HUMBLE ADDRESS: APPOINTMENT OF LORD MANDELSON AS HM AMBASSADOR TO WASHINGTON

That an Humble Address be presented to His Majesty, that he will be graciously pleased to give directions to require the Government to lay before this House all papers relating to Lord Mandelson's appointment as His Majesty's Ambassador to the United States of America, including but not confined to the Cabinet Office due diligence which was passed to Number 10, the Conflict of Interest Form Lord Mandelson provided to the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), material the FCDO and the Cabinet Office provided to UK Security Vetting about Lord Mandelson's interests in relation to Global Counsel, including his work in relation to Russia and China, and his links to Jeffrey Epstein, papers for, and minutes of, meetings relating to the decision to appoint Lord Mandelson, electronic communications between the Prime Minister's Chief of Staff and Lord Mandelson, and between ministers and Lord Mandelson, in the six months prior to his appointment, minutes of meetings between Lord Mandelson and ministers in the six months prior to his appointment, all information on Lord Mandelson provided to the Prime Minister prior to his assurance to this House on 10 September 2025 that 'full due process was followed during this appointment', electronic communications and minutes of all meetings between Lord Mandelson and ministers, Government officials and special advisers during his time as Ambassador, and the details of any payments made to Lord Mandelson on his departure as Ambassador and from the Civil Service except papers prejudicial to UK national security or international relations which shall instead be referred to the Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament.

GOVERNMENT METHODOLOGY IN COMPLYING WITH THE HUMBLE ADDRESS

Summary

1. In order to provide transparency to Parliament and the public, below is set out the process by which the Government gathered, processed and published material in relation to the Humble Address of 4 February 2026. This includes the publication of Volume I on 11 March and this publication of Volume II.
2. The scope of the motion is very broad and has required the discovery, assessment, analysis and preparation of thousands of individual documents and messages. This is a task that has involved every Government department and goes far beyond the scope of any Freedom of Information Act request or Parliamentary Question. From the beginning it was recognised that the Government's response would be more similar in scale to a public inquiry. In addition, it has been necessary for the Government to navigate the added complexity of an ongoing police investigation, which it has been consistently clear it will not prejudice in its response to the Humble Address.
3. The Government's guiding principle in responding to the Humble Address has been to comply as fully and transparently as possible with the motion and Parliament's will, as swiftly as possible. Other than the redaction of individual email addresses and contact details, the majority of redactions are those which the Government has agreed with the Intelligence and Security Committee of Parliament (ISC). The only other redactions made outside the ISC process have been where there is a clear rationale, informed by the FOI Act or other legal frameworks, and in line with the clear precedent set by previous administrations. The application of such redactions has been deliberately limited, targeted, and the subject of detailed consideration on a line-by-line basis. The reasons for redaction have been clearly marked.
4. The Government has invited and received comprehensive assurance at every stage of this process, from making the initial decisions on scope, to the minutiae of specific redactions. This includes advice from leading Counsel on the principles followed and the detailed underpinning methodology, and the Chair of the Public Administration and Constitutional Affairs Committee reviewing the information which has been withheld in order not to prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation.
5. The result is the largest ever Government response to a Humble Address. It represents thousands of hours of work from officials across the Government to deliver an unprecedented piece of Government transparency.

Commissioning

6. A disclosure exercise of this size required multiple commissions to every government department, in order that the Government could be assured that it was discharging Parliament's will. These are explained below.

7. To prepare the first volume of published material, an initial set of documents relevant to the appointment and withdrawal of Peter Mandelson was provided to the Cabinet Office Humble Address team by the Prime Minister's Office, following which the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO) was commissioned to provide further specific documents relating to Peter Mandelson's appointment and withdrawal. These documents were subject to the same series of checks as outlined below.
8. In addition, all Government departments (including the Prime Minister's Office) received an instruction to retain all potentially relevant information shortly after the Humble Address motion was passed, to ensure that nothing in scope of the motion would be lost before departments were formally commissioned.
9. On 23 February, the the Senior Responsible Officer (SRO - the Permanent Secretary to the Cabinet Office) commissioned all departments to search for and return all electronic communications and minutes of meetings in scope of the Humble Address, in order to return information mainly within scope of the limbs of the motion concerned with messages and meetings during Peter Mandelson's tenure as Ambassador and the six preceding months. This focused on obtaining electronic communications directly between Peter Mandelson and Ministers, Pay Band 3/4 Special Advisers, Permanent Secretaries and Directors General, and minutes of meetings between those same individuals, where they were the principal attendees, rather than where they were one member among wider cast lists (for example not including formal committee meetings such as COBR or the NSC). This did not include wider groups or distribution lists, therefore excluding FCDO Diplomatic Telegrams, regional updates, thematic notes and briefing materials, press lines, corporate updates and newsletters.
10. In addition to this request, a further specific commission was made to the FCDO on 24 February, in order to target information in scope of the limbs of the motion most relevant to the FCDO. This included information relating to Peter Mandelson's withdrawal and severance.
11. Departments were asked to provide assurance on their returns on 6 March, in order that the central Humble Address team could be sure that all relevant information had been collected and to understand where further commissions may be required.
12. Departments were asked to undertake a search for any further non-corporate communications on 13 March, given the significant interest in this limb of the motion. This commission specified that all relevant non-corporate communications, except where they were purely personal in nature (for example relating to family matters or medical information), were required to be shared with the Cabinet Office. This included group messages.
13. A commission was sent to departments on 27 March which provided a further opportunity to share any additional material that departments believed should be considered in scope of the Humble Address motion. The commission also requested confirmation from departments that their initial return had captured all minutes of

meetings in scope. Such confirmation would be taken to mean that departments had cross-referred to specific individuals' calendars as well as their inboxes.

14. There were two specific commissions to relevant departments to check that all material relating to Peter Mandelson's National Security Vetting had been returned, on 21 April and 8 May.
15. Departmental Permanent Secretaries were responsible for assuring the Cabinet Office that they had taken reasonable steps to comply with the commissions and provide all relevant information. Departments were responsible for contacting all relevant current and former Ministers, Special Advisers and officials in their departments in scope of the request. Throughout the process there was an ongoing dialogue between the central team and departments, with specific sessions held with relevant private office officials to answer any questions.
16. Where individuals in scope had subsequently left the Government, the department which last employed them was responsible for contacting them and assuring their return. Where Ministers had occupied other Ministerial posts in the period between the six months prior to Peter Mandelson's appointment as HMA Washington and the date of the Humble Address motion, the Minister's current department was responsible for contacting the departments where that Minister had previously served.
17. The Cabinet Office Humble Address team used a secure portal to process returns from departments. These returns were instructed to be unredacted and undoctored.

Scope of searches

18. In order that the Government could respond swiftly and transparently to discharge the spirit and letter of the Humble Address, search parameters were included based on the limbs of the Humble Address motion. These were as follows:
 - a. Individuals in scope of the limbs of the motion seeking direct correspondence with Peter Mandelson (via email and other electronic messages) were specified as all Ministers, Pay Band 3/4 Special Advisers, Permanent Secretaries and Directors General. This was on the basis that these were the individuals most likely to have come into contact with Peter Mandelson.
 - b. These individuals were instructed to search their work devices and personal devices for any relevant information.
 - c. Minutes of meetings between those same individuals and Peter Mandelson where they were the principal attendees were requested, not where they were one member among wider cast lists (for example not including formal committee meetings such as the National Security Council).
 - d. Electronic messages involving Peter Mandelson that were exchanged as part of a group were requested, as well as those directly between an in-scope individual and Peter Mandelson.
19. While commissions to departments did not specifically request invitations to meetings or schedulers from individuals' calendars, where these have been provided to the

Cabinet Office Humble Address team and where relevant, they have been included in the publication.

20. Some material has been included in the publication where it does not meet the above criteria but includes content relevant to areas where Parliament has expressed a significant interest, such as Peter Mandelson's campaign to become Chancellor of Oxford University. Material of a party political nature is included in the publication, contrary to usual practice and precedent for information 'held' by the Government, in order to demonstrate the maximum possible transparency.
21. Some information was deemed out of scope via the commissioning process so as to keep the returns focused on the most relevant information:
 - a. Obvious ephemera - for example press cuttings, out of office replies, FCDO internal corporate messaging.
 - b. Anything which was clearly related to the corporate management of British Embassy Washington (e.g. FCDO personnel decisions and discussions, individual performance reporting, embassy staffing and management plans, estate issues).
 - c. Routine Embassy business (such as consular work and copylists containing FCDO Diplomatic Telegrams, regional updates, thematic notes and briefing materials, press lines, corporate updates and newsletters).
 - d. Purely personal information that would not usually be considered 'held' by the Government (for example relating to family matters or medical information).
22. On 31 March the SRO wrote to Peter Mandelson - via his solicitors - to request any information held on his personal phone. Peter Mandelson declined to comply with this request. The Government has no further recourse to search the personal devices of Peter Mandelson.

Cabinet Office assessment

23. All documents submitted to the Cabinet Office underwent a series of checks including:
 - An assessment to determine whether the material submitted was in scope of the Humble Address motion.
 - A first stage assessment to determine whether material contained information which may prejudice UK national security or international relations. Where so, it was subject to a further process as outlined below.
 - A team of Civil Service reviewers conducted checks to examine whether the documents contained: junior officials' names; legally privileged information; third party information; commercially sensitive information; or, personal data (e.g. phone numbers or email addresses). Such material was flagged for potential redaction ahead of final publication.
 - A review team of senior officials, overseen by the SRO, has made the final

decisions on scope, commissioning, and fine judgements on specific principles and documents.

24. As the Government has consistently set out, documents have been withheld from publication if they could potentially prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation. As set out below, these are intended to be published at a later date.

National security and international relations

25. The motion required that any papers prejudicial to national security or international relations would be referred to the ISC. Consequently, a subset of the material above was subject to an additional process to comply with that aspect.
26. Although the ISC was operating under the authority of the Humble Address in fulfilling this task (as opposed to its normal statutory remit), the process largely followed the usual process for requesting and agreeing national security redactions (although in this case, the ISC was also agreeing to international relations redactions as well as those relating to national security). Departments were asked to indicate where their searches identified material that would be prejudicial to either national security or international relations (or both). Departments then prepared pro formas that specified the text which required redaction, and the rationale for requesting that redaction. The pro formas, alongside the unredacted documents, were submitted to the ISC to seek their approval. In undertaking this process departments were supported by the National Security Secretariat for national security material, and the FCDO for international relations material. Over 300 documents were submitted to the ISC to seek their approval for the Government's proposed redactions.
27. Following the initial process, the Government and the ISC were in agreement on a number of the redaction decisions. The remaining documents were subject to a contested redactions process with a hearing held between senior officials and the ISC. This hearing led to the successful resolution of redactions relating to all of the remaining documents.
28. The ISC's statement of 15 May makes clear that it has considered all redactions proposed in the documents referred to the Committee, in order not to prejudice UK national security or international relations. The decisions determined by the Committee were final following the contested redaction hearing on 14 May. The Government is extremely grateful to the Committee for their work.

Preparation for publication

29. Following these processes, the Cabinet Office Humble Address team prepared the documents for publication. The documents include a mixture of emails, submissions, hard-copy files, and electronic messages such as WhatsApps, some of which required formatting choices to be applied for intelligibility.
30. WhatsApp and other instant messages were transcribed in a standard format to ensure intelligibility. Where material such as WhatsApp messages was submitted to the Humble Address team with incomplete details (for instance regarding dates), the

Cabinet Office Humble Address team followed up with departments to request the remaining material. Material has been published with the maximum amount of available information, and some messages which are not strictly in scope of the motion have been included in order to provide context, where such context was necessary, or where they respond to particular areas of interest from Parliament.

31. Documents have been de-classified to enable publication. Where documents show a classification marking, this no longer applies.
32. The publication is structured according to each limb of the motion. Within this, documents are ordered chronologically.

Redactions

33. It is a longstanding practice across successive administrations that, when the Government responds to a Humble Address motion, it has a responsibility to consider whether it is in the public interest to place certain information into the public domain. In line with practice across successive administrations, this is done using the principles of the Freedom of Information Act, and in line with the Ministerial Code and the resolutions on ministerial accountability, passed by both Houses in 1997 which state that "*ministers should be as open as possible with Parliament, refusing to provide information only when disclosure would not be in the public interest, which should be decided in accordance with relevant statute.*"
34. As set out above, the Government's overriding priority in responding to the Humble Address has been to respond fully, transparently and swiftly in order to meet the will of the House. Clearly, the scale of the Humble Address disclosure goes far beyond any usual Freedom of Information Act or other transparency request. However, the principles the Freedom of Information Act sets out have been used by previous administrations when responding to such motions - for example when responding to Humble Addresses relating to Radox and the Westferry Printworks. That means that, outside the process for managing papers prejudicial to UK national security or international relations, a number of targeted, specific redactions have been made in order to prevent real-world harms.
35. Specifically, these targeted redactions are in order to protect:
 - a. Individuals' email addresses and phone numbers;
 - b. The identities of junior civil servants;
 - c. Third party data - including the personal or commercially sensitive data of third parties not relevant to the motion; and
 - d. Legal professional privilege.
36. A small amount of Peter Mandelson's personal data has also been redacted: his signature and the location of his home.
37. In the interests of transparency, third party individuals who are considered to be public figures have been named. Third parties who have a reasonable expectation of privacy, because they are not public figures, have not been named. No references to current or former UK politicians have been redacted on the basis of their being third

parties. Publication of the names of political figures from countries other than the USA has been limited to world leaders.

