuring that policy and regulation choices develop these opportunities. In the absence of this, the UK risks not fully capture the benefits of decarbonisation.

Dear Patrick,

It was nice to see you last night. I am so pleased you are at DSIT. It is going to be a lean, mean department where you can make a real difference.

The new government is now trying to do on stilts what we attempted to do 1997-10. In the two bookends of my ministerial career, in 1998 and 2008, we tried to make a fundamental difference to the growth and productivity drivers of the UK economy, primarily by changing and strengthening the supply side of the economy – education and skills, transport and infrastructure, university expansion and getting the right business and investment environment – but latterly, too, by giving the government some skin in the game in bringing about investment in commercialising the UK's science and technology base.

The 1998 white paper *Building a knowledge-driven economy* set about replicating in Britain the west coast ecosystem of research/development/translation/commercialisation. It was based on principles of competition, collaboration and clusters of new technology-based industry around the country.

In 2008, we created the National Economic Council which met monthly in Cobr under Gordon's chairmanship to galvanise everything the public and private sectors could throw at saving and regenerating the UK economy following the banking crisis. This was what I was brought back from Brussels to do in government and the white paper *New industry, new jobs (Ninja)* set out how to do it.

I feel that Keir's government is trying to achieve a similar thing all over again but I am not aware of any granular attempt to work out how better to do so based on previous experience. You come closest to it but Michael Barber focused on public services not the economy (and will be relevant to other government missions) and I am not sure what Nick Boles brings.

The truth is that we did not pull off what we attempted to do. We made a difference, undoubtedly, but did we bring about structural change and fundamentally transform the underlying performance of the economy? No. The machinery and performance of the government was not up to that job. Although I could point to a number of things the Treasury allowed us to take forward in my department which I agreed with Alistair Darling we were not really all singing from the same hymn sheet or joined up in our thinking and actions and, most importantly, we did not have scale.

The only attempts since seem to be a mix of Greg Clark's short-lived challenges and the 'missions' approach you set out to the Prime Minister (Johnson ? Sunak ?) and then of course your vaccine task force. This was a very specific thing which Whitehall tends to do well when mobilised. I would love to think you are having success in making a second run but my fear is that Rachel's growth plan, Jonny's industrial strategy, Angela's planning and devolution reforms and DSIT's science drive are not really joined up. There are such big bets and trade offs to be made if wishful thinking is to be turned into meaningful, sustainable change. The work I have been doing for UUK on research and innovation has revealed to me that while we could always spend and invest more on science, we are not getting full economic value from what we are spending already and that UKRI, for all its strengths, hasn't the heft and punch to make the really big calls, notwithstanding Andrew Mackenzie's effective leadership.

In policy and narrative, as I said to you, the government is over reliant on building houses and energy infrastructure as the golden route forward. These can help but there are limits to their impact on the economy's underlying productivity, ability to generate new businesses, establish UK supply chains and increase exports.

We have started well in the UK in AI but I am less convinced we will finish sufficiently ahead. Ditto bioscience and quantum. The main reason is not government policy, relevant as that is, but the lack of really big UK private sector companies driving the necessary advance and competitiveness. Will the proposed Industrial Strategy Council make the transformative difference in deploying the business acumen, finance capital and human talent in the teams and networks of our universities and private sector ? The thinking so far would not suggest it.

Labour has, let's say, two terms to succeed. So far Keir's team has not prioritised policy (not surprising given how much else had to be re-built after Corbyn). And the No 10 policy team is not large or experienced. Pat at the Cabinet Office will have the right instincts but I am an aficionado of the Cabinet Office (I started there as Minister without Portfolio and ended there as First Secretary of State) and it is a light touch co-ordinator not a power house.

I know you will be thinking every day how to make a difference. I wish you all possible luck !

Meetings with former HMA Washington

- **13 January:** Michael/ MCO/ Peter- This was a 30-minute introductory meeting between the Minister for the Cabinet Office, the new HMA and Michael. As the responsible minister for the European Union Relations Secretariat, the purpose of this meeting was for MCO to set out HMG ambition for resetting the European relationship and how the former Ambassador might be able to support this from Washington.
- **17 January:** Michael/Peter—This was an informal official-level lunch within 70 Whitehall. It was an hour long meeting for Michael and HMA to discuss the incoming US administration and their own priorities for building relations in Brussels and Washington respectively. As this was an informal lunch before HMA flew to Washington there was no readout.
- **20 February- 28 February:** US Tariffs Check in- At the onset of tariff announcements from the new US administration our office organised daily tariff check in calls, the cast list of these calls varied but included DBT Secretary of State (SoS), National Security Advisor (NSA), the Prime Minister's Chief of Staff, the Prime Minister's Foreign Affairs Permanent Secretary (PS), the Prime Minister's Business Advisor, Deputy National Security Advisors (DNSAs), the Permanent Secretary for DBT, and other working-level officials. The initial calls were on Switch before moving to MS Teams- there weren't specific readouts but the calls were to give daily updates from Washington and Whitehall.
- **17 April:** Varun/ Kate Joseph/ Peter - Following "Liberation Day" there was a small call between DBT/ No10 and Cabinet Office to coordinate HMG response to the tariff announcement, update of the reaction in Washington and various capitals across Europe. There was no read out from this meeting.
- **13 May:** Michael/ Peter - On the evening of the 13th May Michael had a brief 15 minute phone call with HMA to reassure him of the package agreed with the EU for the upcoming summit (19 May) would have no consequences on the EPD that was concurrently being negotiated with the US. No readout of this meeting.
- **24 June:** Michael/ Peter - The former Ambassador was in London to attend a DBT away day; he was speaking to the away day virtually from a room in Cabinet Office. As a result Michael and the former Ambassador agreed to a quick 15 minute catch up ahead of HMA speaking at the DBT event. No readout.

CDL met with the HM Ambassador-Designate to the United States, Lord Mandelson, on Tuesday 14 January. Please find a readout below and cascade as appropriate.

Actions:

- CDL referenced an article by Robert Kagan on Russia/Ukraine and asked that this was shared with Lord Mandelson. I've linked it [here](#) and passed it on to Lord Mandelson's team.

CDL and Lord Mandelson discussed the implications for the change of administration for the UK's relationship with the US. Lord Mandelson noted that the Government should approach the relationship with an intensely relaxed approach, rather than being concerned with optics or gestures.

CDL updated on the PM Small Strategy Group on the US, including the Government's aims, and that the position of the UK outside major trading blocks was both vulnerable and agile. There were significant trade opportunities with China that would not cause national security concerns. However, the UK's relationship with China would be affected by the overarching dynamics of the US-China relationship. The Government had room to manoeuvre its audit to make a decision that was in the UK national interest, but the implementation was as important as the strategy itself.

Trade negotiations with the US were discussed, where the incoming administration would likely focus on agriculture, especially considering the support required from Congress and the farming lobby. CDL reaffirmed his support for the UK farming sector, and his desire not to expose them to unfair competition.

The Russia/Ukraine war was also discussed, touching on the implications of different outcomes of the conflict on the geopolitical position of key partners.

SoSNI had a conversation with Lord Mandelson ahead of his appointment as the UK Ambassador to the US. They discussed the St Patrick's Day events in Washington, and offered an update on NI politics and the progression around Legacy.

Readout:

1. SoSNI began by congratulating Lord Mandelson and asking when he expected to be appointed, Lord Mandelson said in 2 weeks.
2. Lord Mandelson asked about President Trump's views on NI. SoSNI said he had not spoken about NI publicly, ***
3. SoSNI updated Lord Mandelson on the political situation in NI, he explained this had been a very tricky time for both Gavin Robinson and Unionism in general. He explained that there was some optimism from the Unionist politicians around a Trump Presidency, and both Ian Paisley Jr and Baroness Hoey travelled to Washington for the inauguration.

4. Lord Mandelson asked about

5. SoSNI updated Lord Mandelson on progress around Legacy. He explained the commitment to repeal and replace, but stressed he did not want to stop the ICRIR only to replace it with a similar body and delay cases being investigated. SoSNI said he ordered an inquiry into the murder of Patrick Finucane ^{***}, but had been ordered by a Judge to conduct a public inquiry into Brown which the UKG was challenging.
6. SoSNI and Lord Mandelson discussed St Patrick's Day events in Washington DC. SoSNI said he was looking forward to the engagements but was awaiting finalised timings for the key events. Lord Mandelson asked if he expected all the events to go ahead given the new administration, SoSNI said he believed they would.

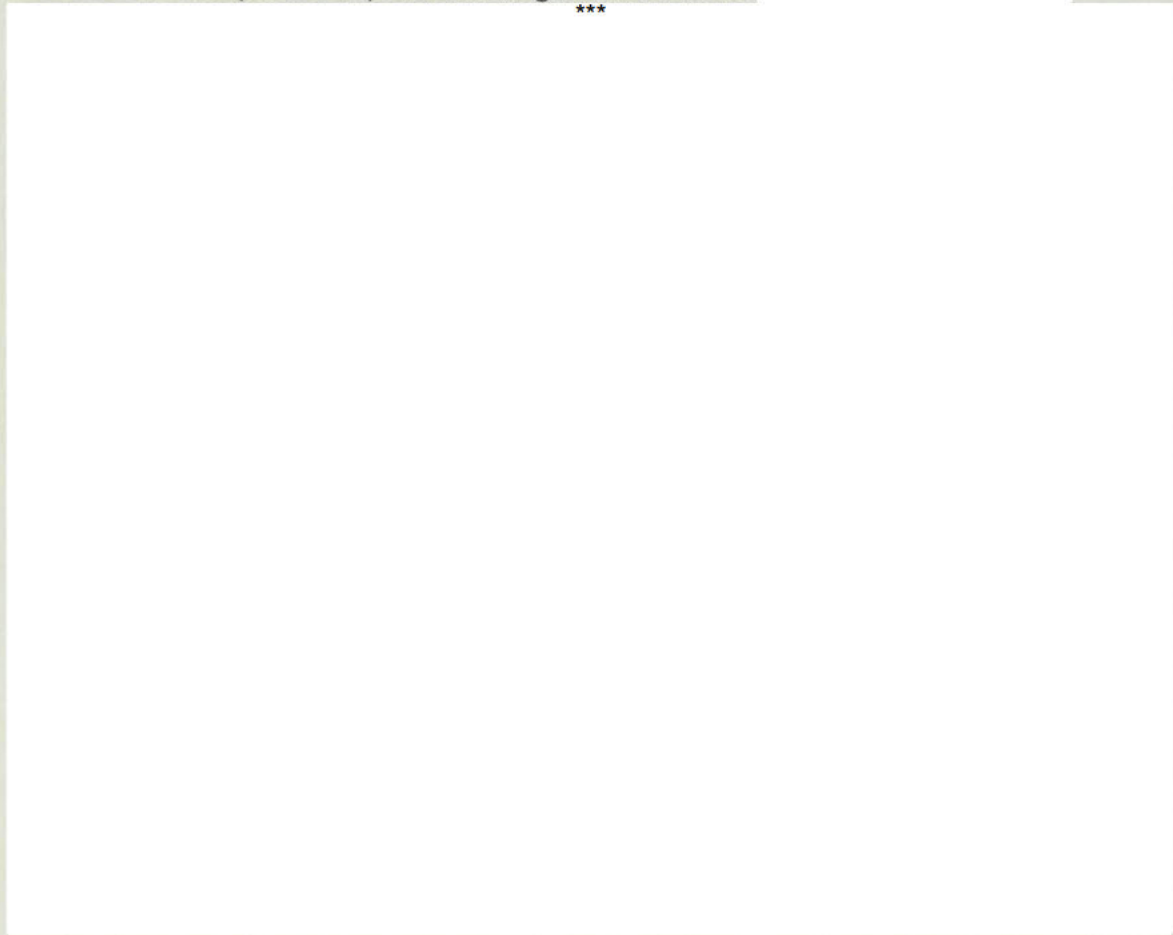

The View from Washington: Priorities for the Special Relationship

In my first week as the British Ambassador to the US, I wanted to write to you to set out my vision and ambition as I currently see it – for my role, for that of the Embassy, and for how I, the Embassy in Washington and the whole of the US network work with Whitehall.

