

**Key issues discussed at the meeting held on the 9th of June 2026.**

Judicial Pension Board Members welcomed Carrie Young, who joined the Judicial Pension Board as a new Independent Member.

The Judicial Pension Board were given updates on the progress of the transition project by the Ministry of Justice (MoJ) and Spence & Partners.

Members received an update from PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) who are providing assurance to the MoJ for the Judicial Pension Schemes (JPS) in the transition of the administration from XPS to Spence.

Members were updated on the progress of the options exercise for the McCloud Remedy Project. All judicial members in scope of the McCloud Remedy have either selected their pension scheme membership or been placed in the default position where no choice was made for the remedy period of 01<sup>st</sup> of April 2015 to 31<sup>st</sup> of March 2022. The McCloud Remedy Options Exercise has therefore now ended.

Members were updated on the progress of the current work undertaken by the Technical, Data and Contract Management Teams within the MoJ.

Members received an update from the Judicial Pensions Policy team.

Members were updated on member complaints which included trend analysis and lessons learned from upheld cases.

Members were updated on the performance of the current Pensions Administrator, XPS, and given sight of the wider work that XPS are completing for the JPS.