38. There has been particular public interest in information involving Global Counsel and Palantir. No redactions have been made to references to Global Counsel, other than to protect the privacy of individuals who are not public figures - their connection to Global Counsel has been made clear in those emails. References to Palantir and Anduril have only been redacted in cases where the redaction has been agreed with the ISC, i.e. on the grounds of being information that is prejudicial to UK national security or international relations.
39. Some company names other than Global Counsel and Palantir have been redacted where this is not relevant to the motion. The Government does not consider it to be in the interests of the taxpayer to damage the Government's relationship with companies, to damage ongoing Government commercial negotiations, or to potentially damage those companies' commercial prospects, if they are not relevant to the motion.
40. Where material that has been submitted to the Cabinet Office Humble Address team is already in the public domain, no redactions have been applied to that material.
41. The redaction process has been overseen by the Cabinet Office and, where relevant, in conjunction with the ISC. No Government Minister or Special Adviser has determined any of the redactions.
42. The following labels have been used for redactions in Volume II:
 - a. Redactions made with the agreement of the ISC have been labelled with asterisks '(***)
 - b. All email addresses and phone numbers have been redacted with the label 'PERSONAL'
 - c. A small amount of personal data contained in the body of documents has also been redacted with the label 'PERSONAL'
 - d. All junior civil servants' names have been redacted with the label 'JCS'
 - e. Third party material not relevant to the motion and relating to individuals who are not public figures have been redacted with the label 'THIRD PARTY'
 - f. Information relating to companies, where disclosure of the information would be commercially damaging, has been redacted with the label 'THIRD PARTY'
 - g. Material attracting legal professional privilege has been redacted with the label 'LPP'

Independent assurance

- 44. The Government has taken several measures to ensure independent, external assurance of the process it has followed.
- 45. The Senior Responsible Owner has taken advice from leading Counsel, senior Government lawyers, and other Government experts throughout this process.
- 46. As confirmed by Ministers to Parliament, the Chair of the Public Administration and Constitutional Affairs Committee, Simon Hoare MP, has reviewed information that has been withheld from publication on the basis of not wishing to prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation, in order to provide as much transparency to Parliament as possible, albeit in a closed setting.
- 47. Finally, the Cabinet Office Humble Address team has taken advice from an independent Kings Counsel - including reviewing the methodological approach followed by officials - and acted on that to inform their approach. This has helped ensure that the Government is confident that its approach is compliant with the Humble Address and the Government's legal obligations.

Police process and third publication

- 48. The Government has now discharged its duties under the Humble Address when it comes to identifying relevant material within scope of the motion and preparing it for publication. With the exception of the material being withheld in order not to prejudice the ongoing Metropolitan Police Service investigation, all these documents have now been published in either Volume I or II. There will be a final publication by the Government at the conclusion of the Metropolitan Police Service investigation, or before, if the Metropolitan Police Service confirms that doing so will not prejudice their investigation.

That call is being set up with Mungo and I. We'll also take the opportunity to get further ^{Third Party} which may be helpful to our wider engagement with US administration.

- President Trump sat down with ABC News anchor Terry Moran for an exclusive interview on the 100th day of his second term.
- The interview was combative at times, covering tariffs, immigration and deportations.
- The UK was not mentioned.
- Asked whether the US would cut off military aid if there is no Ukraine peace deal, **President Trump responded:** *"I don't want to tell you that. I'm not going to tell you whether or not. I want to leave that as a big fat secret, because I don't want to ruin a negotiation, but I do worry. I will tell you I was not happy when I saw Putin shooting missiles into a few towns and cities, and that was not something that I like seeing, and I thought it was inappropriate."*
- The President concluded the interview describing ABC as one of 'the worst for fake news'.

Please find the rough transcript below:

Terry Moran

We begin tonight with a look inside the Oval Office, Donald Trump has transformed.

President Trump

This is the Oval Office. This is the resolute desk, which is really something very spectacular. There's nothing quite like it and it they give you a choice of about seven different desks, but this is the one I chose. Ronald Reagan had it. FDR had it. Few people had it, but I found it to be the most beautiful. It is amazing. This is an amazing space and amazing, maybe architecturally wonderful, but amazing for what it represents. It represents the US, and if properly used, a lot of good things could happen.

Terry Moran

What does this say about how you feel about the country and the office?

President Trump

Well, I think it says I love the country. I mean, I'm putting pictures of presidents up that have never been up, pictures that were largely used in many cases. You know, great men, in this case, men, but great men of great achievement. I'm a very detailed person. I'm a very clean person. I like cleanliness. I like to see this space be treated properly. I've added a lot to the space in terms of beautification, in terms of modernization. That's a gallery of President. It really is. It really is so and it's an honor to have you people with us.

Terry Moran

Mr. President, thank you for doing this. Thank you very much. Here in the Oval Office, it's its special 100 days into your second term. So what's the one thing, just one thing that you think is the most significant thing you've done so far in these 100 days?

President Trump

Well, I think maybe the border is the most significant, because our country was really going bad. They were allowing people to come in from prisons, as you know, and you've heard me say it, but you've heard a lot of people say it, prisons, mental institutions, gang members, murderers. We had many murders, 11,888 they think some murdered more than one person. So you had murderers coming in, you had everybody coming in, and not just South America, from all over the world. They were emptying their prisons into our country, and now it's totally closed down. We've seen just yesterday they announced 99.9% nobody thought that could happen. And it happened quickly, very quickly, and I think that's very significant, but we're doing other things that are very significant. Results will take a little bit longer, because it's one of those. You know, it's complicated. Many years of trading abuse. We've been abused by other countries for years and years. They laughed at us. They thought we were stupid people, and we're fixing it, and I think that's going to be very, very important, but I have a lot of ground to cover. Yeah, I would really say that the border is so important.

Terry Moran

We'll get there. Immigration huge, and we're going to get there. But I want to start sure with the economy the number one issue for so many people, just about everybody. It's one of the main reasons that you're back in this office and now we have this trade war with China that that Moody's and other analysts say is going to cost American families 1000s of more dollars per year. And there is a lot of concern out there. People are worried, and some people who voted for you saying, I didn't sign up for this. So how do you answer those concerns?

President Trump

Well, they did sign up for it, actually, and this is what I campaigned on. I said that we've been abused by other countries at levels that nobody's ever seen before. We were losing three to \$5 billion a day on trade. We were losing a trillion and a half to \$2 trillion a year, not sustainable. They were taken advantage of us like they've never I could have left it that way, and at some point there would have been an implosion like nobody's ever seen. But I said, No, we have to fix it. I've wanted to do this for many years. You know, I had the best economy during my first time, we had a tremendous economy, tremendous success, and we did tremendous numbers of tariffs on we took in a lot of money from tariffs, China, in particular, hundreds of billions of dollars in tariffs. We had no inflation. As you know, we had an incredible economy, given credit for a great economy. But I said, we have to fix this. Otherwise, it's just not self sustaining.

Terry Moran

One of the things you ran on was you said you bring prices down on day one, and that and it would happen fast, and that it would happen fast, I have many, most economists, will tell you that tariffs will raise prices. Don't your tariffs cut against that promise you made to bring prices down?

President Trump

No, because I had massive tariffs on China, if you remember, in my first term, and we had essentially no inflation, like around 1% inflation, which is like a perfect number the and then when Biden took over, it went through the roof to the probably the worst inflation we've ever had. I mean, we had an inflation nightmare. Now, if you look at what's happening now, we're only there for 100 days, as you say, and in 100 days we took over that we had bad inflation for four years, for two years of especially two years of his, his administration, I would say record setting like we've never seen. They say 48 years. The worst in 48 years. I say it was much worse than that, right? So, so now, if you look at what's happened, energy is down. Gasoline hit \$1.98 in a few states during the last couple of days. It was \$3.50 and \$4 and \$4.50 but gasoline is way down. When I took over, you remember the big thing with eggs? They hit me the first week, eggs, eggs, eggs, like it was my fault. I said I didn't cause this problem. This problem was caused by Biden. What's the problem with eggs? And they said they've doubled. Well, eggs are down 87% since I got involved, a lot of that. And by the way, and there were plenty of eggs for Easter, which we just went through, there were plenty of eggs for Easter. They were saying you won't have enough eggs for Easter. We ended our sec, my secretary did a fantastic job on eggs. Groceries are down. Everything's down. Interest rates are the same. Interest rates should be down, but we have the Federal Reserve that wants to be stubborn.

Terry Moran

We'll get to that. You said something a couple weeks ago that struck me. You said, concerning the tariffs, which economists say are going to raise prices, you said, quote, hang tough. It won't be easy.

President Trump

I've said that during my campaign. We won all seven swing states. We won the popular vote by a lot. You know, we had a tremendous campaign. I said all these things during my campaign. I said, you're going to have a transition period. We've been ripped off by every country all over the world. They're laughing at us. They thought we were stupid people, and we were and I said, that's not going to happen when the hard times, hard times are ahead. I don't think so. I think tight times are ahead. Look, since I came in, gasoline is down, groceries are down, egg prices are down. Many things are down, just about everything, you know, you don't have the drop in and fuel and energy and oil like we did. I took it from maybe \$3.20 maybe more than that, down into a low of much lower number. When you have that kind of a drop, you're not gonna have inflation, not now, but it's the tariffs, right? We still have 145% tariffs on China.

Terry Moran

You know any business you want to ask, will say that 145% tariffs on China, and that is basically an embargo. They deserve it. It'll raise prices on electronics to clothing to building housing.

President Trump

You don't know that. You don't know whether or not China's mathematics. China probably will eat those tariffs. But at 145 they basically can't do much business with the United States. And they were making from us a trillion dollars a year. They were ripping us off like nobody's ever ripped us off. And by the way, we have other countries that were just as bad. If you look at the European Union, was terrible. What they've done to us, every country, almost every country in the world, was ripping us off. They're not doing that anymore. I want you to think about the boom that this country has had in small businesses, mom and pop, Etsy stores, small businesses because of inflation. Well, inflationary boom. The people were wiped out with inflation. I mean, you read the news, you do the business now. Now a lot of them built those businesses on the trading model, yeah, and they can make more money. They source their products overseas, and now they're looking at an extinction. There's disaster for it.

I've been here for three months. I've taken a trade deficit down to a number that's very, very starting to get really good. I only just got here. We had a country that it was not sustainable. What Biden did to this country between the open borders, where criminals poured into our country, between every country in the world ripping us off on trade, it was not sustainable.

Terry Moran

So your message to those small businesses who are saying we can't live a month, two months with these tariffs, Apple got a big deal. Is there something for them?

President Trump

No, not only Apple, we've got seven to \$8 trillion being invested in our country in two months. Biden didn't have that over a year. I mean, if you look at Biden, nobody was really investing in this country. Everybody was ripping off our country. Apple is putting up \$500 billion but that's only one of many companies, companies are flooding into our country right now.

Terry Moran

So your answer to the concern about the tariffs is everything's going to be hunky dory. Everything's going to be just fine.

President Trump

It wouldn't have been if I didn't do this. I had a choice. I could leave it to have a nice, easy time, but I think ultimately you would have had an implosion. Our country had inflation that was worse than they've ever had it before. You don't mention that, why don't you mention that we had the worst inflation, probably in the history of our country. People say 48 years, probably in the history of our country, we had the worst inflation, and people were dying over the inflation. You know that now, the grocery prices are coming down, the energy prices are coming down, gasoline is coming down. It's all heading in the right direction.

Terry Moran

Okay, let's move on to immigration. And as you said, it is an undeniable fact that illegal crossings at the southern border have plummeted, a staggering decline. But there are questions about your methods, and so I want to ask my message methods, about your methods, how you're accomplishing the work. Do you acknowledge that under our law, every single person who gets deported gets a hearing first to make the case?

President Trump

Well, are we talking about people that are citizens of our country or not? No, you're deporting citizens at this point. Well, let me ask you, did they get hearings when? By when Biden allowed 21 million? Because I think the numbers 21 20 million people to flow into our country, you had 21 million people that came into our country through a stupid, open border, and there were prisoners, and they were people that you don't want in many cases in our country, right? They came from all over the world. They came from the Congo. They came from south they came from all over the world. We're talking about some of the roughest countries in the world. They had, they had here, including terrorists, by the way, now, but can we give them a hearing when they came in?

Terry Moran

Well, the law requires that every single person who is going to be deported gets a hearing first.