In order to deliver key aspects of the Prime Minister's plan for change, and your six stated priorities, **my overarching goal is to refresh and revivify the basis of the UK's partnership with the US.** This partnership should recognise that we are *******





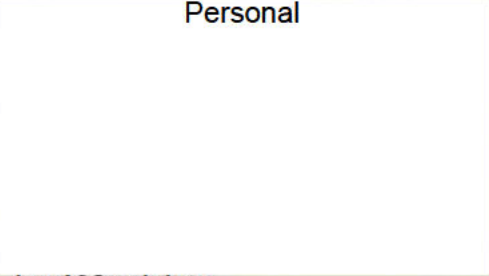
I would like the work of the Embassy and network to reflect these priorities, and for us to be in a space to assist in shaping HMG's current and future policy-making. To do this, the Embassy's top team will work in a collective way with the whole government, just as I expect HMG will want to do with us on US policy-making.

This approach will, however, also require trade-offs. In all the areas cited above, what Europe does and how it contributes has a direct bearing on the UK and on the Atlantic Alliance. This will be reflected in the Government's new approach to the EU

- The PM's visit comes at a moment of tension within the NATO alliance over Ukraine but also, in his view, a time of great economic opportunity between the UK and US.
- PM believes he can be a bridge between EU and US views re Ukraine because he strongly believes that the only viable outcome of any negotiation has to be a permanent peace not a temporary ceasefire but he also acknowledges that, to get Russia to the table, President Trump's relationship with Putin has to be utilised and that only the US has the heft in Putin's eyes to get talks started.
- The PM is confident of his personal relationship with President Trump. He has deliberately used his recent telephone calls with him to establish a strong personal bond rather than take on wider policy issues. But the meeting this week will draw on the strong personal relations they have established to reach convergence on key policy questions.
- Current issues are Chagos and tariffs. On the former, the US has made certain asks of detail in relation to the deal that sees the US retaining full operational use of Diego Garcia with China kept firmly at bay. PM is hopeful that US concerns will be accommodated in continuing talks with Mauritius. And on tariffs, PM will be citing Britain's existing balanced and fair trading relationship with the US in order to contain any immediate threat of tariffs. However, the PM recognises the President's strength of feeling on trade and he knows that there are some tough discussions yet to be had if Britain is to avoid being indirectly damaged by growing trade frictions between the EU and the US.
- Alongside their discussion about Ukraine and the related future of NATO spending, the PM wants to make a new economic growth deal the centrepiece of the meeting. He wants the outcome to be agreement on the creation of a full spectrum technology partnership rooted in shared scientific discovery, innovation, investment and exchange of talent. This already exists in the defence industrial sphere where there is considerable technology sharing and large potential for further development but more widely in artificial intelligence and also in quantum computing, human and life sciences, space, advanced nuclear and bioscience.
- The PM wants to lose no time in advancing and agreeing this economic and technology partnership and wants it to come together this year as a key part of the government's economic growth mission.
- The PM is absolutely convinced that, while a reset in EU relations is vital, the potential for the US-UK relationship to make both countries safer and stronger is enormous. He has great regard for the President's ambitions for the US and the way in which he has hit the ground running and wants Britain to be not only America's pre-eminent security ally but its pre-eminent critical technology partner as well. He sees the meeting as a take off point for both and will come to Washington with considerable enthusiasm and ambition for what can be achieved.

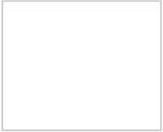

Thank you for your letter dated 20th February asking for views on what an ambitious UK-US defence industrial and technology partnership should focus on.

I agree that there is merit in developing a bold pitch to the US which supports our emerging Strategic Defence Review (SDR) and Defence Industrial Strategy (DIS) providing a tangible connection between the economic and security aspects of our partnership with the new US administration. The UK spends 43% of total spend on defence industry overseas with the US, with a US Foreign Military Sales (FMS) pipeline of \$18Bn, which excludes major programmes such as F35, Trident and MLRS (which the UK invests heavily in under different arrangements). And there are substantial opportunities for the UK if we can attract more US investment – the six largest US defence investors currently support over 100,000 jobs in the UK and have over 7,000 British companies in their supply chain.

Defence is an engine that drives economic growth, providing the national security that is a pre-condition to economic security, investor confidence and social stability. When the Prime Minister is in Washington later this week, he might look to set out our ambition to work with the US on defence industries of the future, with companies – such as Palantir and Anduril – already driving productivity and innovation through initiatives such as ‘warp speed’. This a sector that leverages cutting-edge technologies, such as AI and autonomous systems, catalysing economic development through positive spill-over effects. Our success in this rests on a new partnership with domestic and international innovators, investors and industry and is fundamental to both our long-term security and economic growth.

I have instructed officials to work at pace to examine how we can strengthen our partnership with the US on these issues with a focus on three key pillars.

First, on **R&D and Innovation**. The US is our partner of choice for advanced research and technology and which strongly benefits both of our nations. We have agreed with US partners at official level that –^{***}

We need now to supercharge our efforts to ensure that we can innovate and experiment – with allies – at the pace of the threat. The SDR and the DIS will set out how we are reforming the Ministry of Defence to ensure we can get after this better. As part of that work, I have directed officials to work to develop options for further collaboration with the US, particularly around joint testing and experimentation, and bring forward projects where there is the greatest shared national security and economic benefit.

Successful implementation will be a vital component in driving greater innovation, speed, and industrial collaboration, unlocking more license-free technology and information transfer.

In developing these proposals, we will need to carefully consider the balance between our partnership with the US and that with our European allies. We will also need to reassure stakeholders that this work is not at the expense of jobs in either the UK or the US but is essential to grow the sector for our shared benefit. The work should also be conscious of, and in alignment with, our NATO commitments,

The Duchess of Edinburgh will be New York next week to coincide with the 69th Session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW). Her role as patron for the NGO PATH provided the original hook for the visit. It was agreed with Buckingham Palace in late January that HRH was permitted to add additional serials to her programme to support HMG objectives. These additional programme elements are all closely aligned to the Duchess' long-standing advocacy for work preventing Conflict Related Sexual Violence, and women's rights more broadly (including in other geographies, such as Afghanistan). **The King's Principal Private Secretary has asked Royal Unit to provide the PUS, PPS/PM and PS/PM advice on the programme, seeking an urgent steer on whether the FCDO and Number 10 believe the visit should proceed (or be amended).**

The Ukrainian programme components are *** :

- The first is HRH speak at a meeting of the **International Alliance on PSVI**. The UK created the alliance in 2023, but Ukraine is the Chair in 2025. The DPM of Ukraine will host the meeting next week, though the Duchess' intervention is planned to focus on her visit to Chad, not Ukraine. FCDO officials believe this event is not contentious and hope the Duchess is permitted to attend and speak about Chad.

DBT SoS statement – to be issued from Wednesday 12th March, 4am GMT

Business and Trade Secretary Jonathan Reynolds said:

“It’s disappointing the US has today imposed global tariffs on steel and aluminium.

“We are taking a pragmatic approach and a trade war is in nobody’s interests

We are focused on rapidly negotiating a wider economic agreement with the US to eliminate additional tariffs and benefit UK business and our economy. Meanwhile we remain resolute in our support for UK industry. This Government is working with affected companies today, and I back industry’s application to the Trade Remedies Authority to investigate what further steps might be necessary to protect UK producers.

I will continue to engage closely and pragmatically with the US to press the case for UK business interests. We will keep all options on the table, and won’t hesitate to respond in the national interest.

Are you going to retaliate?

The tariffs on steel and aluminium proposed by the Trump Administration are global, not targeted at the UK.

We are looking at all options, but we won’t be imposing tariffs immediately.

Let’s be clear. Industry doesn’t want to see a trade war where both sides keep escalating the situation. Standing up for industry means finding a solution.

Our approach to the US is pragmatic and we continue to have productive discussions on tariffs and other issues.

We have raised this with the US at various levels to make the case for UK companies to be exempt from US global tariffs and will continue to do so through our productive conversations.

You aren’t retaliating now but *why* aren’t you retaliating now? Other countries are.

- We are taking a pragmatic approach in seeking a wider economic deal. A trade war is in nobody’s interests.

- We will keep all options on the table, but our focus is securing a deal that will benefit industry and the British people.

Isn't this a pretty weak response?

- I wouldn't accept that – **this is a cool-headed and pragmatic response.**
- **We rule nothing out** and we will always act in the best interests of the British people and economy.
- **But a knee-jerk response today won't help us achieve a long-term economic deal with the US tomorrow, and that is our focus.**

Why no exemption? PM failed at diplomacy?

We have raised this with the US at various levels to make the case for UK companies to be exempt from US global tariffs.

The Prime Minister has raised steel and aluminium tariffs with President Trump - in a call on Monday and when he was at the White House in February. The Business and Trade Secretary has also raised this with his counterpart Secretary Lutnick.

Our focus is on reaching a wider economic deal will benefit the industry and the British people.

Doesn't say much for PM's relationship with POTUS if they spoke and Trump ignored him?

- **It is because of the Prime Minister's successful visit to the White House that UK and US officials are in talks about a future economic deal that will benefit businesses on both sides of the Atlantic.**
- **These wider global tariffs have come into effect while we are in the middle of those negotiations.**
- **We remain focused on that future trading partnership. We already have a fair and balanced trade relationship and are the largest single investors in one another's economies, so there is plenty we can build on.**

Is the industry also now going to be hit by tariffs from Trump?

The tariffs on steel, aluminium and derivatives being proposed by the Trump administration are global, not targeted at the UK.

We will continue to take a pragmatic approach and remain prepared to defend the UK's national interest where it is right to do so.

EU and Canada have announced retaliatory tariffs, weak PM?

I don't accept that. Our approach to the US has been pragmatic and we continue to have productive conversations with the US administration at all levels.

Our focus is a long-term wider economic deal which will see benefits for the industry

and hardworking British people.