President Trump

I'll have to ask the lawyers about that. All I can say is this, if you're going to have 21 million people, and we have to get a lot of them out because they're criminals. We're going to have to act fast. We can't. Do you think we can give 21 million trials? Let's say each trial takes two weeks. Is that what you want us to know? The laws? The law doesn't sound about trials. No, not trials, hearings. These people came in. They're not citizens. They came in illegally. They came into a country illegally. We have to get them out. There's a legal process. I can't Sure, and we follow the legal process. I can't I can't have a trial, a major trial, every person that came in illegally. We have 1000s of murderers that came in. They're going to murder people. They already have murdered people. In our country, we have to get them out there.

We have to get them out fast, really bad guys. But in our country, even bad guys get due process, right? If people come into our country illegally, there's a different standard. These are illegal, they came in illegal. They get due process. Well, they get a process where we have to get them out.

Terry Moran

Yeah, okay, let's talk about the Venezuelans. They get whatever my lawyers say, right, all right. Let's talk about the Venezuelans. You deported more than 200 Venezuelans to that prison in El Salvador. You say they're they're violent, they're gang members, they're terrorists. Many of them don't have a criminal record at all.

President Trump

I'm not so sure about that. If you take a look, I want to read you some. Excuse me. When you look at those, those people, they were violent people, they were violent, but many of them don't have criminal recognized based on their lawyer. What their lawyers have said,

Terry Moran

Okay, Joe Rogan, said this. Joe Rogan, one of the leading podcasters, Trump supporter, about the deportation of Venezuelans. He said, quote, rounding up gang members and shipping them to El Salvador with no due process. He said it was dangerous. And added, quote, we got to be careful that we don't become monsters while we're fighting monsters.

President Trump

Joe Rogan, right? Oh, I agree with that 100% Yeah, we want to be careful, and we are careful. We're doing something that has to be done. We have a country that's very sick. Joe Biden, and it's not him, because I don't even think he knew what the hell was happening. But the people around him are vicious people, and what they've done to the country is unbelievable. They've allowed 21 million people to pour into our country. Many of these people are criminals. They've allowed the you mentioned, Venezuela, the jails of Venezuela, to be emptied into the United States. Do you know Venezuela crime is way down, way way down. You know why? Because they're criminals. Are now living happily in the United States of America, and we're getting them out, and I was elected to get them out, and we're getting under the law, and I'm getting them out fast, and we're getting them out illegally. Now, in some cases, we have judges. In some cases, they're radical left judges. What happened the other day where a judge was protecting a criminal was horrible, and I think she's got big problems, a couple of them, like they want to talk about one way we have to be treated fairly by judges, and we're not being treated fairly by all judges.

Terry Moran

So you're saying that you don't like some of the rulings?

President Trump

Well, I think the rulings will be overturned.

Terry Moran

Yeah, I only asked about one man in one court order, kilmar Abrego Garcia. He's the Salvadoran man who crossed into this country illegally, but who is under a protective order that he not be sent back to El Salvador. Your government sent him back to El Salvador and acknowledged in court that was a mistake, and now the Supreme Court has upheld an order that you must return him to the facilitate his return to the United States. What are you doing to comply?

President Trump

Well, the lawyer that said it was a mistake. He was here a long time, was not appointed by us. Should not have said that. Should not have said that. And the person that you're talking about, you know you're making this person said, this is a MS 13 gang member, a tough cookie, been in lots of skirmishes, beat the hell out of his wife, and the wife was petrified to even talk about him. Okay, this is not an innocent, wonderful gentleman from saying he's a good guy. It's about the rule of law. The order from the Supreme Court stands into our country illegally. You could get him back. There's a phone on this desk. I could, you could pick it up and I all the power the presidency. You could call up the president of El Salvador and say, send him back.

But now,
and if he were the gentleman that you say he is, I would do that, but the court to facilitate that. I'm not the one making this decision. We have lawyers. I don't want to do this, but the buck stops. Follow the law. You want me to follow the law? If I were the president that just wanted to do anything, I probably keep him says what the law is. Listen, I was elected to take care of a problem that was it was a unforced error that was made by a very incompetent man, a man that turned out to be incompetent that you always said was wonderful, great genius, right? And now you find out all of the media now, they're saying, What a mistake they made. A man who was grossly incompetent allowed us to have open borders where millions of people flowed in. I campaigned on that issue. I wouldn't say it was my number one issue, but it was pretty close. I campaigned in that issue. I've done an amazing job. I have closed borders. He said you couldn't do it. You wouldn't be able to do it. It would never happen. Well, it happened, and it happened very quickly. Wait a minute, when we have criminals, murderers, criminals in this country, we have to get them out, and we're doing it. And you'll pick out one man, but even the man that you picked out, he's got a piece said he wasn't a member of a gang. And then they looked and on his knuckles, he had MS, there's, there's a display.

Terry Moran

Wait a minute. He had MS, 13. He had some tattoos that are interpreted that way, but let's move on. That was Photoshop.

President Trump

Terry, hey, they're giving you the big break of a lifetime. You know you're doing the interview. I picked you because, frankly, I never heard of you, but that's okay when I picked you. Terry, but you're not being very nice. He had MS 13 tattoo.

Terry Moran

Agree to disagree. I'll carry on to something.

President Trump

Terry, do you want me to show you the picture I saw the picture. Here we go. Don't Photoshop it. Look at his hand. Here.

Terry Moran

I'm not an expert on them. I want to turn to Ukraine.

President Trump

No, no. He had M S as clear as you can be not interpreted. This is why people no longer believe well, the news, because in El Salvador, they aren't there, but let's just go they aren't there when he's there. Now, right? No. Terry.

Terry Moran

Ukraine, sir,

President Trump

He's got MS 13 on his knuckles.

Terry Moran

Okay, we'll take a look. We'll take a look.

Terry Moran

I want to turn to Rome, and to that moving image of you and President Zelensky sitting in St Peter's Basilica, talking to peace. It went around the world. Take us into that moment.

President Trump

Well, look the Ukraine is a very serious, very tough situation, and this is Biden's war. This is not my war, but I want to see if I can solve it, because probably close to 5000 young soldiers a week are being killed, Russian and Ukrainian. We also spend a tremendous amount of money in

Ukraine and Europe. Should be spending much more than us, than odds are spending much less. It's been badly handled by the Biden administration. It's been badly handled all the way around, all the way around that moment, the moment was a moment of solace, in a sense, because tremendous numbers of people are dying. A lot of his people are dying. They're being killed. And I feel very badly about it. I feel very badly about that's a war that would have never happened if I were president, and it didn't happen for four years. It was never even a thought of it happening.

Terry Moran

It does feel like something's happening after that meeting with Zelensky in St Peter's. You posted this on social media. There was no reason for Putin to be shooting missiles into civilian areas and cities and towns over the last few days.

President Trump

It makes me think that, well, that was part of my post, but you're right. That was, that was a part of a post, and it says, it makes me think that maybe he doesn't want to stop the war. He's just tapping me along. Yeah, that's possible. He might be, he could be tapping me along a little bit. I would say that he would like to stop the war. I think that if it weren't for me, I think he'd want to take over the whole country. Personally, I always felt so when I left, there wasn't even a chance that this would happen when Biden got involved. I won't say whether or not he handled it properly. But obviously it wasn't good, because the war started. Putin went in. The war started. I believe that Putin wanted to get all of Ukraine once he went in. And I think part of the reason he went and he saw what happened in Afghanistan, how incompetent, how incompetently Millie and all these guys handled that. It was one of the greatest embarrassments of our lifetimes, but maybe in the history of our country. Okay, so Putin went in. I think Putin wanted all of Ukraine. I think if I didn't win the election, he would have gotten all of Ukraine. I think he would have taken all of Ukraine. I think his first choice never with me. He would have never gone in with this group of losers. He went in, he saw what happened in Afghanistan. He said, Well, this is my chance, because it was always the apple of his eye. I talked to him, Ukraine was the apple of his eye. I think he wanted the whole country. You said me, I do believe that he's willing to stop the fighting.

Terry Moran

Do you think Vladimir Putin wants peace?

President Trump

I think he does. Yes. I think, yes. His dream was to take over the whole country. I think because of me, he's not going to do that.

Terry Moran

Do you trust him?

President Trump

I don't trust you. I don't trust a lot of people. I don't trust you. Look at you. You come in all shooting for Bear. You're so happy to do the interview, and you start hitting me with fake questions. You start telling me that a guy whose hand is covered the tattoo doesn't have the tattoo. You know? I mean, you're being dishonest. No, not, let me not sue. I trust I don't trust a lot of people, but I do think this. I think that he, let's say he respects me, and I believe because of me, he's not going to take over the whole but his decision, his choice, would be to take over all of Ukraine. It's a war that never should have happened. It did happen because of incompetent people.

Terry Moran

If there is no peace deal, will the US cut off military aid?

President Trump

I don't want to tell you that. I'm not going to tell you whether or not. I want to leave that as a big fat secret, because I don't want to ruin a negotiation, but I do worry. I will tell you I was not

happy when I saw Putin shooting missiles into a few towns and cities, and that was not something that I like seeing, and I thought it was inappropriate. But I think the whole war is inappropriate, again, it's a war that shouldn't have happened. This war is a war that if the election weren't rigged, and it was totally rigged, the 2020 election, if it weren't rigged, you wouldn't have that. You wouldn't have had the embarrassment of Afghanistan. You wouldn't have October 7 with Israel. You wouldn't have any of the problems. Wouldn't have had inflation either.

Terry Moran

All right, I want to ask one question about Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth. There's a lot of turmoil at the at the Pentagon right now. There's the signal chat with his wife on it, where he's discussing that attack in Yemen. There's another signal chat discussing the attack on Yemen. There's a reporter accidentally involved. You said the other day that you had a talk with the secretary. Did you take him to the woodshed?

President Trump

had a talk with him. And whatever I said, I probably wouldn't be inclined to tell you, but we had a good talk. He's a talented guy. He's young, smart, highly educated, and I think he's going to be a very good defense hopefully, a great defense secretary, but he'll be very good defense secretary.

Terry Moran

You have 100% confidence in him?

President Trump

I don't have 100% confidence in anything, okay, anything do I have 100% it's a stupid question. Look, it's pretty important. No, you don't have 100% only a liar would say I have 100% confidence. I don't have 100% confidence we're gonna finish this interview.

Terry Moran

Elon Musk and Doge. Everyone knows that there's wasteful government spending. It's really important, but the cuts have had some serious consequences. There have been cuts to foreign aid programs that save lives and keep people alive overseas. There's been research at the National Institutes of Health on cancer, on Alzheimer's that has had to be stopped. And the question, I think people have is, did Doge go too far, too fast, too reckless.

President Trump

No, I think those just been, look saved \$150 billion billion we saved. That's a lot of money. There's also a lot of things right now under investigation, which is going to increase that amount by a lot. And that's a tremendous amount of money. There are some things where, when I heard about them, I put them back. As you know, there are things that I'm considering right now putting back, but overall, we've saved hundreds of billions of dollars.

Terry Moran

The original promise was 2 trillion, went to 1 trillion, not 250 million. And how do you know what it's going to be?

President Trump

Because we have things that are very at a very high level that are being looked at right now. We also found tremendous waste, fraud and abuse. As you know, we found a lot of fraud. There was a lot of fraud. Fraudulent things were taking place, and we ended that, and those people are going to be suffering.

Terry Moran

Just a legal note, fraud is a crime. There have been no referrals to the Justice Department.

President Trump

Well, you don't know that. Do you how do you know that?

Terry Moran

Have there been referrals to that? Are there?

President Trump

How would you know that that there were no referrals?

Terry Moran

There's been no investigation from it. I'm asking you, sir.

President Trump

You're not asking me, you made a statement.

Terry Moran

You know. Now I'm asking you, have there been?

President Trump

Yes, they have.

Terry Moran

One of the biggest achievements of your first term, that is operation warp speed. You got that COVID vaccine up and going and distributed. A lot of people took it, and a lot of people that feel their lives have been saved by it. Now we have this measles outbreak, biggest in a decade in Texas, and it's because people aren't getting their children vaccinated. Do you recommend to parents that they get their children vaccinated from well?

President Trump

I recommend the governors to make the decisions. You have a very talented governor of Texas, and he's making decisions, and those decisions are going to be made rapidly. This is a very much different thing than COVID in terms of rapidity and speed and other things. Measles have been with us a long time, and I'm not saying good, bad or indifferent. I'm just saying that the governors are making the decision. It's a Federalist decision.

Terry Moran

The President is our leader in so many ways, and your voice counts so much, and you can't tell moms and dads it's a good thing to get on these.

President Trump

Do I recommend it? Yes, I do. Okay, no, I do recommend it. Yes. Do you think you and I have recommended?

Terry Moran

Do you think the Secretary of Health and Human Services, Robert F Kennedy, Jr, who has a history of at the very least, vaccine skepticism? Do you think Kennedy recommends the measles?

President Trump

He did. He recommended it. Yeah, he did. He was satisfied with his Yeah. I mean, he sponsored, recommended that they go out and get the vaccine.

Terry Moran

You've revoked a lot of people's security clearances. I guess the question out of that is the concern that people have, are you using your powers as President to get personal revenge?

President Trump

No, I'll tell you what. I tell you what you should not you're really not asking, and you should be asking. There has never been a president in this country, in the history that was persecuted like I was persecuted by really crooked people, dishonest, horrible people, and it's been proven. So when you say, I'm treating people rough, I'm not treating people rough. I was treated worse than any president in the history of our country. And you know, people figured, well, maybe that's it. Finally we got, you know, he's leaving town. There goes the helicopter, and then I came back. And I came back because I have tremendous support. You know, when you win an election like I wanted, and you will admit, I won all seven swing states, I won the popular vote. I won 700 let's say 2750 districts, compared to 500 districts. That's why the map is all red, and those people feel that I was treated unfairly. But does that give you the right to go after your political opponents with the powers I'm going after all I'm doing? Hey, Biden did something to me, and I did something to Biden. And you know why I did it? Because he's grossly incompetent. That's not a man that should be allowed to, you know, be looking at things that are very confidential. But what about because there's in 71 here's a man that used an auto pen to sign very important documents. Now, who really is just, do you think he knew what that they were using an auto pen? Today President Trump announced the first major shake-up of senior personnel in his administration. Following media reports, Trump confirmed in a Truth Social post this afternoon that Mike Waltz will step down as National Security Advisor (NSA), announcing that he will nominate Waltz to be the next US Ambassador to the UN (that post, previously tapped for Rep Elise Stefanik until Trump withdrew her nomination last month, will require Senate confirmation). Trump confirmed that Secretary of State Marco Rubio would serve as NSA on an interim basis. He will be the first person to hold the roles concurrently since Henry Kissinger. Media has reported that Trump also plans to oust Deputy NSA Alex Wong, but this is yet to be formally announced.

The search for Waltz's permanent successor has begun.

We will report more fully with more details in due course.

I hope all's well.

I wanted to drop you a line following President Trump's comments regarding his intention to introduce 100% tariffs on films produced outside the US. As you'll be all too aware, any such move would have major negative consequences for the UK film & HETV sector given the very high proportion of US inward investment in our sector.

I'm aware that Lord Mandelson is due to speak at an [LA investment summit on Thursday May 8th](#), and so wanted to reach out ahead of this.

We're in close contact with DCMS teams on this issue, and are paying close attention for any further detail on the President's proposal (NB, you can view the plan Jon Voight originally proposed to the President [here](#)).

We'll be convening the BFI's Screen Sector Taskforce, comprising 100+ representatives from across the sector, on Friday to gather intel and provide any updates we're able to.

In the meantime, I wanted to share two documents with you in case useful:

- The first is a briefing document providing statistical insights into UK-US trade in film and HETV, including the balance of trade
- The second is a policy paper setting out why it remains essential that the audiovisual sector is excluded from any future UK trade agreement with the US, even in the advent of the President's announcement. We've previously shared this with No 10, DBT and DCMS

The BFI's initial press comment, issued on Monday, ran as follows: *"The BFI is working closely with the UK Government, and industry partners in the UK and US while we understand the detail of the proposal. We want to keep collaboration at the heart of our sectors, so we remain a constructive partner to our friends in the US and internationally."*

UK/US Trade in Film and High-End Television – Some headline numbers

British Film Institute

1. Production Investment in the UK by US companies

- In 2024, UK production spend by inward investment film and HETV projects was £4.8bn, accounting for 84% of UK film and HETV production spend. The overwhelming majority (98%) of this inward investment spend was related to projects with significant involvement from US production companies and/or financing (i.e., the US is recorded as one of the two main countries of origin in our database).
- Inward investment projects with significant US involvement accounted for 89% (159 out of 178) inward investment film and HETV production starts in 2024. HETV has a marginally higher share of significant US involvement, in terms of both spend and project count (see table).
- US investment in screen production in the UK has been consistently very strong for the last two decades in particular, following the introduction of the Film Tax Relief (now the Audiovisual Expenditure Credit [AVEC]) by the Labour Government in 2007. The introduction in 2013 of the High-end Television Tax Relief [now AVEC] for productions with average core costs of more than £1m per hour further boosted investment. HETV production now accounts for the largest proportion of inward investment in the UK.
- The pattern of production investment in recent years is shown in the charts in the Annex below. The success of the UK has been driven by our tax incentives, our outstanding technical skills and creative talent, the quality of our infrastructure (film studios and post-production/VFX houses), the UK's unrivalled range of filming locations and the very positive working relations between employers and unions.

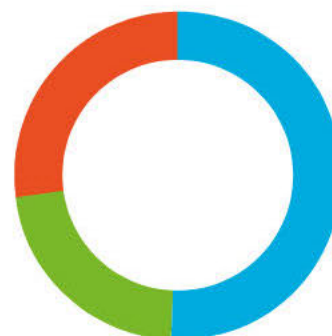
Domestic and co-production data cannot be reported for 2024 for reasons of disclosure control. Approximately 5% of UK spend by domestic and co-production feature films are by projects with significant US involvement.

2. Exports of UK Film to the US

- The UK film industry exported £1.9 billion worth of services in 2021 of which £1.7 billion (90%) comprised royalties earned overseas from the exploitation of UK intellectual property (IP) and £0.2 billion (10%) comprised the sale of UK-based audiovisual and related services to foreign investors.
- The chart below (based on latest available data from the Office of National Statistics), shows that the primary export destination for the period was the EU with 51% of UK film exports, the highest share for the territory since records began. Conversely, the USA, which historically has been the leading destination for UK film exports, accounted for only 20%.

3. Balance of Trade

- According to a Motion Picture Association (MPA) [report](#) published in January 2025, in 2023, the US earned \$22.6 billion in film and television exports and its services trade surplus was \$15.3 billion, or 6% of the total US trade surplus in services. “The industry generated a positive balance of trade in every major market in the world”, with exports three times the level of imports.
N.B. The UK’s own import/export figures, as reported by the ONS, show a UK trade surplus with the US, on average, in film and TV services between the years 2013 and 2021, but there are [well-documented asymmetries](#) between UK and US data on trade in services.
- Based on UK data, UK film exports to the US accounted for an average 31% of the UK’s total film exports between the years 2013 and 2021, while UK TV exports to the US accounted for 26% of the UK’s total TV exports. Imports from the US to the UK accounted for 34% of total UK film imports and 36% of total UK TV imports.
- The value of UK film exports to the US was £354 million in 2021 (the latest date for which ONS data is available) and the value of UK TV exports to the US was £898 million.
- On average, for the years 2017-2021, the majority of the UK’s film trade surplus came from the European Union (60%), with the US accounting for just 1%. The trade surplus for film (positive balance of exports over imports) in 2021 was £863 million.

N.B. There is an extreme uncertainty as to whether or how, in practice, “tariffs” could be levied on a services sector, such as film and television production, as opposed to goods. For example, films are exempted from the [International Emergency Economic Powers Act](#) (which has been the legal basis for the existing tariffs): “As amended, the act currently protects the exchange of “information or informational materials, including but not limited to, publications, films, posters, phonograph records, photographs, microfilms, microfiche, tapes, compact disks, CD ROMs, artworks, and news wire feeds,” provided such exchange is not otherwise controlled for national security or foreign policy reasons related to weapons proliferation or international terrorism.

4. Box office of UK and US films

UK films in the US

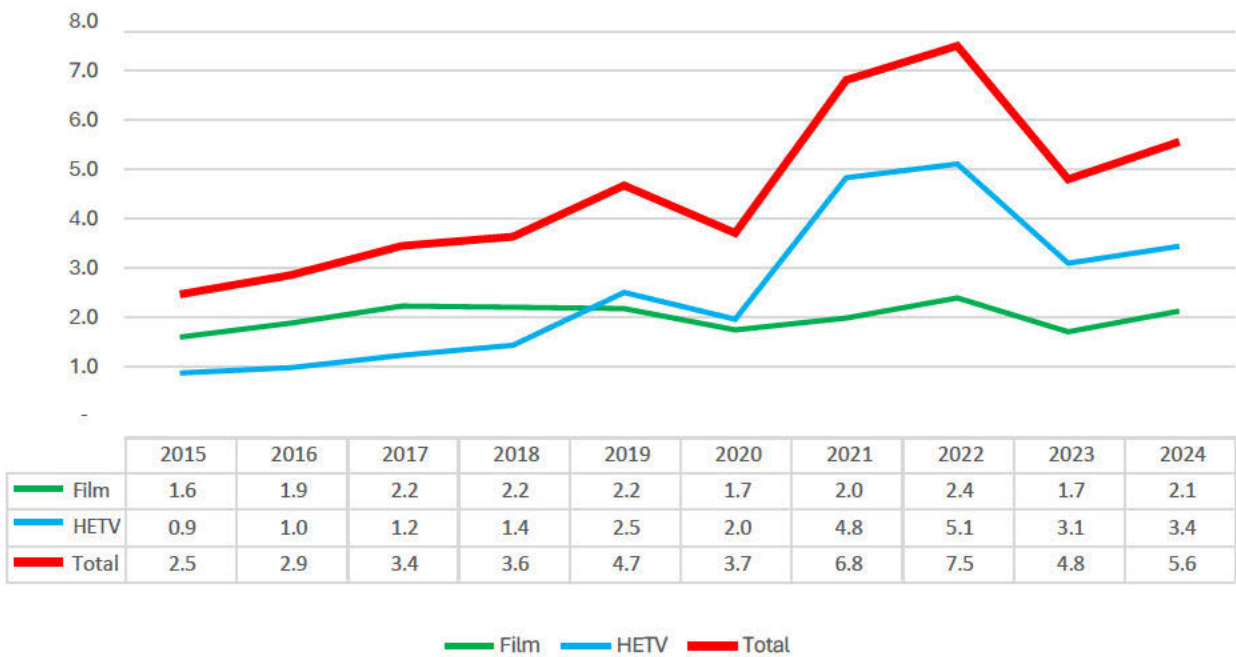
- UK qualifying films earned \$2.7 billion at the US and Canadian box office in 2024. (USA and Canada are a single territory for film distribution purposes; USA accounts for approximately 90% of the combined USA and Canada box office).
 - USA and Canada accounted for 59% of the 2024 worldwide box office of UK qualifying titles (based on 23 territories, excluding UK and Republic of Ireland).
- UK qualifying independent films earned \$110 million at the US and Canadian box office in 2024, accounting for 33% of the worldwide box office of UK qualifying independent titles.
- Other UK qualifying films earned \$2.6 billion at the US and Canadian box office in 2024, accounting for 61% of the worldwide box office of other UK qualifying titles.

US films in the UK

- Films either from the USA or made with US involvement grossed £870 million at the UK and Republic of Ireland box office in 2024, equal to 86% of the total box office takings.
- While UK qualifying films grossed £398.5 million, removing films made with USA involvement reduces this total to just £64 million.

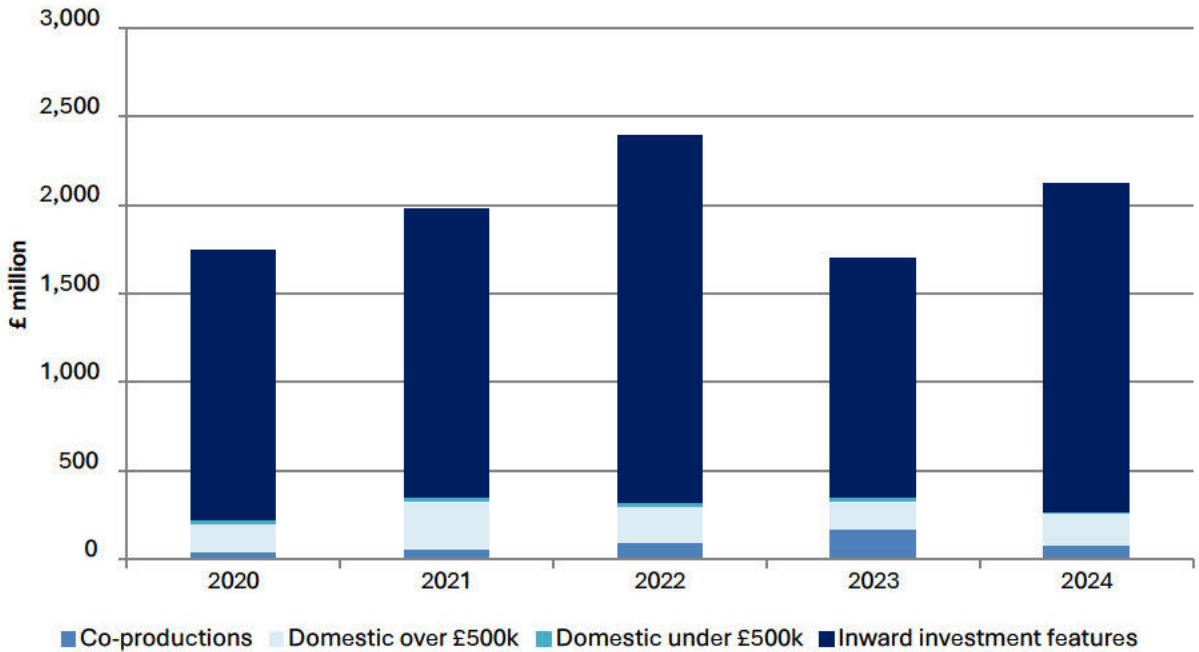
1. Summary chart: UK spend of film and HETV projects, 2015-2024 (£ billion)