How will these damage the steel industry?

We have been working closely with the steel and aluminium sectors over the last few weeks to understand what the expected impact of tariffs will be on industry and will continue to do so.

In 2023, the US accounted for 5% of UK steel exports and 6% of UK aluminium exports.

Whilst these aren't huge volumes, that does not mean we are not taking this extremely seriously and doing everything we can to try to avoid UK industry being hit.

What are you doing to protect the steel industry?

This government will simply not allow the end of steel making in the UK.

That's why we have committed up to £2.5 billion of investment to rebuild the UK steel industry and support communities now and for generations to come.

And next month, the final measure included in the British Industry Supercharger package comes into force, bringing energy costs for important UK industries – including steel – closer in line with other major economies around the world.

Once fully implemented, the total value of reduced electricity prices is expected to be between £320 million and £410 million this year, and over £5 billion over 10 years.

We also back the industry's application to the Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) investigate what further steps might be necessary to protect UK producers.

If needed:

Only 5% of UK steel exports and 6% of aluminium exports (by volume) go to the US (worth noting it's high value, so a higher % by value).

The current steel safeguard is critical to protect our industry against unfair trading practices and was recently extended to June 2026.

This was designed to protect from the inflow of steel diverted from the US Market when it was put in place in 2018. Through the steel strategy, we will ensure that there is a plan for our critical steel industry following the expiration of the Safeguard.

How are we managing the risks to businesses in Northern Ireland?

We will always act in the best interests of all UK businesses which of course includes those in Northern Ireland.

As I have said, whilst we are not considering imposing tariffs immediately, we absolutely reserve the right to do so if necessary.

As per the Windsor Framework, where goods do not subsequently enter the EU, the Duty Reimbursement Scheme enables traders to reclaim or remit EU applicable duties in full without any limit on total claims.

We will look closely at any retaliatory tariffs announced by the EU any impact these might have on businesses, but it is our understanding these will not come into effect immediately [guide 31 March if public].

Will you revive UK tariffs on US products including whiskey, jeans and motorbikes?

All options are on the table so it' s one option, but we won' t be imposing tariffs immediately.

We' re prioritising engagement with the US to stand up for industry and find a resolution. We will continue to take a cool-headed approach and reserve our right to retaliate, remaining prepared to defend the UK's national interest.

What engagement are you doing?

Industry Minister Sarah Jones met senior representatives from the steel and aluminium sectors yesterday and the Secretary of State speak to UK Steel today.

As you will have seen yesterday, the Trade and Economics policy manager at UK steel said that making the UK' s steel exempt from the tariffs is a “ key priority” and that DBT is “ all over it” .

Some steel companies have said you should make preparations to implement emergency tariffs should there be evidence of import surges in the coming months. Are you?

UK Steel has applied to the TRA for a functional review of the steel safeguard measure in light of the US tariffs, as well as broader challenges posed by global overcapacity in the steel market, and I [the Business and Trade Secretary] back that application.

Market reaction?

As you know we do not comment on markets.

How are we managing the risks to businesses in Northern Ireland?

We will always act in the best interests of all UK businesses which of course includes those in Northern Ireland.

As I have said, whilst we are not considering imposing tariffs immediately, we absolutely reserve the right to do so if necessary.

As per the Windsor Framework, where goods do not subsequently enter the EU, the Duty Reimbursement Scheme enables traders to reclaim or remit EU applicable duties

in full without any limit on total claims.

We will look closely at any retaliatory tariffs announced by the EU any impact these might have on businesses, but it is our understanding these will not come into effect immediately [guide 31 March if public].

What trade protections are in place for the steel and aluminium industries?

The UK currently applies 44 trade remedy measures in addition to the globally applied steel safeguard measure.

We currently apply a global safeguard measure on 14 separate steel product categories, 17 separate anti-dumping or anti-subsidy measures on certain steel imports, and 2 measures on certain aluminium imports.

The Trade Remedies Authority regularly discusses trade remedy measures with industry, and we encourage continued dialogue and any applications for new measures or the review of existing measures to ensure that UK businesses are protected from unfair foreign trade practices.

Next steps to securing a trade deal? Timelines?

Getting the right deal is the most important thing, but we are working at pace with the US to deliver this.

We are already having regular dialogue with each other.

Why are you waiting until Spring to publish the Steel Strategy when industry needs action now?

We have committed to publish Our Plan for Steel, on which we're currently consulting, in the Spring. It will look at long-term issues facing the sector such as high electricity costs, unfair trading practices and scrap metal recycling.

We want to move swiftly, but in a way which addresses the longstanding issues the sector has faced for years and in line with other key workstreams such as developing the Industrial Strategy and Trade Strategy.

This is not easy, but we are determined to succeed.

Those who enjoyed Christopher Nolan' s 2023 blockbuster Oppenheimer will recall the intensive scientific collaboration and advancement - from Cambridge England to Los Alamos New Mexico - that resulted in the allied powers winning the race to develop the hydrogen bomb. Anglo-American partnership on this most lethal of deterrents deepened further in 1962, when over three days in the Bahamas John F Kennedy and Harold Macmillan mapped out the Polaris Sales Agreement, which to this day underpins the joint nuclear umbrella the US and UK provide its people and its allies. These historic technological partnerships – for all their destructive might – ultimately allowed us to secure a technological edge over our adversaries and bring an end to the tyranny and slaughter of the second world war. Thereafter, the joint nuclear deterrent delivered an unprecedented period of stability for our nations that underwrote decades of rampant economic growth. An exemplar of peace through strength, you might say.

American and British science cooperation – ever restless - went on to deliver the technology upon which all contemporary commerce, communication and defence is based; the internet.

We don' t need another deterrent but there are major life enhancing and lifesaving advances to which we need to put our minds. The biggest immediate example is AI. We stand at the foothills of this next great foundation technology that will redefine the century ahead, accelerating every other endeavour and discovery we want to

undertake.

I will join many of Britain' s greatest AI innovators and investors this week in California for the Global Tech Conference, the world' s premier AI gathering. Of the many issues we will discuss with our US and allied counterparts, I expect a central theme to dominate: the strategic technology rivalry between us and our adversaries.

Once more, we must combine our strengths to keep our citizens ahead in the global race. Our two science-rich nations, the US and UK, are the only two western countries with trillion-dollar technology eco-systems. Our combined research and innovation prowess - the US and UK are home to the top fifteen universities in the world - arguably remains our greatest defence against the values of freedom we cherish.

The challenges we face today are as profound as any we have confronted together in our past. Yet so are the opportunities.

While many governments are focussed on the risks and the dangers of AI' s unknown powers, too few are investing enough energy to unlocking the enormity of life improving potential AI can unleash, from health, to education, to the security of our people.

And as with Manhattan and Polaris, together the US and UK are natural allies to work together to deliver generational advances. Our two governments should steer, facilitate and enable our world-leading industries and scientists to deliver bigger outcomes offered by advocacy in technology.

We are at a genuine inflection point. Now is the moment to back the innovators at the tech frontier. Instead of over-regulating these new technologies, our two governments stand ready to enable and seize the almost unimaginable benefits that they offer. The fair exchange of manufactured products is, and will of course remain, important to both US and UK economies. But the trade agreement Prime Minister Starmer and President Trump left the West Wing seeking a few weeks ago imagines a much broader and future-focussed collaboration that looks well beyond goods and services, to a full spectrum technology partnership between Britain and America.

I am excited by the breakthroughs such a partnership could accelerate together. In Biotech, there is huge potential in genomics, protein design and engineering. Artificial Intelligence could enable earlier and more precise diagnosis, better drug discovery and personalised cancer vaccines. We are determined to build advanced data centres and develop the world' s first advanced quantum computer. And there are opportunities in collaborating to advance nuclear technology. These are just a few areas in which the US and UK could create moonshot achievements. Our vision for this partnership should span a range of possibilities, on earth and in space.

In an era of heightened competition and contest, we cannot afford to stand still. It is vital that our great democracies adapt to counter new threats, retain the edge over our adversaries and embrace new opportunities across critical advanced technologies to improve the daily lives of all of our citizens. As closely allied democracies, America and Britian can achieve more together than they can do apart. This is why a technology partnership needs to be at the heart of any US-UK economic deal. We need to think MEGA – Make our Economies Great Again – for all our prosperity and security.

An update on today's developments on Germany's defence and infra package. We will diptel after the Bundesrat vote on Tuesday.

Summary: CDU, SPD and Greens reach agreement on the defence and infrastructure fiscal package announced by Merz last Tuesday (see Diptel ***). This secures the 2/3 Bundestag majority required for the changes. Greens extract concessions from CDU and SPD that will extend the scale of the stimulus. The package still requires approval by the Bundesrat.

Detail

1. On Friday, Friedrich Merz announced the outcome of negotiations between the Greens, SPD and CDU/CSU. Changes to the original proposal were required to secure Greens approval and confirm that a revolution in German fiscal policy is underway.
2. All three parties affirmed their support for defence spending above 1% to be exempt from the German debt brake, which limits borrowing to 0.35% of GDP.

3. The Greens succeeded, however, in extracting significant amendments to the proposed €500bn infrastructure fund:

- The extra-budgetary fund of €500bn, previously negotiated between the CDU and SPD, was originally vaguely earmarked for infrastructure of which €100bn to be allocated to the German states. Following negotiations with the Greens, the fund will now also allocate €100bn to climate action (contributing to the goal of reaching climate neutrality by 2045). The €500bn will be additional to regular spending: it must fund new investment, not plug gaps in existing budgets.
- The regular budget must now reach an investment quota of 10% before investments from the special fund are tapped. This Greens proposal ensures additionality by making the ability to draw down the €500bn dependent on substantial infrastructure spend in the regular budget.
- The definition of defence has been expanded to include debt for civil protection, intelligence services, aiding countries who are being attacked in contravention of international law (Ukraine) and information security. The inclusion of Ukraine spending is a significant since we understand this to mean that German military, humanitarian and financial support to Ukraine would now be exempt from the debt brake.

Next steps

4. A vote in the Bundestag is scheduled for Tuesday, followed on Friday 21 March by a vote in the Bundesrat (where representatives from the German states sit). To pass through the Bundesrat, votes from Bavaria (and therefore support of the Free Voters party) will be needed. The Free Voters (a localised party, particularly focused on farming issues in Bavaria) are currently opposed, but hopes are that they will be brought round by Bavaria's Christian Social Union.

Reactions

5. Merz has said that they have come up with a package that they can put to a vote "with a clear conscience", while Lars Klingbeil (Leader of the SPD) noted: "We in the political centre have laid the foundation for Germany to get back on its feet and to defend itself".

6. Various economists have been central in advising the government on the fiscal package. Clemens Fuest, Director of the Munich-based Institute for Economic Research, welcomed the agreement reached on additionality, arguing that the infrastructure fund should not result in less money from core budgets being spent on infrastructure. However, economists also warn of possible risks, including raised borrowing costs, concerns on effectiveness of spending in defence and infra, as well as inflationary risks. ***

The €500bn infrastructure investment fund amounts to a stimulus of around 1% of GDP each year for the next ten years: comparable to the impact on the German economy of the Marshall Plan or reconstruction of Eastern Germany (1.0% of GDP). Market reaction last week was strong in relation to both the DAX, Euro and Bund yields. And all of this change should still keep the German debt/GDP ratio below 85%.