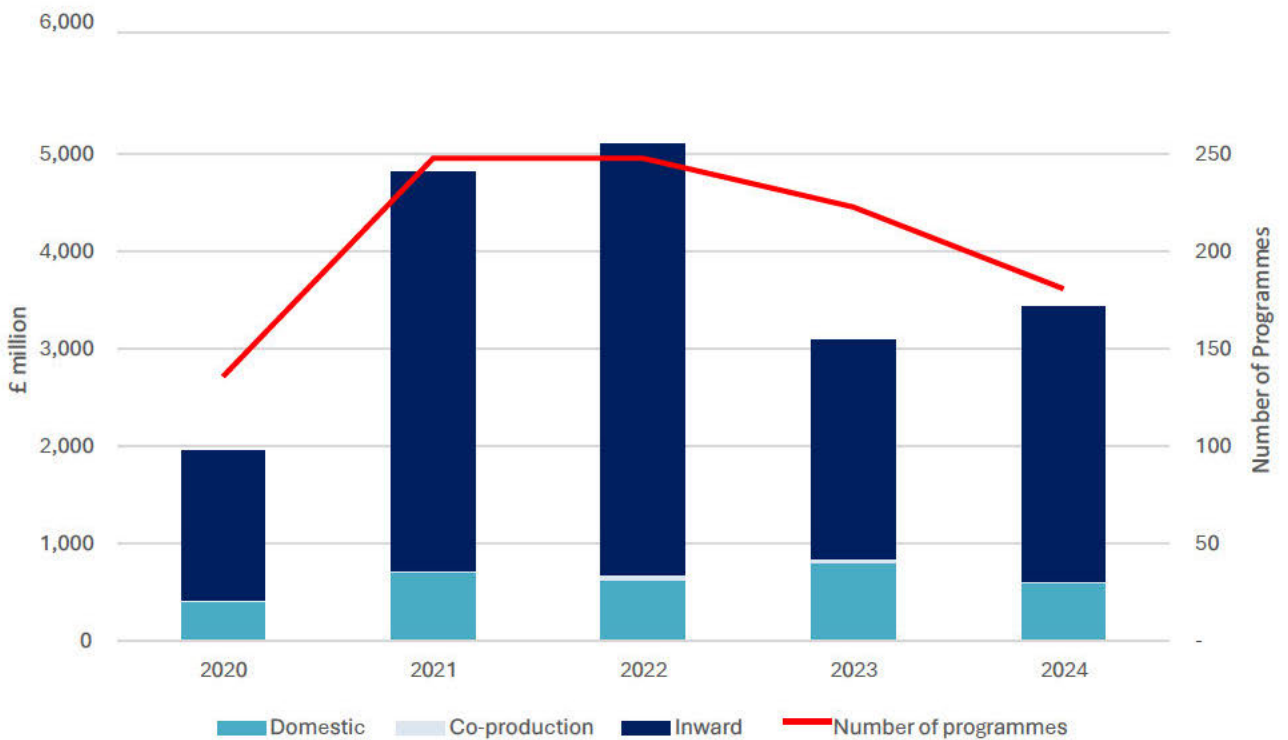

A Potential UK/US Trade Deal: Why Audiovisual Services and Subsidies must be excluded

May 2025

US companies provide substantial and invaluable investment for the UK's screen sectors across production and distribution, VFX, theatrical exhibition and streaming platforms, supporting investment in our world class studio infrastructure and in skills. In 2024 alone, inward investment in film and HETV production in the UK (the overwhelming majority from the US) was worth £4.8bn, accounting for almost 90% of UK production spend. (Source: BFI Research & Statistics Unit)

All of this has been achieved without a UK/US trade deal. It stems from a judicious combination of openness to private investment and public policies such as the [Audiovisual Expenditure Credit \(AVEC\)](#) - our world-class fiscal incentive.

As a part of the services sector rather than the goods sector, AV trade between the UK and the US is not subject to any tariff barriers and thus there is no rationale for including AV services and subsidies in any such trade deal. This continues to be the case with the recent announcement of US tariffs on goods.

It is essential that AV services and AV subsidies continue to be excluded from the scope of all future trade deals by the UK Government, including any UK-US deal, whatever form that may take. This position was agreed by the BFI's Board of Governors in February 2020.

The previous Government maintained this position in relation to all the Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) it negotiated with other trading partners, following our departure from the EU. This continuing exclusion of AV is essential because it enables the UK to maintain its regulatory sovereignty and freedom regarding vital public interventions in the screen sectors (all AVEC incentives, National Lottery, grant-in-aid, BBC Licence Fee, Ofcom regulation of commercial PSBs, private TV and VoD services, regulation of content on video sharing platforms etc).

Under an FTA, or indeed a more targeted trade deal, the inclusion of AV would be very likely to prevent the UK from discriminating in favour of UK companies and/or nationals/residents when amending such interventions or creating new incentive and subsidy schemes and creating regulations. Such flexibility is particularly critical at a time when the landscape of AV is changing rapidly and UK public policy makers need to be unfettered and supple to deal with challenges that may arise.

The inclusion of AV services in any UK/US trade deal would also pose very serious risks regarding the continuing eligibility of UK works for quotas in the EU, which is a significant source of economic value for the UK. Films and TV series/programmes which qualify for the EU's linear and VoD quotas attract a financial premium from EU broadcasters and streamers. Inclusion of AV in a UK/US trade deal is likely to represent a "red line" for the EU which could result in the EU retaliating by withdrawing the eligibility of UK works for these quotas. (See Appendix 1 for more detail on UK content and European quotas)

The European Union is, by far, the most valuable single export market for UK films and TV series. On average, for the years 2017-2021, the majority of the UK's film trade surplus came from the European Union (60%), with the US, for example, accounting for just 1%. The EU accounted for 51% of film exports, compared with the US which accounted for 20%. Loss of UK eligibility for EU quotas therefore risks majorly undermining the value of film and wider AV exports into our most valuable market. [BFI Research & Statistics Unit]

On the issue of copyright in any UK/US trade deal, it is again absolutely essential that the UK retains its regulatory sovereignty and does not yield to the demands of US AI companies for a more “permissive” regime for copyright. This would put at serious risk businesses and livelihoods across our creative industries right across the UK, as set out in the responses by the BFI and a multitude of others in response to the Government’s recent consultation on Copyright and AI.

The inclusion of AV in the IP chapter of any trade deal should be confined to ensuring that other countries adhere to the “gold standard” IP framework which has been developed in the UK, rather than agreeing to any changes which would cause fundamental harm to the interests of individual creators and creative businesses.

APPENDIX 1. UK content, “European Works”, and EU quotas

- The EU’s Audiovisual Media Services Directive (AVMSD) is a legal act which requires linear broadcasters and VoD services to fill their programming schedules and catalogues with a minimum percentage of “European works”, which are broadly defined in the AVMSD as works originating in the EU and certain other European countries
- Linear broadcasters in the EU must show a majority of European works on their services, while the catalogues of VoD services established in the EU must contain a minimum of 30% of European works.
- Despite Brexit, UK works continue to benefit from their eligibility for these quotas in the EU. This is because the UK is a party to the Council of Europe’s European Convention on Transfrontier Television (ECTT) and the AVMSD specifies that works from countries party to the ECTT are eligible for the quotas that operate in the EU.²
- Since Brexit, there has been increasing pressure to review the definition of European Works as some industry stakeholders in Member States, notably in France, claim that the UK is benefiting from the quotas even though it has left the EU.
- There is high demand for UK works from EU broadcasters and VoD services as they are popular with audiences – and they still qualify for the quotas. The significant presence of UK works, especially works financed by US studios and streamers such as, it is alleged, *Barbie*, *Harry Potter* and *The Crown* (so-called “Trojan Horses”), has been another catalyst for some EU stakeholders to call for a review of the definition of European works.³ This is driven by an expectation that if such works were excluded from the quota system, this will create more demand for works originating in the EU.
- The strength of feeling among some EU stakeholders about the qualification of “Trojan Horses” for European works quotas is likely to have been significantly enhanced as a consequence of the US administration’s announcement on tariffs.
- The AVMSD is now undergoing a periodic review which must be completed by December 2026. This evaluation may or may not result in proposals for changes to the AVMSD, including changes to the definition of European Works.
- As noted above, inclusion of AV in a UK-US trade deal risks significantly exacerbating calls for the removal of UK eligibility towards EU quotas. This would significantly undermine the value of UK AV exports to our most significant international market.

TOP LINES

- As the Prime Minister said, **the situation in Gaza is intolerable**, and we must see a **return to the ceasefire and negotiations to stop the bloodshed, free the hostages and end this conflict**.
- **The Prime Minister and Foreign Secretary recently hosted the Prime Minister of the Palestinian Authority, Mohammad Mustafa in London**, reflecting our commitment to strengthening our relationship with the Palestinian Authority.
- They reaffirmed that a **two-state solution is the only viable path to a lasting peace**, with a Palestinian state and Israel living side-by-side in peace, dignity and security.
- We **strongly oppose Israel's resumption of hostilities**, which have led to terrible numbers of civilian casualties, including many children.

Response to Israel issuing sweeping evacuation orders for civilians in Gaza?

These reports are deeply distressing.

As we have said before, we strongly oppose the expansion of Israel's operations, and the continuing block on aid is appalling.

Palestinian territory must not be reduced in the conduct of this war. There must be no forced displacement of people from Gaza. Permanent forced displacement is a breach of international humanitarian law.

With our allies, we are telling the Government of Israel to lift the block on aid entering Gaza now, enable the UN and all humanitarians to save lives, and calling for an immediate ceasefire.

Response on claims Israel using food blockade as a weapon of war?

These are deeply concerning reports. Humanitarian aid must never be used as a political tool or military tactic. We urgently call on Israel to immediately re-start a rapid and unimpeded flow of humanitarian aid to Gaza in order to meet the needs of all civilians.

Do you agree with Tom Fletcher that genocide is taking place in Gaza?

We have always been clear, the devastation from this conflict is appalling. We are not going to comment on whether there is a genocide in Gaza.

The UK Government's long-standing policy is that any formal determination of genocide should be based on the judgement of an international court after consideration of all the evidence available in the judicial process.

However, we are clear that we utterly condemn the abhorrent language used recently by the Israeli Government, threatening that, in their despair at the destruction of Gaza, civilians will start to relocate. Permanent forced displacement is a breach of international humanitarian law.

Response to the High Court case starting last week (WC 12 May) on whether ministers have broken the law by continuing to supply parts for the F-35 programme that may be used by Israel to attack Palestinians in Gaza?

We will not be commenting further on current litigation proceedings.

The UK operates one of the most robust export control regimes in the world. We will continue to defend the decisions being challenged.

It is not currently possible to suspend licensing of F-35 components for use by Israel without prejudicing the entire global F-35 programme, including its strategic role in NATO and wider implications for international peace and security. Excluding F-35 licences from the suspension decision is consistent with HMG's published policy.

The government has decided to continue supplying F-35 parts knowing that Israel is likely to use F-35s to breach IHL - how can that be morally acceptable?

Facing a critical moment for European security and war on our continent, the government has a solemn responsibility to consider the full implications of our export licensing decisions for international peace and security.

Undermining the F35 programme would undermine international peace and security, NATO deterrence, European defence and reduce the resources available to support Ukraine.

These are complex and difficult decisions. The government found there to be a 'clear risk' that items exported to Israel might be used to commit or facilitate serious violations of IHL and so suspended all relevant licences.

It was necessary to exclude exports to the F-35 programme from the suspension, as previously set out to Parliament. This is due to the F-35 programme's broader strategic role in NATO and wider implications for international peace and security.

Palestinian NGOs' report on arms exports since September says you're still selling arms?

We completely reject the conclusions of the report. It misrepresents the data and makes no distinction between exports for military or civilian use, or those intended for re-export.

We have suspended all licences for the IDF that might be used to commit or facilitate serious IHL breaches in the Gaza conflict, subject to the specific measures taken for the global F-35 programme.

Any suggestion that the UK failed to implement the suspension or is licensing other weapons for use by Israel in the war in Gaza is misleading.

What is your reaction to Tom Fletcher's speech to the UNSC on Tuesday?

Humanitarian aid must never be used as a political tool or military tactic.

This Government urgently calls on Israel to immediately restart the flow of humanitarian aid to Gaza to meet the needs of all civilians. The UK's position on the need for a ceasefire, release of hostages and resumption of aid to Gaza is clear.

We urge all parties to return urgently to talks, implement the ceasefire agreement in full and work towards a permanent peace.

A long-lasting ceasefire is the only credible pathway towards a sustainable peace, a two-state solution and the reconstruction of Gaza.

What is your reaction to reported attacks on refugee camps and hospitals in Gaza this last week (WC 12 May):

These reports are deeply distressing.

As we have said before, we oppose the expansion of Israel's military operations in Gaza. Continued fighting is in nobody's interests.

Our position on aid is clear. Israel must immediately end the block on aid and electricity into Gaza and protect civilians, and the UK will continue pushing it to do so.

Palestinian territory must not be reduced in the conduct of this war. There must be no forced displacement of people from Gaza.

Response to letter to PM urging Government to recognise Palestine at summit in France next month?

As the Foreign Secretary said on 28 April, following his meeting with the Palestinian Authority Prime Minister Mohammad Mustafa: *"We will not give up on the two-state solution, with a Palestinian state and Israel living side-by-side in peace, dignity and security. I reaffirm the UK's commitment to recognising a Palestinian state as a contribution to that process, at a time that has the greatest impact."*

Recently, Prime Minister Mustafa and the Foreign Secretary signed a landmark Memorandum of Understanding enshrining their commitment to advancing Palestinian statehood as part of a two-state solution.

**Renewing the Transatlantic Alliance:

- On behalf of the United Kingdom and the entire British Embassy, let me start by expressing our **deep condolences** for the tragic killing of **two young Israeli diplomats** last week in this city, **Yaron Lischinsky** and **Sarah Milgrim**.
- This vile act of **antisemitism** and **extremism** serves as chilling reminder of the vigilance we must deploy against those who bear evil. . Our thoughts are with the **victims**, their **families** and everyone at the **Israeli Embassy**.
- Thank you to the **Atlantic Council** and to **Fred Kempe** for the opportunity to deliver the **Makins Lecture** at this critical moment for the '**Euro-Atlantic**' alliance.
- **Eighty years ago this month**, the streets of **Britain**, **America** and **Allied nations** erupted in celebration at the fall of fascism in Europe.
- For me personally, it is a source of enormous pride that my **grandfather, Herbert Morrison**, served as Home Secretary in Winston Churchill's **wartime coalition**.
- He also served as deputy Prime Minister in Clement Attlee's **transformative post-war government**. That government didn't just **support** the formation of NATO to counter Soviet expansionism — they were **co-architects** of it.
- Amidst **Cold War** tensions and economic upheaval, Britain and America advanced **from allies to integrated strategic partners** at the dawn of the **nuclear age**, our scientists having joined forces in the Manhattan Project to create the advantage we had at the beginning of this age.
- It was **western unity** which ultimately ended the Cold War peacefully and demonstrated resilience to new threats, including the **9/11 attacks**, where NATO invoked **Article 5** for the first time.
- Over eight decades, the foundations of **collective defence** have remained steadfast whilst the **transatlantic relationship** has continuously **evolved** and **adapted** to counter new challenges.

- Today, I want to talk about the **profound change** we face in a new age of **big power rivalry**, a period characterised by **political volatility**, **economic mercantilism** and **geopolitical competition**.

A New Age of Big Power Rivalry

- We are witnessing the end of an era – the twilight of **hyper-globalisation** and **interdependence** – where we assumed that economic integration had made wars almost obsolete.
- The logic seemed compelling: **mutual interests**, **integrated global supply chains** and shared **economic stakes** created too much to lose from warfare.
- That comfortable assumption is being shattered –
- We now see the rise of **modern mercantilism**, where nations prefer to prioritise **national economic strength** and **autonomy**.
- States are intervening and playing a **protectionist role** in managing trade and **directing industrial policy** to become ever more **self-sufficient** and **localised**.
- I'm not declaring **globalisation dead** but it is being **radically reconfigured** around us.
- The drivers are clear: **China's economic ascent** and its state-backed industrial policy, which has flooded the global market with exports and undercut Western industry; the **social disruption of rapid technological change, where, if you take media as an example, we have moved suddenly from decades of information flowing to people through established news organisations, to a future where you only see “news” online that is curated to what you want to know. Or what the algorithm - and those behind it - decides you want to know;** and the backlash against **globalisation's** uneven distribution of benefits.
-
- You can produce many different numbers to show the widening wealth disparities in the West over the past 30 years but I would choose a simple one: GDP per capita in the US has grown about 60%- 70% in real terms but real median household income growth has been about 20% -25%. The typical American household has not done as well as the booming US economy would suggest, The gains have not been shared across society.
- And yes, I credit **President Trump's acute political instincts** in identifying the anxieties gripping millions of Americans:
- The **economic stagnation** born of **trade imbalances**, the **hollowing out of communities** through **job displacement** and growing frustrations with **regulatory overreach**.
- These concerns also resonate with **British society** and demand serious engagement, not dismissal.

Peace through Strength: A Strategic Reboot

- So, where do we go next?
- If we are serious about **rebuilding confidence in the international system** – *if we wish to maintain a set of **common rules and standards*** –
- We need to devote an enormous amount of energy and goodwill to **preserve** and **sustain** the alliances which exist between **like-minded countries**.
- For the UK, and the rest of Europe, we must **reboot the transatlantic alliance** to deliver **peace through strength** across three interconnected domains: **Military, Economic** and **Technological**.

i) Military strength

- For my **generation**, the 20th Century gains in peace and prosperity were thought of as a **European peace dividend**.
- I now recognise it as an **urgent bill** for decades of defence underinvestment – and that payment is **overdue**.
- We have lived in a fantasy created by the **US security guarantee**, complacent that a friendly **heavyweight** across the water would be there *when the going gets tough*.
- We meet in the shadow of Russia's **barbaric invasion** of **Ukraine**, now in its fourth year.
- The UK strongly supports President Trump's initiative to **bring this terrible war to an end**. And we are working together with partners to secure a **just** and **lasting peace**.
- **The Ukraine conflict has served as a brutal wake-up call**. It is crystal clear that European defence must **step up** and **rebalance** for our collective security. President Trump is doing Europe a favour by confronting us with this reality.
- **We must become less dependent** on America, while remaining **inseparably linked** to **America** – a distinction of critical importance.
- This is precisely why Britain has committed to the **biggest sustained increase** in defence spending since the *Cold War* – *meeting a generational challenge with a generational response*.
- We must become NATO's **fastest-innovating nation**, ensuring our military forces are battle ready with **lethal capabilities** across air, sea and land.

- Of course, this all needs to be grounded in **intelligent and effective strategic choices**, not merely **increased expenditure**. Efficiency and innovation to renew our defence manufacturing bases must drive every **pound, dollar and euro** invested.
- Arguably, the most powerful weapon the US has had is its **allies**. I am a strong supporter of military alliances and new configurations between like-minded partners.
- I see it as NATO **first**, but not NATO **only**. This is critical for the **Euro-Atlantic security system**, alongside priorities in the **Pacific** and elsewhere.
- One good example is **AUKUS**, the **trilateral security partnership** with Australia and America which will deliver **advanced submarines** and catalyse technology sharing on other advanced capabilities.

ii) Economic strength

- Turning to the theme of **economic strength**, Britain now enjoys something that has eluded us for far too long: a government with both unity of **purpose** and **longevity**.
- This government is **pro-business, pro-trade**, and committed to **innovation**, not as empty slogans but as practical imperatives.
- We are creating the **best investment environment** with a **regulatory reset** that makes us the most competitive in Europe.
- One of the reasons we were able to close the first trade deal of the Trump Administration is that our strong economic relationship is **fair, balanced** and **reciprocal**. But also because, frankly, we are a businesslike nation with pragmatic instincts. One of the great backhanded insults in British history was when Napoleon Bonaparte dismissed us as a mere “nation of shopkeepers”.
-
- Well indeed we are traders and merchants to our core and very proud of that national character. Commerce has been the blood fl flowing through Britain’s veins for centuries, from selling tin to the Romans 2000 years ago through to the East India Company’s pioneering mercantilism 1600 years later.
- This current deal is one adapted to the times and, as I said in the Oval, it is just the end of the beginning. It protects vital industries in **both countries now**, while providing a springboard to deepen trade further – and work towards a truly transformative **UK-US technology partnership**, which I believe is the future for our two economies.

iii) Technological strength

- There is no prospect I fear more than **China winning the technological competition** in the coming decades.
- China represents a far more **dynamic** and **formidable** strategic rival than the Soviet Union ever was – **economically sophisticated, technologically advanced** and **strategically patient**.
- The United Kingdom and United States are the only two Western nations with **trillion-dollar technology eco-systems** combined with unparalleled talent and research capabilities.
- We must **combine forces** to drive the scientific breakthroughs that will define this century.
- Artificial intelligence stands as the **next great foundational technology**. Through its power we can rapidly make progress across so many frontiers of science: quantum; synthetic biology; nuclear fusion.
- Rather than **stifling** these transformative technologies through excessive regulation, our two governments must unleash their **immense potential** for human benefit and western advantage.

Conclusion: Meeting History's Challenge

- In his immortal **Iron Curtain speech**, delivered in Missouri, Churchill spoke eloquently about the primacy of American power and its **awesome responsibility to future generations**.
- Today, we face our own historical inflection point –
- The reality is, we're in another **global competition of systems and values**.
- Allied democracies must prevail in this contest – for our citizens, our interests, our deepest principles.
- And our diplomacy must reflect the urgent imperative to **deepen political and military alliances**, forge **coalitions of the willing** and establish **cutting-edge technology**

partnerships.

- As we look to the future, the stakes could not be higher, the opportunity could not be greater.

An FCDO spokesperson said: " We remain committed to taking every diplomatic step to prevent Iran from developing nuclear weapons, including through snapback if necessary. That is the UK' s longstanding position which has not changed."

" We have urged Iran to engage with President Trump' s offer of a negotiated solution, and we continue to liaise closely with our allies and partners on this in support of regional stability and to secure peace in the Middle East."

Lord Mandelson:

Iran is vulnerable, but still retains enrichment facilities that can produce for military

purposes a nuclear bomb, and we can't accept that.

We in Britain strongly support the President's initiative in negotiating away these enrichment and related facilities in Iran, we support what Steve Witkoff has been doing in these negotiations, which are making progress. Whether they will finally bring the Iranian regime to their senses and realise they have to find a way out or face a worse alternative I don't know, it remains to be seen.

But we also have the snapback facility available to us in Europe as the E3. Britain France Germany working very actively alongside the US on this. Clock is ticking on snapback, which could produce a snapback to the original sanctions, they need to be mindful of that as well.

Text of Speech. Full text of throne speech: [Building Canada Strong: A bold, ambitious plan for our future - Canada.ca](#). The line which has been picked up and got the only round of applause was at the end: "As the [national] anthem reminds us: The True North is indeed strong and free!". Other quotes:

- "The Prime Minister and the President of the United States, for example, have begun defining a new economic and security relationship between Canada and the U.S., rooted in mutual respect and founded on common interests, to deliver transformational benefits for both sovereign nations."
- "Canada is ready to build a coalition of like-minded countries that share its values, that believe in international co-operation and the free and open exchange of goods, services, and ideas."
- "A confident Canada ... can seize this opportunity by recognising that all Canadians can give themselves far more than any foreign power on any continent can ever take away. And that by staying true to Canadian values, Canada can build new alliances and a new economy that serves all Canadians."

Coverage. There's not much new in terms of government programme, though they did say they "will boost Canada's defence industry by joining ReArm Europe, to invest in transatlantic security with Canada's European partners." Clearly lots of coverage of visit and speech about this sending a signal to the US. We've had some references to our State Visit invitation in media (especially from British commentators), but I've seen none from government sources, nor questions put to them on it (I wasn't asked when I went on the main Sunday politics show). Carney's just done a 30 minute sit down with CBC which was mostly usual messages, almost all domestic; he refused to set a timeline on talks with the US. We see how it plays over the next day or two, and the State Visit questions will come back when we announce a date and when the visit happens – forewarning the Canadians before a date announcement will be helpful if we can.

View of the monarchy. Wall to wall coverage, with large crowds and a very positive reception. Polls suggested two-thirds of Canadians think the monarchy has been useful in respect of the relationship with the US, and similarly that it is an important part of Canadian identity and heritage. But the Bloc Quebecois boycotted the speech, and polls also suggest most were indifferent to the visit, with close to 50% preferring not to have a monarchy ***

A few bits for the more interested:

- **Government Programme.** Carney has done a single mandate letter for all ministers with seven top government-wide objectives rather than the long detailed individual ones Trudeau issued to ministers. ***

- **Election recounts** can take away with one hand what they give with the other ... Carney's back down to 169 seats (172 majority), the Speaker being Liberal makes that effectively 168. But they can still get votes through even if the NDP seven abstain rather vote in favour, ***

- **US Ambassador**, Pete Hoekstra, was out over the weekend: on 51st state "*Move on. If the Canadians want to keep talking about it — that's their business. I'm not talking about it; Donald Trump is not talking about it.*" ... just proven premature with the Trump tweet about 51st state and Golden Dome. (There's been some criticism here of Carney for being all "elbows up" when campaigning, but talking about joining the Golden Dome; ***

- **G7 Finance Ministers**. HMT will record properly. ***

- **The new Foreign Minister** invited me yesterday, ***

Remarks by Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth at the 2025 Shangri-La Dialogue in Singapore (As Prepared)

May 30, 2025

Good morning. It is great to be in Singapore.

Bastian, thanks for your warm welcome. The Shangri-La Dialogue is an important forum for bringing together defense leaders from across the Indo-Pacific region and the world. Thanks to you and IISS for hosting us.