Summary: *this was a wide-ranging discussion about science and technology policy held under Chatham House rules (hence specific contributions from participants have been anonymised), which focused on (i) support for basic research, (ii) regulation (where attendees shared varied views about the appropriate balance between regulation and innovation), (iii) UK-US relations and (iv) technology adoption.*

[begins]

The roundtable started with introductions from two attendees. One summarised relevant findings of the 2025 Stanford Emerging Technologies Review, noting the importance of partnership in a world where many crucial decision-makers are now outside of government. The other said that the UK's AI Action Plan was a model for the world both in the engagement that went into developing it and in the ambition and specificity of its recommendations.

Peter Kyle (PK) then gave short introductory remarks. He noted that, having listened, it was now time for HMG to deliver, focusing on (1) economic growth, (2) the productivity and efficiency of government and (3) transforming citizens' experience of the state. He outlined recent work on infrastructure, touching on the Action Plan (noting the number of responses to the recent call for Eols), CNI designation for data centres and planning reforms. He spoke about regulation and the work of the RIO, the uplift to R&D in a challenging fiscal context and the shift in HMG's approach towards a focus on high-growth sectors.

Peter Mandelson (PM) began by emphasising that he has a clear remit – to update the UK-US relationship and put tech partnership at its heart. This will ensure that, in the new global context, we can win a new and profound technological race against our rivals and adversaries, PM referenced the work of the Manhattan Project, which unlocked new discoveries, technologies and industries. He also spoke about a new model of alignment which would require alignment not just government to government, but also between universities and the private sector – in PM's view, entrepreneurs should be 'engines of collaboration. PM said that this technological partnership would be a natural extension of our unique defence and security partnership.

The ensuing discussion encompassed the full range of science and tech policy, which I have grouped below broadly by theme:

Research:

- The importance of investing in basic research and supporting commercial spinout.
- Sustainable funding for research. One attendee noted how the tuition fee cap in the UK and potential taxes on university endowments in the US threatened funding, and also touched on the need to reform immigration systems to ensure that the most talented people can stay in the UK. PK spoke about (i) the university finance situation HMG had inherited and the measures he had taken to resolve it (including increases in the HE and research budgets, entailing higher expectations from universities) (ii) ending the "war on universities" and the importance of predictability and stability as a starting point, (iii) the industrial strategy as an example of this approach.
- The importance of ensuring that rigorous research security measures do not end up accidentally making collaboration between friends (e.g. the UK and the US) more difficult or imposing excessive bureaucracy. HMA agreed with this point, emphasising the need to (i) throw a wall around our collective work and (ii) increase collaboration within that wall, taking advantage of our exceptional levels of mutual trust and confidence.

Regulation:

- AI regulation. PK, when asked by one attendee how our approach differs to the EU, emphasised the fundamental difference in approach, stressing (i) we have not legislated in the UK (though he has not ruled this out), (ii) the AISI has real value as a partner for frontier labs to support the safe deployment of new models, (iii) the maturity of our regulatory landscape and work to empower sector-specific regulators and (iv) the importance of innovation for national security. Another attendee later spoke about the EU's approach and noted the difficulty of evaluating approaches to regulation well, stressing the need for technical expertise and the UK's leadership in this space. PK later spoke about his decision to rebrand the AISI as a 'Security Institute' and explained its work on chemical and biological threats, emphasising the importance of openness for safety. He also spoke about the value of a voluntary of approach and the importance of constructive relationships between governments and labs.
- AI Copyright.
- Regulatory alignment. One attendee noted that, whilst the UK's overall regulatory approach had generally managed to strike the right balance, we must be wary of the trade-offs between (a) finding optimal regulation for the UK and (b) ensuring consistency with other countries, noting the example of digital IDs, where

alignment is important. He noted that the UK can set a positive example for the EU on data transfers and data localisation. Another attendee noted the example of data-sharing in aviation, where there are clear incentives to share data, including about mistakes, to improve collective safety.

- **Bitcoin regulation.** One attendee noted the need to reform regulation for stablecoins in particular. **PK** noted that he was excited by the potential of bitcoin, including the opportunities that blockchain technologies present for decentralisation. He noted that no country had solved this issue, but that we were working on it.

US-UK Relations:

- **HMG's presence in SF.** One attendee noted that the UK's team in SF should be better known, given the need for a constant conversation between the UK and the US 'on the round.'
- **The UK-US tech partnership.** One attendee asked **PK** what his expectations were from the US tech sector. **PK** emphasised that he was looking for a partnership which would ensure that our two countries could get ahead in the technological race and stay there, noting that this is crucial for our prosperity and our national security. He noted that the offer we are currently proposing to the USG is only possible because of the depth of our history, which we must now leverage to take on our shared challenges. **PK** noted the UK's strengths, including four of the top ten universities and a mature investment landscape, noting the need to coordinate this landscape and make it more concerted.

Adoption, Infrastructure and Growth:

- **Technology adoption.** One attendee noted that the UK has a strong science and R&D base but noted that translating this into productivity gains would require a focus on (i) adoption, (ii) energy infrastructure and (iii) specific use-cases like healthcare. He noted that this approach should be applied to sectors like life sciences and quantum, not just AI. **PK** noted the need to be creative about adoption and explained the work of the Tech Adoption Review to get our interventions right and deliver tangible change. **PK** also noted the work of the AI Energy Council.

Misc.:

- The importance of **advanced semiconductor manufacturing for sovereignty.** One attendee noted that we had fallen behind rival and adversary states and concluded that the UK must invest.
- The value and potential of low-tech innovation.

Conclusion:

- The roundtable ended with a quickfire round where attendees were asked to share their views about the one technology that would define the decade to come – answers varied a great deal, varying from cybersecurity and quantum technologies to education and inclusion.

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Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent sat down with Tucker Carlson for an hour-long interview to explain the administration's new tariffs, and why they had to do something to stop the slide. "And if we think like a classical model of tariff income, would say, if there's a 10% tariff, then the currency would appreciate about 40% of that. So 4% of it, then the producer in the other country would eat about 4% and then the US consumer might have a one time price adjustment of 2% so in a 10% tariff, maybe the consumer pays 2% of it. We saw there was a study out recently from a group at MIT that shows with President Trump's first China tariffs, which were approximately 20% the price level went up point seven. So to answer your question, if we could put on a 20% tariff and have the foreigners pay that and use that money to bring down our government deficit and keep taxes low." He also talked about his recent interaction with Ukraine President Zelensky:

Tucker Carlson

How did you wind up interacting with Zelensky?

Scott Bessent

President asked me to go to, well, he actually asked me to lead the economic agreement that was part of his peace plan. And I think it's important to look at the arc of President Trump's peace plan, and he had sequenced it really well, was we're going to sign a deal with Ukrainians, and it'll do several things. One, it will make the US and Ukraine partners to link us closer together. Two, it will be a symbol to Russian leadership that the US isn't abandoning Ukraine. But importantly, three, it will show the American people that we have an economic stake and that we haven't just been doing these massive grants, which has been the history of USAID, of course. So Ukraine succeeds, we succeed, and it could be a long term partnership. Now, President, I thought it was important to take the agreement to Kyiv and present it to President Zelensky. Everyone's telling me, oh no, have him meet you in Vienna. He's going to be at the Munich Security Conference. A few days later, I said, No, I want to go there and discuss it with him. And that's how I ended up going to Kyiv. Very interesting. Going to Kyiv flight of Poland. Then you get on, I don't know if you've been on it, get on this night train for 10 hours, and you arrive at Kyiv at 830 in the morning. And for anyone who they said, Oh, the President Trump selling out to the Russians. Not selling out to the Russians. The Russians bombed Kyiv four hours before I got there. They hadn't bombed since November. So the Russians didn't like the look of this deal, because it thought that the it was actually something durable for the US people and the Ukrainian people. So what happened? President Zelensky was in the mood to sign the deal that day. We had a spirited discussion, and I said to him, you've got 50 reporters out there. I am here to show that there is no daylight between the American people the Russian people, between, excuse me, Ukrainian people, between the American leadership and Ukrainian leadership. And I said, you've opened up daylight size of the Grand Canyon. What are we going to go out and tell those people? He said, Tell them I'm going to sign the deal in Munich. I said, so you're going to sign the deal when you see vice president Vance and Secretary of State Rubio in Munich? Yes, he didn't sign it there. There's a lot of back and forth. The following week, they're begging to come to the White House, and should

make him sign the deal before he comes. And then he got to the Oval Office and blew up. What should have been the easiest thing to do in the world. He's supposed to show up, have a press conference. We're going to have a private lunch. If he had anything on his mind, there were going to be nine of us, nine of them in the White House dining room he could have aired his grievances in. And there's a famous photo in the East Wing ballroom of everything lay down on the table to be signed, and it never got signed.

Tucker Carlson

Music, Mr. Secretary, thank you very much for joining us so where the Treasury Department President had a press conference yesterday, next door, in which he announced a whole new tariff regime global. He'd been promising to do this well for 40 years, really, it came, not out of nowhere, but it was clearly his intent all along, as stated. But it did rattle people, including some of his supporters. So I just wanted to ask you, big picture, where do you think this leads?

Scott Bessent

Well, Tucker and thank thank you for having me. And as you said, the President's been talking about this for four decades. Yes, and this is transformational for the American economy, for the American worker, and for the new Republican alignment. And it's a combination of the old and new ideas. Some of the old ideas were put away. You know, I always tell everyone and they don't want to hear it. The original tariff man was Alexander Hamilton, yes, and he used terrorists to fund the new nation and to protect American industry. President Trump has added a third leg to the stool, and he uses terrorists to negotiate. But I think this is not unlike I was a freshman in college when Ronald Reagan came in in 1980 and a new day in America. And when I talk to people now, and they look back and they look at the Reagan years so fondly, I remember what it was like, and it was choppy, and the President very choppy, very choppy. President Reagan stood the course. And look, this is not an invitation, but the at one point in the early 80s, a farmer showed up with a shotgun at the Federal Reserve to the kill Paul Volcker for raising rates. So like I said, that's not an invitation for action. But it was a tough time. And then in 1984 the President Reagan won re election with 49 states, and I think they may have even let Mondale win Minnesota just so it wasn't a skunk, just to be nice here, and that's what President Trump is doing now for for years, the American worker at middle middle class has been eviscerated. American workers have taken it on the chin. And, you know, we're just starting to see some of the research now, like we're seeing research on what's called the China shock from 2004 it's just coming out now, and it's what you know. It's what I know. But finally, academics are saying, Oh, they gosh, the American workers never recovered from the China shock. What a surprise, and President Trump sensed it 40 years ago, but out in the campaign trail, starting in 2015 up until last year, he has promised the American workers that the old standard of living can come back. And because what we've seen over the past at least 20 years, since the China shock, but more like the past 30, are these mass, massive distributional problems, where the coast have done great Yes, and the middle of the country has they had just seen quality of the life, life expectancy, decline. They don't think their children are going to do better than they are, and a lot of people don't care. And President Trump cares, this administration cares, and this is the first step towards realigning that a lot of our trading partners, including some of our allies, have not been good partners. If tariffs are so bad, why do they have them? Quick question, why do they have them right? Or if the American consumer is going to pay all the tariff, then why do they care about tariffs, right? Because they're going to eat them. So I think that this is the beginning of a process we're going to re industrialize, that we have gone to a highly financialized economy. We have we have stopped making things, especially a lot of things that are relevant for national security. I think one of the few good outcomes from COVID was we had a

beta test for what maybe a kinetic war with a large adversary could look like. And it turned out that these highly efficient supply chains were not strategically secure, so that we don't make our own medicines, that we don't make our own semiconductors, that we don't make our own ships anymore. So I think the if I were to say, was there any good outcome from COVID, it was it work woke the world up to these supply chain problems. So economic security is national security. President Trump and I have talked about that a lot, so this is a national security issue that we're seeing here, but it's also an economic security issue, and it's to, I don't want to say redistribute, but it is to give working Americans real wage gains and enhance their lives. And I've said out of the campaign trail, one of my most frequent mottos was, Wall Street's done great. It could continue doing well, but it's Main Street's turn. It's main streets turn, and that's what we saw yesterday. It's Main Street's turn.

Tucker Carlson

So over the course of my life, 55 years, Wall Street really has been the commonly recognized measure of economic health, like, how's the Dow doing? We've got entire TV channels devoted to tracking its progress, which has mostly been up during the course of my life. So if the you know, the average of the equity averages fall, if the stock market falls, that's seen by a lot of people, is like a measure that the economy itself is, is in decline. Do you think that's a fair measure?

Scott Bessent

The market goes up and down? Warren, Warren Buffett has a saying, in the short run, the markets a voting machine. In the long run, it's a weighing machine, and in the long run, it's going to weigh do we have good policies? Yes. And I, in my former business, I comment, commented on market structure, market ups and downs a lot. I'm trying not to do that, yes, but for everyone who thinks that this, these market declines are all based on the President's economic policies, I can tell you that this market declines started with the Chinese AI announcement of deep sea, right? So the so called mag seven, the tech stocks had been doing very well for about 18 months, led the market. And I think that there was kind of a real dose of reality in what was going on in AI. I think us is going to remain the leader in AI, but the AI related stocks started coming down. So like, if I were to analyze in my old hat, and there's only time I'm going to talk about it, my old hat, what's happening with the market? I'd say it's more a mag seven problem and not a magnet problem, right?

Tucker Carlson

So it's, it's a deeper so actually, the markets are, you're saying, in this specific case, with tech stocks are taking, like a real measure, the value of companies relative to foreign companies.

Scott Bessent

Well, it's that. But if we look with the equal weighted s, p, even after today's move down 4% of the year, or in a long term chart, you wouldn't even notice that. Yeah, and I think the most important thing that we can do, that I can do as a Treasury Secretary, that President Trump wants to do is put in sound fundamentals for the underlying economy. And if the underlying economy is good, if taxes are stable, businesses have predictability. We have cheap and plentiful energy. If we deregulate, if we treat our workforce well, then we're going to have a great stock market

Tucker Carlson

fair. The president suggested, in describing his plan for tariffs, he said, Look, you could conceivably fund a lot of government with tariffs, and that would suggest that taxpayers fund less of the burden. And so do you expect that these will be accompanied by a congressionally approved tax cut for the middle class?

Scott Bessent

I just want to go back for a moment too that one of the things that the terrorists are doing is we are

pushing back against other economic systems. So the Chinese have a very different economic system. They have low cost some we call it, literally slave labor. They subsidize industry with subsidized loans. They have a lot of non tariff barriers. Your show can't be shown there. So we're pushing back against that. And with the tariff income, it can be substantial. And if we think like a classical model of tariff income, would say, if there's a 10% tariff, then the currency would appreciate about 40% of that. So 4% of it, then the producer in the other country would eat about 4% and then the US consumer might have a one time price adjustment of 2% so in a 10% tariff, maybe the consumer pays 2% of it. We saw there was a study out recently from a group at MIT that shows with President Trump's first China tariffs, which were approximately 20% the price level went up point seven. Here, that's a very unique formula that hasn't been tried in this country for a long time.

Tucker Carlson

And do you think, but it would require congressional participation to get there, to move tax rates, of course, are set by the Congress.

Scott Bessent

Well, what? What we're going to have now we are in this very odd, what I would call betwixt, in between, between the tariff income and what Doge is doing in terms of the cutting government expenses. So CBO scoring. And for 35 years, I was on the other side of the wall, and I would always Oh, well, CBO says this. And I didn't really realize that kind of CBO scoring is a lot like Enron accounting, that it's not real, and when you actually look at the rules,

but you assumed it was on the outside. Sure. Look, they're experts,

Scott Bessent

Congressional Budget Office. It's the Congressional Budget Budget Office, and they're well intentioned people, they just have the nonsensical rules like, think about this when all the scoring is done over a 10 year window, yes, so they just assume 1.7 or 1.8% economic growth over the 10 years, and that never moves whether you raise taxes or cut taxes, doesn't move. So that's what like during the during the campaign, when Vice President Harris was announcing all these big tax increases she wanted to do and things like that, that the CBO was scoring her very well, and President Trump wants to make the 2017 tax cuts permanent. That was kind of a blowout number, because obviously growth is going to go up a lot when you cut taxes. So that was a long way of saying we will not get credit for the tariffs and any bill, because Congress is not going to legislate it. President's doing it with executive authority, but the money will be coming in. We've already taken in several 100 million dollars on the China tariffs from his first term. We've taken about 35 billion a year just on the old tariffs, not on the new ones. So in the CVO window, the that's about \$350 billion which pays for a lot of the President's promises on no tax on tips, no tax on Social Security, no tax on overtime, the making interest deductibility on autos made in the US. And think what the president's doing here, he is backing into an affordability solution for the bottom 50% wage earners, because they are the ones who will benefit from all four of those programs.

Tucker Carlson

So looking at, say, a year from now. So next, beginning of, next April. Do you have any sense of how much the US government anticipates bringing in from the tariffs announced yesterday?

Scott Bessent

It's going to be a moving target, sure. But could it? Could it be anywhere from 300 billion to 600 billion a

year? Sure?

Tucker Carlson

Okay, so that's that's meaningful revenue, very

Scott Bessent

meaningful. But what will happen with tariffs over time? That the ultimate goal of the tariffs, and the President says all the time, bring your factory here. That's the best solution toward getting away from a tariff wall. So move your factory from China, from Mexico, from Vietnam, bring it here. So what will happen over time? Will have substantial tariff income. In the beginning. Manufacturers will build their factory here. The tariffs will drop, but the revenue from the factories, the from income taxes, from all the new jobs, will go up. So we'll be taking it in domestically as the tariffs drop. And why are the tariffs dropping? Because we're making it here and our trade deficits dropping.

Tucker Carlson

So you've obviously thought this through. You think that the United States has the necessary labor force for this transition?

Scott Bessent

I think we do. I think with eight, with AI, with automation, with so many of these factories are going to be new, they're going to be smart factories that I think we we've got all the labor force we need and what we are doing on the other side. One of the reasons other than my support for President Trump that I came out from behind my desk and I had a pretty good life, and I wanted to come out and really tell people that I was worried about an impending financial calamity, given the high levels of government spending that were leading to high levels of government debt. So what we are doing on one side, the President is reordering trade. On the other side, we are shedding excess labor in the federal government, and bringing down federal borrowings, and then on the other side, that will give us the labor that we need for the new manufacturing. And we're going to re level, re level the private sector. So the private sector, in essence, has been in recession during the Biden years, and this is an opportunity to right size the federal government and unleash the private sector again, because it's been hemmed down by excessive regulation and it's been crowded out by the government.

Tucker Carlson

Do you ever think your best to part of your job is to forecast like the effects of these policies that you have? We've got probably one out of six people in this country is here illegally, maybe 50 million illegal aliens, and the President said he wants to deport him. Then you have AI and the projections there are massive labor market disruption. Fewer people need it. You alluded to that a minute ago. Then you have the tariffs. And like, we can guess it's their effect, but we don't really know, because we've never done it. And then you have the reaction from the rest of the rest of the world to those chairs, like, there's so many huge factors that are effectively unknown, that are black boxes. Really, do you ever think like, wow, you know, kind of hard to know what's going to happen. Look,

Scott Bessent

it is. And I always think that you can never be 100% sure, but you can stay within side of guardrails and keep moving forward. I can't remember one of the Sunday morning shows I was on a couple of weeks ago, the commentator asked me, she said, Can you guarantee me there won't be a recession? And I said, I can't guarantee you anything. Like there's nothing that tells me there should be one. So I believe that this is going to work, just like President Reagan believed that supply side economics was going to work and but what I do know that the old system wasn't working. I think that's right. And if you look at a system that's not working, you got to be brave to change it. So what wasn't working? Would it have been really fun for me to come in and just keep issuing a lot of debt, and it's almost like a

bodybuilder is taking steroids outside. Looks great. Your muscular inside, you're killing your vital organs. That's what was going on here. But it would have been easy to keep pumping up the economy, borrowing a lot of money, creating a lot of government jobs. There was no controversy when we're doing all that, and they but you were going to end up in a calamity. If you go back and look, you look at the financial crisis in oh 708, economy looked great right up until then you go back and you look at the end of [the.com](#) bubble, and then the whole credit problem, the fraud at WorldCom, Enron, some other country, companies. Economy looked great until it didn't. And I think one of the things that we won't get credit for, but that this administration will have done, is avoiding a financial calamity. Think about it that they've done an analysis that one of the reasons 911 happened because the airlines didn't want to pay for reinforced doors. Yes, they kept pushing back. FAA didn't push hard enough. And now, you know, we've got the reinforced doors. So I look at it, we're putting on the reinforced doors before the crash.

Tucker Carlson

What's the scramble, the lobbying scramble by foreign governments going to be like over the next three months? Next three months, because the President said yesterday, you know, putting a universal tariff, you know, one standard. But then, of course, each country is adjusted according to a lot of different factors, trade deficit, currency manipulation, regulation and then tariffs. But you know, this is all, as you said, a moving picture. It's a developing situation. So like, if I'm pick a country, you know, Vietnam, China, I mean, I'm going to really try to bring pressure to bear on this administration to adjust those numbers. Like, what's that going to be? Like?