I am proud to be back in the Indo-Pacific for the second time as Secretary of Defense. And I'm going to keep coming back.

And it's not just me. *America* is proud to be back in the Indo-Pacific — and we're here to stay. The United States is an Indo-Pacific nation. We have been since the earliest days of the Republic. We will continue to be an Indo-Pacific nation — with Indo-Pacific interests — for generations to come.

Under President Trump's leadership, the United States is

committed to achieving peace through strength. That starts with deterring aggression here in the Indo-Pacific, here in our priority theater, here with you — our allies and partners. The United States stands ready to work with any country that is willing to step up to preserve the peace we all hold dear.

Looking out at this room, I am glad to see friends, counterparts, and other senior leaders from so many allies and partners. Your presence sends a strong message about our shared purpose, our shared commitment to peace, and our shared dedication to a free and open Indo-Pacific.

This morning, I'd like to share the U.S. Defense Department's vision for the Indo-Pacific. And I'll start by putting it into context — by describing how this vital region fits in to our national defense priorities.

From day one, President Trump gave me and the Department of Defense a clear mission: achieve peace through strength. To accomplish this mission, our overriding objectives have been equally clear: restore the warrior ethos, rebuild our military, and reestablish deterrence.

It all starts with restoring the warrior ethos. All of us in the profession of arms understand that humans are more important than hardware.

So, we're focused on lethality, meritocracy, accountability, standards, and readiness. We've applied common sense. Our combat formations need to be trained and skilled. Our standards need to be high and unwavering. If you can do the job, you're in the formation. If you can't, you are not. Simple as that.

That is restoring the warrior ethos, and our troops are responding to it. Morale, recruiting, retention, readiness, training, capabilities, are all rapidly increasing thanks to our back-to-basics, common sense approach.

Our second priority is rebuilding the military. We're equipping American warfighters with the most advanced capabilities so we remain the strongest and most lethal fighting force in the world.

President Trump proposes spending — for the first time ever — over \$1 trillion next year to do this. The Golden Dome for America, our new sixth generation fighter — the F-47, our new stealth bomber — the B-21, new submarines and destroyers are all a part of that. The best military equipment in the world!

We are reviving our defense industrial base and investing in our shipyards. We are also rapidly fielding emerging technologies that will help us remain the world leader for generations to come. We are stronger — yet more agile — than ever before.

When our opponents know that our military is armed with the most capable weapons systems, wielded by skilled warriors with the will to prevail, they are less likely to challenge us on the battlefield — and that is the point.

This leads to our third objective: reestablishing deterrence. Across four years of deferred maintenance under the Biden administration, the world saw a feckless America. Not anymore.

We are re-establishing deterrence around the world, but credible deterrence starts at home. It starts at our borders. Border security is national security. So we have put troops on the Southwest border and are driving towards 100% operational control there. We are also increasing security in the Western Hemisphere and taking back the Panama Canal from malign Chinese influence.

Beyond our borders, beyond our neighborhood, we are reorienting toward deterring aggression by Communist China. We'll talk more about this in a minute.

Elsewhere — around the world — we are engaging with, enabling, and empowering our allies. We're pushing our allies in Europe to own more of their security — to invest in their own defense. Thanks

to President Trump, they are stepping up. As our allies put their shoulders to the plow and carry more of their own burden, we will continue increasing our focus on the Indo-Pacific, our priority theater.

Vision for the Indo-Pacific

Here in the Indo-Pacific, our futures are bound together. The prosperity and security of the American people are linked with those of your peoples. America has too much at stake in the Indo-Pacific to walk away. We are here to stay.

For a generation, the United States ignored this region. We became distracted by open-ended wars, regime change, and nation building. These costly diversions lacked clearly defined goals and were not tied to vital American interests.

President Trump is changing that. We are not making the same mistakes. We are done with that approach. We are focused on delivering for the American people, on safeguarding their security, on protecting their economic interests, and on using common sense to preserve peace in the Indo-Pacific.

Standing here in Singapore, I think this approach aligns well with the pragmatic style of Singapore's legendary Prime Minister Lee Kwan Yew. Across three decades, he built this country into one of the world's most important hubs of finance and innovation.

Like the late-Prime Minister, President Trump's approach is grounded in common sense and national interests, built on a willingness to work with others while respecting mutual self-interest, and informed by an understanding of military strength but shaped by a preference for engaging on the basis of commerce and sovereignty — not war.

These two historic men share a willingness to challenge old ways of doing things that no longer make sense. Under President Trump's leadership, we are applying this common sense approach here in

the Indo-Pacific and throughout the world.

The results speak for themselves. President Trump is leading European allies to step up in their own self-defense. He is striking new, fairer trade deals that protect Americans while providing a lasting and secure basis for commerce. He is also rebalancing security arrangements with key allies in the region.

This will enable us all to benefit from the peace and stability that comes with a lasting and strong American presence *here* in the Indo-Pacific. These benefits multiply when our allies and partners are also strong.

As President Trump said in Riyadh, the United States is not interested in the moralistic approach to foreign policy of the past.

We are not here to pressure other countries to embrace and adopt our politics or ideology. We are not here to preach to you about climate change or cultural issues. We are not here to impose our will on you. We are all sovereign nations. We should all be able to choose the future we want to build. We respect you and your traditions. And we want to work with you where our shared interests align.

Upon this sure foundation of mutual interests and common sense, we will build and strengthen our partnerships with you to preserve peace and increase prosperity.

The Threat

But a threat gathers ... As we all know, strength and security underpin peace and enable prosperity. And our common sense approach to achieving security — to achieving peace through strength — requires seeing things clearly. It requires confronting the hard truth about the threats we face in the Indo-Pacific. And it requires meeting those threats with urgency.

Before we get to these hard truths, let me begin by saying, we do

not seek conflict with Communist China. But we will not be pushed out of this critical region. And we will not let our allies and partners be subordinated.

China seeks to become the hegemonic power in Asia. It wishes to dominate and control this vibrant and vital region. Through its massive military build-up and growing willingness to use military force to achieve its goals, China has demonstrated that it wants to fundamentally alter the region's status quo.

China's behavior towards its neighbors and the world is a wake-up call. And an urgent one.

Practically around the clock, China uses its vast and sophisticated cyber capabilities to steal industrial technology and attack critical infrastructure systems — in your countries and in the United States, too. These actions not only rip us off, but endanger the lives of our citizens.

In the South China Sea, Communist China harasses its neighbors — many are here in this room today. China seeks to intimidate you in your own waters. We have all seen the videos and pictures of water cannons, ship-to-ship collisions, and illegal boardings at sea. They are also illegally seizing and militarizing land features in the South China Sea.

These actions betray China's fundamental lack of respect for its neighbors and challenge sovereignty, freedom of navigation, and overflight. We are watching China's destabilizing actions closely. Any unilateral attempt in the South China Sea to change the status quo by force or coercion is unacceptable.

Every day, China's military harasses Taiwan. These activities have been paired with China's rapid military modernization and buildup — including massive investments in nuclear weapons, hypersonic missiles, and amphibious assault capabilities.

It should be clear to all that Beijing is concretely and credibly

preparing to use military force to alter the balance of power in the Indo-Pacific. We know that Xi Jinping has ordered his military to be ready to invade Taiwan by 2027. The PLA is building the capabilities needed to do it — at breakneck speed. The PLA is training for it, every day. The PLA is rehearsing for the real deal.

Let me be clear: any attempt by Communist China to conquer Taiwan would result in devastating consequences for the Indo-Pacific and the world. We are not going to sugarcoat it. The threat China poses is real. And it could be imminent.

Facing these threats, we know that many countries are tempted by the idea of seeking both economic cooperation with China and defense cooperation with the United States. But beware the leverage the CCP seeks with that entanglement. Economic dependence on China only deepens their malign influence and complicates our decision space during times of tension or conflict. The CCP uses economic influence to wield power.

Nobody knows what China will ultimately do. But they are preparing. And we must, therefore, be ready as well. Urgency and vigilance is our only option.

But let me again be clear: The United States does not seek war. We do not seek to dominate or strangle China. We do not seek to humiliate China. We do not seek regime change. Instead, we seek peace. But we must ensure that China cannot dominate us — or our allies and partners. That is a rational, common sense goal that all should be able to live with.

At the same time, President Trump has said that Communist China will not invade Taiwan on his watch. Our goal is to prevent war. And we will do this with a strong shield of deterrence, forged together with you – America's great allies and partners. Together, we will show what we mean by Peace through Strength. In many ways seen, and unseen. Overt and covert.

But if deterrence fails, we will be prepared to do what the Department of Defense does best – fight and win — decisively.

Path Forward

As I've said many times before, and it's important for all of you to hear today — America First does not mean America alone. The Indo-Pacific is America's priority theater. As we shift our focus to this region, and as Europe steps up and takes greater ownership of its own security, President Trump and I will be counting on you – our allies and partners – to be force multipliers alongside the United States.

We ask — indeed, we insist — that our allies and partners do their part. Sometimes, this means having uncomfortable and tough conversations. Partners owe to it to each other to be honest and realistic. This is the essence of a pragmatic, common sense foreign policy. But you will also see that we are — and will remain — loyal to our allies and partners. In fact, the only way to ensure lasting alliances and partnerships is to make sure each side does its part.

We will stand with you and work hard alongside you to deter Chinese aggression. And we will do so in a rational and pragmatic manner. Each day, together, creating more and more dilemmas and complications for China, should they decide to overturn the status quo.

No one should doubt America's commitment to our Indo-Pacific allies and partners. We will continue to wrap our arms around our friends and find new ways to work together — not only our treaty allies here, but also our key partners in ASEAN and across the Indo Pacific.

Built on the bedrock of shared interests, these partnerships will deliver for our countries in unprecedented ways.

For example, look no further than to our growing defense relationship with India, where we pass new milestones by the

day—from the shared ventures of our defense industries to the increasing operational coordination and interoperability between our two militaries.

But we must all do our part — and get more serious about contributing to our collective defense.

I urge our allies and partners to seize this moment with us.

We must ensure that our defense spending reflects the dangers and threats we face today. Deterrence does not come cheap. Time is of the essence. We must step up and move out with a sense of urgency.

It is hard to believe I can say this – but Asian allies and partners should look to countries in Europe as a new-found example. NATO members are pledging to spend 5% of their GDP on defense, even Germany. How can it make sense for countries in Europe to do that while key allies and partners in Asia spend far less in the face of a far more formidable threat from Communist China, not to mention North Korea?

Ultimately, a strong, resolute, and capable network of allies and partners is one of our key strategic advantages.

China envies what we have together. And it has seen what we can collectively bring to bear. But it's up to all of us to ensure that we live up to that potential by investing in our own defenses.

Europe is stepping up. U.S. allies in the Indo-Pacific can, and should, follow by quickly upgrading their own defenses.

President Trump said it himself last month in Riyadh – he will never hesitate to wield American power swiftly and decisively if it is necessary.

That's re-establishing deterrence. We're doing this here in the Indo-Pacific in three ways: by improving our forward force posture, by

helping allies and partners strengthen their defense capabilities, and by rebuilding our defense industrial bases.

First, the Department of Defense is prioritizing forward postured, combat credible forces in the Western Pacific to deter by denial. In my first trip to the Indo-Pacific in March, I traveled to the Philippines to meet with President Marcos and Secretary of National Defense Teodoro. While there we announced our commitment to deploy more advanced U.S. military capabilities to the Philippines.

We announced the inaugural overseas deployment of NMESIS, a U.S. Marine Corps mobile anti-ship missile system, to the Philippines. The 3rd Marine Littoral Regiment – one of the U.S. military's most capable and lethal formations – exercised NMESIS along with our Philippine allies. Together we deployed the system to the Batanes Islands in the Luzon Strait between the Philippines and Taiwan.

This enhanced our interoperability and improved our readiness to operate cutting-edge platforms where we need them, when we need them.

We also announced that U.S. Special Operations Forces and Philippine Marines are training together on complex landing scenarios in the Batanes Islands. This demonstrates that our forces can conduct high-end operations in the most challenging environments.

I also visited Tokyo and met with Prime Minister Ishiba and Defense Minister Nakatani. We announced that we are upgrading the U.S. Forces Japan headquarters. This is about warfighting and deterrence – and common sense. Upgrading USFJ demonstrates the significant work of the U.S.-Japan Alliance to effectively respond to evolving threats. It also reflects the progress the Alliance has made towards improving interoperability and Japan's own advances in strengthening its indigenous capabilities.

And, this summer, the U.S. Army plans to conduct its first live-fire test of its Mid-Range Capability system in Australia. This will be the first time that system is fired west of the International Date Line and the first time we have tested it on foreign soil. Deployments like this represent our commitment to the region, and we have many more planned.

On the home front, the Golden Dome for America will protect the U.S. homeland against a catastrophic missile attack by potential adversaries. As we strengthen missile defenses for the U.S. homeland, we will also look for ways to improve regional missile defenses right here in the Indo-Pacific. This is part of increasing deterrence and investing in our alliances.

We are also using regional integrated air and missile defense to strengthen deterrence. We are developing several key missile defense technologies and data-sharing partnerships with Japan and Australia. We will leverage America's best-in-class technologies to strengthen regional air and missile defense architectures.