Scott Bessent

It's going to be the president's decision. And I think his view is, this has been going on for a long time for friends and foes, and we're going to see where this plays out. I think what's going to be more important than the discussion with countries is the discussion with companies. So what do companies want to do? As President Trump said yesterday, best way to get around the tariff build your factory here. And what can we do here at Treasury to help that? We're pushing to get the tax bill done so we can guarantee the low taxes, full depreciation within the first year. We're working with Secretaries burgham and Wright on energy security, and we're working on getting the regulations down. President, I don't know whether he talked about it yesterday or the day before, Taiwan semi or just semiconductor manufacturer in the world, Lee Zeldin, the EPA Commissioner, is working to push through all the permits that they need? Because we've just gone into this regulatory morass where it takes so long to get things done in this country. So I think what will be more interesting are the individual company announcements, more than the country announcements.

Tucker Carlson

You want to sell to Americans, you got to make it an American, sure,

Scott Bessent

or pay pay the tariffs.

Tucker Carlson

So how is China as a nation going through? I mean, this is such a big challenge. It's directly in their face. It's about every country on the globe, but it's really most more than any other country about China. I think it's fair to say, how are they gonna respond? What's the retaliation look like?

Scott Bessent

Well, I don't know if they can retaliate for a couple of reasons. If you look at the history, and I used to teach economic history, and when you look at the history, we are the debtor nation. Yes, we have the trade deficits. The surplus nation is in the weaker position because the Chinese business model and

Tucker, by the way, the Chinese business model and the economy are the most unbalanced, imbalanced in the history of the modern world. We've never seen anything like this in terms of their export level relative to their GDP, relative their population. So I think it is going to be very difficult for them to try to change the model they're trying. They're in a deflationary recession, slash depression right now. They're trying to export their way out of it, and we can't let them do that. But I think that when you think the Chinese manufacturing system is like that old Disney movie with the brooms carrying the buckets, yeah, there's nothing you can do. Like, that's their business model. It's not going to stop now. What could happen if you were to say, Scott, what's the drain scenario? That somehow there could be a deal where the US and China, we want more manufacturing, which would mean a smaller part of the economy's consumption. The Chinese have this imbalanced economy with too much manufacturing. And actually, the Chinese consumers really the get the short end of the stick. So Chinese households, they're calling what's called the middle, middle income trap, that could we do something together to say, Okay, you rebalance. You consume more, manufacture less. We are going to consume less and manufacture more, and we'll be military rivals. There'll still be an economic rivalry, but we're going to level the playing field by a lot. Now, that's not going to happen tomorrow. That's not going to happen in a month, but over the next few years, they may have to come around, because I think their business model is broken. I think President Trump's broken their business model with these tariffs.

Tucker Carlson

So you're describing, you know the famous scenario where if you take a take a bank loan, the bank is in charge. They can repossess whatever they bar to get you barred against, but if you take a big enough loan, you're kind of in charge of the bank Exactly.

Scott Bessent

And they've just got such a big deficit with us that they need our markets. They can't survive without.

Tucker Carlson

Um, are you confident that there's like, a clear enough channel of communication between the two governments that the details can be worked out and that nothing will go crazy in the meantime?

Scott Bessent

Well, I think what gives me a lot of confidence is the relationship between President Trump and Chairman xi, yes, that when you have a direct line of communication at the very top, then I think it's very difficult for things to go haywire.

Tucker Carlson

Interesting. What about the rest of the world? What about Europe?

Scott Bessent

The Europeans? We look back and there was a famous meeting where President Trump told the Europeans, you're insane for building Nord Stream two. What are you doing? You already get most of your energy from Russia, and you're going to double down on it. And they did. And look what happened. So we blew it up. Somebody did. Somebody probably Putin some Norwegian fishermen to it is what I read, but the look the Europeans go kicking and screaming, but I think they're going to have to rebalance to Germany has a very imbalanced export economy, and they were on the verge of De industrialization. There they were. The opposite of us. Had expensive energy, yes, that they were depending on Italy and the countries in the south to keep the Euro suppressed. And they were selling into China, and now China is becoming their competitor.

Tucker Carlson

So you said at the outset, you the first example, the analogy that he used, was President Reagan's first term, obviously big win in 80 recession of 82 wipe out, and then, like, the biggest landslide in history in 84 so you're suggesting by saying that, that, you know, the fruits were obvious within the first term than four years, that they were.

Scott Bessent

Only difference now is there was a lot of competition back then, but there's a level of civility. And the real danger here, if there were a midterm loss, and I don't think there has to be, you know what's going to happen? I know what's going to happen. Democratic House is kind of going immediately to impeachment for something, of course, like the law fair is going to start again. Yes, and I think the American people are going to hate it again. So Einstein's definition of insanity, doing the same thing again and expecting a different Do

Tucker Carlson

you think that? And this is really aimed at the people who support President Trump and who agree with you wholeheartedly that the current system was really bad, and like, drive across the country, you'll see how bad it has been horrible. It lowered life expectancy. But the people who are hoping that yesterday's move will lead to a demonstrably brighter future within four years. Is it your sincere prediction that, with you know, within four years, we'll say, actually, that kind of worked.

Scott Bessent

I believe that it's going to work, and I know that what we were doing wasn't working, yes, so I think we have to try this, and I have a high confidence ratio. It's going to work, and I have a very high confidence ratio. The good news is we have President Trump's previous term when everyone said none of this was going to work. Oh, the China terrorists are going to do this. They're going to cause inflation. They didn't. This is going to happen to working class it's going to be bad for working class Americans. Well, guess what? Working class Americans that hourly workers did better than supervisory workers. The bottom 50% of households, their net worth increased faster than the top 10% of households. And I'm not happy with what's going on in the market today, but the distribution of equities across households, the top 10% of Americans own 88% of equities, 88% of the stock market. The next 40% owns 12% of the stock market. The bottom 50 has debt. They have credit card bills, they rent their homes, they have auto loans, and we've got to give them some relief that I was struck by the statistic from last that's the message right there.

Tucker Carlson

Just as a bystander, I'm like, wow, okay, or that.

Scott Bessent

I like the examples, and I was really struck by two different statistics last year, summer of 2024 Americans took more European vacations than they had in history. Summer of 2024 more Americans were using food banks than they ever have in history. I went into two food banks that near my hometown to ask, what's the story? And they said, you know, it really takes for a lot of people, it's a loss of dignity to walk in a food bank, course, and but they were seeing something, a new phenomenon, that it wasn't their traditional clientele, wasn't people who lost their homes or what people out on the street. These were working families who could no longer \$100 at the grocery store. That basket of groceries every week, they were missing 567, things, and they were coming to the food bank to top up. So that's not a great America. Record European vacation, record food banks, and no reason we can't keep the record European vacations going, but we got to take care of these other people. But, and you know what? That they don't want handouts. The Democrats had this strategy called compensate the loser. So first of all, the name of that strategy, I don't think the bottom 50% of Americans for losers. I think the system hasn't worked for them. I think that they are winners. It's just

a bad system. So we are going to fix the system and look, they want good jobs. They want their kids to do better than they do. They want to own a home. They want to pay down their debt, that this isn't hard, and I think that we can do this in the next four years.

Tucker Carlson

You grew up in a middle class, working class background. You were very successful. Lived in rich person world for a long time, while this was all going on. And I just have to ask you candidly, when were you ever at dinner with people were like, wow, you know, we're doing great. I live in rich person world too. I'm not criticizing you at all. But like, did anyone at dinner ever say, Wow? You know, I just tried to drive somewhere for 100 miles. This country doesn't look good, like people are not thriving. Was there any sense of that among people? You knew?

Scott Bessent

No, they were more my netjet was an hour late. I had the worst day. My dead jet was an hour late. You can't believe, Oh, my God, I'm going to switch charter companies and look Tucker that I'm especially attuned to what I think is going on with the United States, because I will tell you, my family was very affluent. Early settlers, we were very affluent for about 250, years. My dad made a lot of bad financial choices. So when I was born, first, 678, years, we were affluent. He lost everything, and so I've seen what that's like. I've seen both sides, yes, that I was fortunate enough to be able to make it back, and that I know what economic insecurity is like, and I don't think people should have to have that, or if you want to work hard, and people want to work hard, you were out of the campaign trail with President Trump. I was out on the campaign trail, and I got to say one of the most so I went for the final two stops in Pittsburgh, Grand Rapids, Michigan, Pittsburgh, in the Duquesne arena, walk in and there are the union workers, steel workers. They got in their hats. They got on their vests. They're with their children, and it's very moving. They just want a better life. They want their communities to be sound. They want their kids to do better. They want the little league baseball like they don't care what's going on in Madison Avenue. They don't know what the hot new restaurant is in Paris. And the President Trump somehow has assembled this incredible coalition of Elon Musk, the richest man in the world, and those folks who were in the Rose Garden yesterday, and those people I saw at the Duquesne arena. And I think it's unbelievable.

Tucker Carlson

Interesting. What do you worry about as Treasury secretary? Obviously, probably like lion bed at night, thinking about all the things go wrong with the US economy. What are your if you could be honest, like, what are your biggest worries that?

Scott Bessent

So to the extent that in my business career, I had a strong point, I think it was risk management. So I do myself two things to the United States leading bond salesman, yep. And I think that with what's going on, I'm gonna have a better and better story to tell as we're getting our economic house and our fiscal house in order, and then I try to imagine what could go very wrong. What What would we do if there were another outbreak similar to COVID? You can't worry about things like that, but I worry about a kinetic war somewhere. What would we do in in the event of something that happened? And what I try to do is create situation where I can worry a little less every day. So I'll tell you, I came in. I was confirmed on January 28 and during the month of January, 10 year interest rates, which is probably the most important rate in the country, mortgages, are based on that. Business and capital formation is based on that. I came in and that it almost spiked to 5% and I think 5% can be an uncomfortable area for the economy, for Treasury, who has to issue a lot of bonds. And now that I've gotten in, I worry a lot, a little less, but I still worry we've got a tremendous amount of debt to roll, and I worry that we aren't going to do the smart cuts and the focus on waste, fraud and abuse. I worry that that gets sidelined. And then on the other side, I worry that the tax bill somehow gets bogged down.

We can have the largest tax increase in history. Or I worry that the normal geopolitical things, whether it's Iran Taiwan, that something goes haywire between Russia and Ukraine.

Tucker Carlson

So you began your job description by saying you're a bond salesman. You're selling America's debt to the world. And I know that was like a big part of the portfolio as the transition was envisioning it like, who can make the case for American bonds to the world? How were your case? Are you confident you can do that? And how is your pitch changing after yesterday?

Scott Bessent

Well, as I said, right right now, we're in this strange betwixt and between, because we are going to take in substantial tariff revenue, and what Doge is doing is substantially cutting expenses, but we're not getting credit for it right now, but I think markets starting to get a hint of it. So the 10 year bond, having almost peaked at five, is now through four. Way to think about it is every 100 every basis points, about a billion dollars in savings. So we've saved \$100 billion and that's probably not going to happen that quickly again, but I think that we are setting the sales for much better fiscal time, and people don't have to say the US is out of control, the US is going to default that we're not. And I think every day my case gets better, and like if we were to just imagine a very reductionist formula for government, so g equals s minus t , spending minus taxes, right that for spending. Our side, the Republicans, likes to we like to spend, but less than the Democrats. But both sides like to spend and then minus t . Democrats like higher taxes. We like lower taxes. What if the s actually went down? And I think, to me, that's the exciting part that that's been unthinkable in everybody's calculation.

Tucker Carlson

No one's even really seriously raised it, including Ronald Reagan, by the way.

Scott Bessent

Yep. And look, I think President Reagan had a different agenda, that he ramped up defense spending. And remember, Oh, he's crazy. Is this? It's going to break the budget? Star Wars is crazy. He's a mad man. And then the iron curtain went down. Yes, we were able to so it's actually a Soviet term, and he used the Soviet strategy on this, on the cell, on the Russians escalate to de escalate. Yes. So he escalated military spending. They tried to keep up, and then they collapsed. So, you know, again, everything's easy in hindsight, but I think here what we're doing in terms of bringing down these incredible levels of spending, but more More importantly, I tell anyone who will listen, I said, Remember, Doge is the office of government efficiency, not elimination, Not extinction. So what if we can actually do a better job with what with less seems inconceivable, but when I when I see what's going on in a lot of these government agencies, it's unbelievable. And like, if you think I've lived in Manhattan, I've lived in Florida, roughly, state of New York, state of Florida, have the same number of people. Actually, Florida has few more now. So New York budget is about 235 billion. Florida budgets, 120 5 billion. How did they do that? Oh yeah. And there's no income tax in Florida. Oh yeah, and the roads are better, and you go and get your driver's license, and it takes 15 minutes, not five hours. So I think, can we make the rest of America look more like Florida and less like New York? Or one day, is New York gonna look more like Florida?

Tucker Carlson

So do you think after four years, we will see an actual net reduction in government spending thanks to Doge?

Scott Bessent

Inflation adjusted? Yes.

Tucker Carlson

How long do you think Elon is in for?

Scott Bessent

I think that Elon that day to day, I don't know, but I think his imprint is going to be with us a long time, and I think that the mainstream media has tried to demonize Doge and all the folks who work with him. And I think we have a couple of treasury a couple of IRS. They're Treasury Employees who I hired, I interviewed, and I'll tell you, there's this one fellow, Tom Kraus. He was on TV with Brett bear the other night, and Tom's incredible. He's done \$100 billion of tech mergers with my investment business. I would have hired him. I don't think I could have afforded him, and he is doing this for the good of his country. He came in without touching any of the pavement systems that the mistruths that were spread by the Washington Post. He has analyzed the system, and within six weeks, pointed at all the vulnerabilities there. There's a young man named Sam Kirkos who was on Laura Ingraham with me the other night, and that was my idea. It's like, Let's bring him out of the shadows, and let's make this demonization stopped. And like this young man, other than fact, he only owns one pair of pants, which he likes, telling everyone, you or I would be happy if our daughter brought him home. He's a patriot. He's working hard for the country, and he's analytical, and the things that he's seen at the IRS just in their tech systems, and that's all he does. You know, Elon has a shirt that he wears under his jacket. He'll flash every once in a while, it says tech support, and that's what we're getting. Is we've got a blockbuster style government, and we should be on Netflix. We're hailing cabs and we're in an Uber economy. Why can't the government be in the gig economy? Not hard. So we're not positive

Tucker Carlson

Can I see a weird question, what? Who runs the Federal Reserve? Exactly. I don't really. How can you have this, like, Pivotal entity, institution that obviously has, like, the most direct effect on markets, many and it does seem outside of political control.

Scott Bessent

What is that? Well, look, I think that I during my confirmation hearing, and I was actually at a dinner that Jerome Powell was at last night at my confirmation hearing, I said I'm only going to talk about the mistakes the Federal Reserve has made in the past. I won't talk about the ones they're going to make in the future. But I think it is important for monetary policy that they are walled off, that some of the other things they do, what regulation. They got into DEI, they got into climate, I actually think that that impinges on their monetary policy and makes them vulnerable. So I think that they should focus on monetary policy, doing the best that they can for the American economy, the American people, keeping inflation low. And then the rest. There are a lot of other banking agencies too.

Tucker Carlson

So the Fed Controls the Weather now too. What were they doing with climate?

Scott Bessent

Well, I will tell you, there's something that the Treasury Secretary chairs, something called the Financial Stability Oversight Council, and it's all the financial regulators. And I think it was two weeks before Silicon Valley Bank went under. F socks issued a report, and guess what? They said the biggest risk to the financial system was climate, really not that there was a large bank in California that was having a slow motion run on its assets, and that the it would cause another bank failure than another bank failure was climate. So as far as I can see, climate's been pretty good. They've they failed. The regulators failed. And I think that's what people are getting sick of. And it's back to my one of my favorite phrases that President Trump uses common sense, yes, like it's just common sense that they if you have a whole bunch of deposit that could leave your bank with a click, you shouldn't have all

these long term assets, but they were too busy worrying about the weather. And there was also some degree of regulatory capture. Seems hard to believe to the average citizen, the CEO of Silicon Valley Bank was on the board of the San Francisco Federal Reserve, who was his chief regulator? They're going to tell that guy what to do.

Tucker Carlson

Why is gold moving around the world in such huge quantities right now?

Scott Bessent

Wella couple of things. It's moving physically. It's moving because of potential tariffs here. So, it was unclear whether we were going to exempt gold from tariffs, which I believe we have. So there was a big move out of alts in Switzerland, out of alts in London, to get it into New York and look that there are a lot of different stores of value. Over time, Bitcoin is becoming a store of value. Gold has historically been a store of value. I think what's interesting is, where do we see the gold demand coming from? Huge amount is from China. Yes, where, as I said, they're in the middle of an economic recession, slash depression. People don't trust the Chinese currency because they have capital controls. There are 1.1 point 4 billion Chinese who won't want to get their money out, and they won't let them. They will let them buy gold.

Tucker Carlson

So that's the response you think. But it's just, do you find it interesting that even now 2025 when everything is abstract and digital, that gold is still widely believed globally to be a reliable store of value.

Scott Bessent

I think that store gold, gold has a lot of history going with it. That friend of mine's grandmother during Russia had a financial crisis in 98 then they had a big inflation, and a friend of mine's grandmother went out and bought 18 bicycles and put them in her apartment. And that was her store of value, yes.

Tucker Carlson

So how did she do on the bike investment? Great, great. I wish I did that well.

Scott Bessent

But that look gold, gold also has other applications, a lot of applications jewelry in India, but it's something that historically, people have all agreed on, and gold does not have gold can't have a fiscal problem. Gold cannot have a gigantic budget deficit. Gold cannot have the a a war. So just the fact that it is this isolated thing makes it very interesting, and the fact that the entire global trading system until Richard Nixon took us off, was tied to gold. So you're not anti gold. Oh no, no, no, I they when I had my fun. I think people might have called me a gold bug.

Tucker Carlson

How did you wind up interacting with Zelensky?

Scott Bessent

President asked me to go to, well, he actually asked me to lead the economic agreement that was part of his peace plan. And I think it's important to look at the arc of President Trump's peace plan, and he had sequenced it really well, was we're going to sign a deal with Ukrainians, and it'll do several things. One, it will make the US and Ukraine partners to link us closer together. Two, it will be a symbol to Russian leadership that the US isn't abandoning Ukraine. But importantly, three, it will show the American people that we have an economic stake and that we haven't just been doing these massive grants, which has been the history of USAID, of course. So Ukraine succeeds, we succeed,

and it could be a long term partnership. Now, President, I thought it was important to take the agreement to Kyiv and present it to President Zelensky. Everyone's telling me, oh no, have him meet you in Vienna. He's going to be at the Munich Security Conference. A few days later, I said, No, I want to go there and discuss it with him. And that's how I ended up going to Kyiv. Very interesting. Going to Kyiv flight of Poland. Then you get on, I don't know if you've been on it, get on this night train for 10 hours, and you arrive at Kyiv at 8:30 in the morning. And for anyone who they said, Oh, the President Trump selling out to the Russians. Not selling out to the Russians. The Russians bombed Kyiv four hours before I got there. They hadn't bombed since November. So the Russians didn't like the look of this deal, because it thought that the it was actually something durable for the US people and the Ukrainian people. So what happened? President Zelensky was in the mood to sign the deal that day. We had a spirited discussion, and I said to him, you've got 50 reporters out there. I am here to show that there is no daylight between the American people the Russian people, between, excuse me, Ukrainian people, between the American leadership and Ukrainian leadership. And I said, you've opened up daylight size of the Grand Canyon. What are we going to go out and tell those people? He said, Tell them I'm going to sign the deal in Munich. I said, so you're going to sign the deal when you see vice president Vance and Secretary of State Rubio in Munich? Yes, he didn't sign it there. There's a lot of back and forth. The following week, they're begging to come to the White House, and should make him sign the deal before he comes. And then he got to the Oval Office and blew up. What should have been the easiest thing to do in the world. He's supposed to show up, have a press conference. We're going to have a private lunch. If he had anything on his mind, there were going to be nine of us, nine of them in the White House dining room he could have aired his grievances in. And there's a famous photo in the East Wing ballroom of everything lay down on the table to be signed, and it never got signed.

Tucker Carlson

So this is an unelected president of a client state whose bureaucrats are being paid directly by American taxpayers, including their retirement accounts are funded by us.

Scott Bessent

and they have the lowest retirement age in Europe. It's 60 put it in contrast, France is 62 and Italy 67

Tucker Carlson

and we're paying for that. And so at a certain point, you know, you wouldn't expect a man like that in a highly precarious position. I think it's fair to say to, like, assume a high handed tone with American officials and berate them and sniff a lot and say, you know, it's basically act like a crazy person, like, Well, how do you account for that, the arrogance, what is that

Scott Bessent

look a couple of things. Is he was a performer, yes, kind of a vaudevillian, and he was an ordinary person thrown into a fraught time, rose to the occasion. Yes. Was heroic, yes. And I think is stuck, and I think under a tremendous amount of pressure. I think that some of the government officials around him and the cabinet are very good. I think some of the people around him, he's not getting the best advice that his advisors are not perfect. And I think if we go back to the agreement, I think one of the great things about the agreement is it makes sure that the money comes to the American people and the Ukrainian people. Because Tucker, let me tell you what the agreement was. It wasn't one of these rapacious Chinese deals where it's, sign over your mind, sign over your report, or it wasn't a loan to own. Here's a loan. You're never going to be able to pay it back. We're going to get this. It's a genuine economic partnership that they put in assets. We can put in loans from our overseas banks. We put in American know how, and we didn't get it. We don't make any money unless they make money. And, you know, who doesn't like that? People with their hand in the till, right, right? Because we were regulating the flow of the money. So the I think that's part of the glitch. I am hopeful that the

that it was a bug, not a feature of the system, and that that's been fixed. We're expecting a Ukraine Ukrainian technical team beginning of next week, and I'm hopeful we can get this thing signed and go back to a win, win situation, because the President Trump, I didn't give you the full arc of the deal. President Trump wanted to create the this deal with the Ukrainians, then be able to go to Russian leadership with and show them that we do stand with the Ukrainians, but they on an economic basis, and then the Russians would be incentivized to come to the table also, and so that the sequences sequencing has been thrown off, but I think we can fix it.

Tucker Carlson

Are we ever going to get an audit of where all of our billions went, where all the weapons we sent, what happened, all the cash, all the pallets of \$100 bills, like, where are they now? Why? Why is it hard to get an audit of what happened in the money?

Scott Bessent

I don't know Tucker in my life, I always try to look forward, and I think if this deal works, then that money could end up being small change. Yes, a good way to think about it. When the Iron Curtain came down, Ukraine and Poland's economies were roughly the same size. Poland is three and a half or four times larger now, yes, Poland is going to have one of the highest per capita GDPs in the world, higher than some Western European countries, for sure, Ukraine, to your point, because of various kleptocracy aspects that have been held back. Yes, so hopefully, with US assistance and President Trump engineering this peace deal, Ukrainian people can have a better future for a treasury secretary.

Tucker Carlson

You're a very capable diplomat, I must say, very diplomatic language. Last question, how do you so? Because this is also news, going back to the tariff announcement yesterday, and because it's like it really is a total departure from what all of us have grown up with and our expectations and however much you support it, it's like it's new, and people are freaked out about it. How do you keep message discipline in an administration, in any administration, and this one, specifically, how do you decide how you're going to explain this, who's going to explain it? How do you keep messages from contradicting one another. What does that process like?

Scott Bessent

We will take President Trump's lead. Yeah, we know we had a meeting yesterday morning. We had a meeting after the announcement in the Rose Garden before we went out doing media. And as you know, he's his own best spokesman. Yes, nobody can do it better. And then we fan out and we are all unified behind this and his vision. That's why we're here. If you didn't want to be part of it, shouldn't be here.

Tucker Carlson

But you ever say like, you know, maybe this is someone who can reassure potential bond buyers, investors in markets, this person scares the crap out of markets, like, let's get the guy who reassures markets.

Scott Bessent

Well, the one thing I will say that no one should listen to anyone in the markets talk about the US dollar, other than President Trump or myself. We are the only ones who speak for this administration, the United States Government on dollar policy. I didn't tell you we have a strong dollar policy, and we're putting in all of the necessary ingredients to make sure the dollar is strong over the long run. Can it go up and down on a Bloomberg terminal over the short run? Sure? Can individual bilateral moves happen between the dollar and the Mexican currency, the dollar in the yen. Sure, that's that's what I made my living going, I'm glad it doesn't. But over time, if we put in solid economic

fundamentals the and do this transformative program, then the dollar is going to do great, and the American people are going to debris.

Stephen Miller

Our leaders allowed foreign countries to rig the rules of the game, to cheat, to steal, to rob, to plunder, that has cost America trillions of dollars in wealth. These countries cannot win a trade fight with us, because they're already the ones who have cheated. So in other words, they've stolen our industries. We have all the upside here in this fight, because we can now make these industries come back, because we have the market. We have the consumers they need. Japan cannot replace the American automobile market. Europe can't replace the American automobile market.

They need us. And this is a fundamental issue of fairness and national security."

"We protect and defend all of Europe, and it costs them trillions of dollars over time. And what do they do? They run an over \$300 billion trade deficit with the United States. Why should America protect the world, send foreign aid to the world, defend the world, provide for the world, in exchange get ripped off by every other country in the world."

All right. Fox news alert here, as the selling does seem to continue in the American stock market, you've got the Dow sinking to the lows of the session as we speak right now, down 2100, points at 38,418. Okay, so let's bring in Stephen Miller. He's at the White House. He's the White House Deputy Chief of Staff. Your timing is perfect, because I'm sure there are a lot of folks out there who would like to know the White House thinking here, Stephen, please do share with us your thoughts in this moment, and especially after China announced these retaliatory tariffs, it seems like that's when the markets took another leg down here. Stephen Miller

It means taking America's wealth and shipping it to foreign

So all the factories that used to be in America are now in China, Cambodia, Thailand, Vietnam, Canada, Mexico, parts of Africa, India, Europe, Japan, Korea, you know where they're not? the United States of America. Because our leaders allowed foreign countries to rig the rules of the game, to cheat, to steal, to rob, to plunder, that has cost America trillions of dollars in wealth. These countries cannot win a trade fight with us, because they're already the ones who have cheated. So in other words, they've stolen our industries. We have all the upside here in this fight, because we can now make these industries come back, because we have the market. We have the consumers they need. Japan cannot replace the American automobile market. Europe can't replace the American automobile market. They need us. And this is a fundamental issue of fairness and national security. Tell me. Why is it that if you go to Tokyo, there's no American cars if you go to Berlin, there's no American cars, but on our streets we have every foreign car there is in the world. They've locked their markets to our cars, they have stolen from our workers and our people, and President Trump is saying that has to end. We need our wealth back and our jobs back and the quality of America, the American quality of life will rise exponentially as these policies kick in, and as the great onshoring and return of American wealth occurs.

Sandra Smith

Are you confident we can replace that production, and we can do so in a way that Americans can actually afford, and like those cars?

Stephen Miller

without question. In fact, the changes in advanced manufacturing technology, 3d printing, robotics, artificial intelligence. This makes it more and more affordable to manufacture, produce and build at scale in the United States. American workers should not have to compete with child slave wages in Vietnam. They should not have to. That is wrong. We do not need a global race to the bottom that says that American workers have to earn the same wages and work in the same conditions as the poorest workers in the third world. That's the system that we've had with the right tax policy, the right regulation policy, the right trade policy, and investing in advanced manufacturing, all of these industries and supply chains can come back home. But here's the thing, it's not a choice. It's a national security imperative. What would happen if there was a war and we didn't have the ability to manufacture our own steel, our own aluminum, our own medicine, our own automobiles, our own aircraft? What would happen to the United States of America? It is a fundamental matter of national survival.

Sandra Smith

Yeah, well, we got a glimpse of that during COVID right when people couldn't get what they needed. We learned so much of it was being made outside of the United States. And how about the food industry? This was really interesting perspective right here on America Reports last hour from a shrimper. Listen.

Craig Reave (Sea Eagle Seafood Owner)

we've been getting killed by imports for not just years, but literally decades. So we've been suffering for a long, long time, and these tariffs, we believe are going to give us some immediate relief. We've outsourced our whole industry. 94% of the shrimp consumed in the United States is imported.

Sandra Smith

Okay so he shared with us, he's optimistic that this could help his industry survive, and they've seen a decline for decades now, because all of these, you know, all the shrimps been coming in from all these other countries into the United States, low quality shrimp, he pointed out, but there's.

Stephen Miller

By the way, a lot of that, a lot of the seafood that we're importing has formaldehyde in it, is not safe for consumption, and this is this whole situation. People have to understand just how badly we've been ripped off as a country. You heard that gentleman, 94% of ship is imported to the United States, and we have the Gulf of America. The US agriculture and seafood industry has been decimated because we allow for subpar, cheap foreign imports without limit that are subsidized by foreign countries to put our farmers and our shrimpers out of business. Well, their markets are close to ours. Can someone explain to me, we protect and defend South Korea, and in exchange, they steal our automobile industry, they steal our electronics industry. We protect and defend Japan, and exchange they close their market to our cars. We protect and defend Canada, and they run up a massive trade deficit with us. We protect and defend all of Europe, and it costs them trillions of dollars over time. And what do they do? They run an over \$300 billion trade deficit with the United States. Why should America protect the world, send foreign aid to the world, defend the world, provide for the world, in exchange get ripped off by every other country in the world. What we have to show for it, the deindustrialization of the heartland, the destruction of the American Dream, the eradication of our industrial and manufacturing base that we need for national security and the crushing of the American dream. It has to stop, not to mention \$36 trillion in debt.

Sandra Smith

I've only got a few seconds left, but people are throwing around the R word, and they see the Dow down 2100 points. And people are worried about a recession. They're worried that we can't do this without sending this economy into such a deep dive that we can't come back from it. And I know you guys are all about growth. I know you're about lowering taxes, rolling back regulations, and seeing that growth. Are you concerned that this is going to put us into a recession?

Stephen Miller

The exact opposite. We inherited from Joe Biden, an economy in total free fall. There has been zero jobs growth for American workers in four years. In other words, all jobs growth had gone to foreign workers. That is a depression, not a recession. That is a depression for the American worker.

We had debt and deficits that were rising unsustainably that would lead us into a certain debt and deficit crisis. We had inflation that was in high double digits, crushing the American family, making it impossible to afford the essentials of life. We had an economy that was in a state of calamity and catastrophe. President Trump's policy of reshoring our supply chains, pushing for total expensing of capital gains, eliminating regulation, eliminating intrusive green, new scam environmental rules, pushing for the biggest, broadest tax cut in American history, and reducing taxes on American workers, including ending taxes on tips, ending taxes on overtime, ending taxes on Social Security. This economic program is the single most important program for American wealth, prosperity and rejuvenation that we've ever seen in this country.

Readout

Following brief introductions, HMA asked about how the National Crime Agency fits into the wider LE/Policing and whether there was tension between the NCA and local Police forces. You gave a full explanation about the UK LE landscape and how the

NCA fits in, being the national lead on SOC and setting the strategic direction across Policing; you also covered his concern about possible tensions.

Data Access / online activity / combating the use of data to facilitate crime was on HMA's mind. You explained the change we have seen in criminality and how it has moved 'online', particularly fraud, cybercrime and CSAE, but you also pointed out how almost all other crime has a data angle, due to phone/device usage.

You spoke in detail about the UKUSDAA ^{***}. At HMA's request, you explained the DAA and E2EE to him in detail, highlighting the difference between lawful access and content moderation, but how both were impacted by E2EE. You informed HMA about our ILO in NCMEC and how NCMEC operates - millions of reports from tech companies being triaged via NCMEC, resulting in global referrals. You informed HMA that these referrals lead to 800 arrests per month and 1000 children being safeguarded as a result. HMA was visibly shocked by the figures you quoted. You went on to explain that we estimate that between 1.3 and 1.6% of adults in the UK (approximately 800,000) pose a serious sexual risk to children and how tech companies signpost us to this material, for us to act upon, hopefully preventing contact abuse.

AP 1: You suggested HMA visited NCMEC, which he was extremely keen to do, and I agreed to arrange (**16/4 update: visit confirmed for 13/5**).

HMA enquired about your 'general' counterparts, and you spoke about the FBI, DEA, HSI & USSS. You talked about the opportunities for collaboration even with the change in priority to drugs/OIC on the SW border. You spoke about cyber and online crimes, detailing our tremendous success with the use of US sanctions tools to tackle Russian ransomware attacks. ^{***}

HMA was due to meet with META that afternoon and sought your views. You discussed how valuable they were particularly in relation to fraud and that META was the biggest contributor to NCMEC cyber tips, but you expressed concern about the impact of E2EE. ^{***}

HMA asked for any final information he should be aware of, and you briefly explained our footprint in the USA and how our Miami office also covers the Caribbean – ***

Overall, a very positive first meeting, with HMA's interest and engagement increasing as he learned more about the NCA and our mission, setting the tone for additional engagement at post.