Second, we are supporting allies and partners as they strengthen their own defense capabilities and capacity. We want to empower you – as partners, not dependents – to work more capably with the United States.

We are working to rapidly deliver the kinds of off-the-shelf, innovative, autonomous systems for which American industry is renowned. It's why the Department partnered with U.S. industry to launch the Maritime Security Consortium.

This consortium will build and sustain maritime domain awareness to deliver real operational effects by employing unmanned aircraft and vessels. These capabilities will be delivered quickly and at a lower cost to get cutting edge American technology into the hands of our warfighters and of our partners and allies in Southeast Asia.

A critical part of working with our allies and partners is increasing

interoperability – learning how to sail, fly, and fight as one. This year's BALIKATAN exercise in the Philippines was the largest-ever.

In the South China Sea, we also continue to conduct regular maritime cooperative activities alongside Australia, Japan, and the Philippines. Activities like these improve our coordination and shared tactics.

And we are expanding our security partnership with India through robust military exercises like TIGER TRIUMPH. We are also amplifying cooperation within the Quad and other multilateral frameworks. Within the Quad we are also leading an initiative called the Indo-Pacific Logistics Network, enabling Quad partners to leverage shared logistics capabilities in the Indo-Pacific.

And we are grateful for the opportunity to train with all our allies and partners in the region in other exercises like TALISMAN SABRE with Australia or COBRA GOLD in Thailand. These exercises enhance our lethality while improving our readiness to respond to crisis at a moment's notice. We put that into practice last March with the Thai military in response to the earthquake there.

Flying, sailing, and operating together in peacetime ensures we're prepared for the unexpected. It's all about getting in those reps and sets — as a team.

Third, we are revitalizing our defense industrial bases and reallocating resources towards the most lethal and effective capabilities. We are doing this because the success of our warfighters requires it.

It is one thing for an adversary to see multinational forces operating together in exercises. It is another thing entirely for that same adversary to see an integrated defense industrial base supporting those forces and standing ready to keep them in the fight.

That's why I'm pleased to endorse the Partnership for Indo-Pacific Industrial Resilience, also known as PIPIR – a U.S.-initiated

multilateral forum of 14 allies and partners working with industry, capital providers, and key non-governmental stakeholders, to strengthen industrial resilience, expand our capacity, and accelerate deliveries.

And today, I'm proud to announce the first PIPIR projects.

The first project plans to establish repair capability and capacity for P-8 radar systems in Australia. This will enable Indo-Pacific allies and partners operating the aircraft, including New Zealand and the Republic of Korea, to repair aircraft within the region rather than relying on a single repair source in the continental United States.

The second is a project that will develop standards for small unmanned aerial systems across the Indo-Pacific, identify secure sources of production for their critical components, and increase global supply chain resilience for these essential systems.

Similarly, we are working through our Regional Sustainment Framework to do things like expand existing contracts for U.S Army Watercraft repair. The goal of this initiative is to bring in more providers and expand existing repair capability more broadly across the Indo-Pacific.

We will also use our allies' world-class ship repair capabilities to enhance the U.S. Navy's operational effectiveness and to save taxpayer money.

These moves will strengthen regional resiliency by increasing access to repair capabilities in theater and reducing dependency on distant supply chains.

We are deepening our cooperation with Australia's Guided Weapons and Explosive Ordnance enterprise with historic momentum and purpose. This work is critical to securing our technological edge and making our munitions supply chains resilient.

In the last two months, we have reached an agreement for Australia to produce 155 millimeter ammunition and to assemble Guided Multiple Launch Rocket Systems. These steps enhance our readiness and facilitate upgrades to our collective defense industrial base.

We are working with India to co-produce equipment needed to deter aggression. This includes negotiating an agreement to bring our industrial bases even closer. Last month, we held our first-ever U.S.-India industry-government experts exchange to produce and field state-of-the-art autonomous systems as part of the U.S.-India Autonomous Systems Industry Alliance.

Across the board, the United States, our allies, and our partners are making great progress in these — and many other — areas towards achieving peace through strength.

We must keep moving quickly, though. We face a grave threat and we have no time to waste.

Conclusion

With sage leadership, strategic vision, and a sense of urgency Lee Kuan Yew turned Singapore into one of the world's great success stories. Many call it the "Singapore Miracle." That is what common sense policies can achieve. And it is precisely what President Trump's vision is all about.

Peace through Strength. Reestablishing deterrence. Sharing our burdens. Multiplying our strengths. Reinforcing our great alliances. Not starting wars, but preventing them. And building a better future for our nations — together.

During my last visit to the Indo-Pacific, I watched oil seep up from the wreckage of USS ARIZONA at Pearl Harbor. I saw the rows of crosses marking the graves of over 17,000 American soldiers at the Manila American Cemetery. And I walked the black sand beaches of Iwo Jima.

In these hallowed places I immediately felt connected to the past — to the warriors who went before us. They gave their all for freedom and for peace. As we mark 80 years since the end of World War II, we owe it to today's warriors, to our citizens, and to our children and grandchildren, to preserve this peace.

The motto of my first platoon was: "Those who long for peace, must prepare for war." That is exactly what we're doing. We are preparing for war, to deter war — to achieve peace through strength. And we look to you — our allies and partners — to join us in this important work.

Our time is now. The threats we face will not wait. Nor can we.

To foreign visitors, walking into President Trump's Oval Office has become akin to entering the Colosseum. Other ambassadors spend days trying to persuade the White House to allow their incoming head of government to forgo the thrill of the Oval media spray or at least have the closed door Presidential lunch beforehand as an early barometer of what may be on the President's mind. None succeed. The President is eager for the fray and the visitor's secret of success is to leave him to it, stay relaxed, speak when spoken to and never take the bait. Keir Starmer's Oval appearance is viewed across Washington's diplomatic corps as the model. It's just a shame that not all of them have a popular King from whom to deliver an eagerly awaited state visit invitation.

+++++

The US-UK trade deal represented smart, nimble diplomacy by my Embassy and London officials - met by an equal measure of professionalism and good-will from President Trump's negotiating team. When I entered the anything-can-happen Oval Office and picked my way past the Churchill bust and gilt adornments to take my place behind the Resolute desk for the trade deal's launch, the White House protocol officer issued me with clear instructions to stand behind the President and say nothing. I was there in a purely supporting capacity while the Prime Minister was poised to be dialed in from Jaguar Land Rover's West Midlands HQ to give his endorsement to the VE-day deal. President Trump was enjoying himself; the conversation and the cameras rolled on and I was gazing around, soaking in the atmosphere when suddenly he looked over his shoulder and asked if I had anything to say. Luckily my political skills kicked in, the Rolls-Royce gag worked and I was praised for my 'beautiful accent'. Over an hour – what seemed like a week – later the press were herded out and the President brandished his trade-mark Sharpie felt tip and presented me with a signed copy of his talking points. Plus a stash of signed MAGA caps for my staff. They had earned them.

+++++

My conclusion from listening to the President on this and other occasions is that the secret of his political success is that he always knows what he wants to say, means it when he says it and is never lost for words. And he is not gun shy. The discipline of the Administration – Elon Musk notwithstanding – is impressive. Compared to

Trump 1 when freelancing secretaries and Congressional revolts were widespread in the party, Republicans now are remarkably careful not to show any difference from the President. I regularly commute to the Hill to see House and Senate members who may not all be cut from the same Trumpian cloth but have nonetheless heard the views of their electoral base. The MAGA movers and shakers who were instrumental to the Trump victory and now form the new DC establishment, are not ideologues but nonetheless, like him and his forceful vice president, J D Vance, have clearly formed instincts and deeply held beliefs. They want to see these reflected in pioneering, radical domestic and foreign policies, unfettered by more conventionally minded civil servants and others they refer to as ‘the deep state’. They are impatient and ruthless and leave those with more moderate politics flailing around, unable to decide whether to stick up for their centrism or outflank them to the left. Democrats are, so far, at a loss to know how to oppose Trump – they are chasing an opponent who never seems to turn himself into a target.

They hold onto the hope that history rhymes and the pendulum will swing and they will regain the House, if not the Senate, in the 2026 midterms. They may well be right but hope, as they say, is not a strategy.

+++++

There is no doubt that, for Reinaldo and me, living in an historic residence with such a beautiful garden is both a privilege and hard work with all the hosting and entertaining that comes with the job. It is expected that 18,000 visitors will join as at receptions, events, dinners, salons and roundtables this year. Unfortunately I cannot compete with those of my predecessors who conducted a lot of their diplomatic work on the residence tennis court but I do have another asset – Jock, the universally popular Ambassa-Dog, who is shortly to make his Instagram debut. He has all the wonderful qualities you associate with a collie and our visitors queue up to throw his ball for him which he retrieves and leaves at other guests’ feet. But he is best not startled after he has turned in for the night as Dame Emily Thornberry, the warm and redoubtable chair of the Commons Foreign Affairs Committee, discovered when she strayed into our flat rather than her bedroom when returning to the residence after an evening of networking on the Hill.....

Dear all,

A further update from BE Washington at our close today.

1. President Trump attended a military parade in Washington DC today to mark the 250th anniversary of the US Army, as well as celebrating his own birthday. He will head to Calgary tomorrow to attend the G7 leaders' meeting. We can expect the Iran/Israel conflict to be front of mind for Trump heading into the meeting, as well as domestic political concerns. Our systems have remained in contact today, including through a call between NSA and SE Witkoff.
2. The US position has not evolved significantly since yesterday. *** Defense Secretary Hegseth set this out in a Fox News interview today, saying that Trump was 'dialed in' to the conflict and would prefer to see a negotiated solution. He also repeated US warnings to Iran against targeting the US and said that the US is robustly postured to ensure its people, bases and interests are safe.
3. Trump spoke to Putin earlier today, discussing both Iran and Ukraine. In a post on Truth Social he said "President Putin called this morning to very nicely wish me a Happy Birthday, but to more importantly, talk about Iran, a country he knows very well. We talked at length. Much less time was spent talking about Russia/Ukraine, but that will be for next week. He is doing the planned prisoner swaps - large numbers of prisoners are being exchanged, immediately, from both sides. The call lasted approximately 1 hour. He feels, as do I, this war in Israel-Iran should end, to which I explained, his war should also end."
4. Israeli officials briefed anonymously to US media that Israel had requested that the Administration join the war to eliminate Iran's nuclear programme. Israeli Ambassador to the US, Yechiel Leiter, also said in a Fox News interview

that Iran appeared to have been hit harder than expected, and suggested that they may now be ready to negotiate.

2. BEW's assessment is that the US position has not yet crystallised, and the President is still deliberating on the appropriate course of action after hearing the options at an NSC meeting this morning. That said, the US is becoming drawn in on the ground, with Administration officials confirming to press that the US helped intercept Iranian ballistic missile strikes on Israel today. If Israeli civilians are killed by Iranian strikes this may toughen the US approach.

An update on immediate reactions from Washington following Israel's strikes against Iran.

2. Roughly two hours before the strike **POTUS** tweeted: "We remain committed to a diplomatic resolution to the Iran nuclear issue! My entire Administration has been directed to negotiate with Iran. They could be a great country, but they first must completely give up hopes of obtaining a nuclear weapon. Thank you for your attention to this matter!"
3. **Rubio** shared the POTUS tweet and issued a separate statement on X after the strikes: "Tonight, Israel took unilateral action against Iran. We are not involved in strikes against Iran and our top priority is protecting American forces in the region. Israel advised us that they believe this action was necessary for its self-defence. President Trump and the Administration have taken all necessary steps to protect our forces and remain in close contact with our regional partners. Let me be clear: Iran should not target US interests or personnel."
4. There have been a few **Congressional reactions** this evening. Senator Risch – the Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee – tweeted: "*We stand with Israel tonight and pray for the safety of its people and the success*

of this unilateral, defensive action. I am also praying for the brave U.S. service members in the Middle East who keep America safe—Iran would be foolish to attack the United States”. Lindsey Graham tweeted: *“Game on. Pray for Israel”.* Tom Cotton tweeted: *“Iran is the world’s worst state sponsor of terrorism, has the blood of thousands of Americans on its hands, and is rushing to build not only nuclear weapons, but also missiles that can strike the United States. We back Israel to the hilt, all the way. And if the ayatollahs harm a single American, that will be the end of the ayatollahs.”* Senator Jack Reed (D-RI), Senate Armed Services Committee Ranking Member tweeted *“Israel’s alarming decision to launch airstrikes on Iran is a reckless escalation that risks igniting regional violence. These strikes threaten not only the lives of innocent civilians but the stability of the entire Middle East and the safety of American citizens and forces. While tensions between Israel and Iran are real and complex, military aggression of this scale is never the answer. I urge both nations to show immediate restraint, and I call on President Trump and our international partners to press for diplomatic de-escalation before this crisis spirals further out of control. President Trump must be crystal clear with the American people and the international community in charting a way forward. The world cannot afford more devastating conflict born of short-sighted violence.”*

An update on immediate reactions from Washington following Israel's strikes against Iran.

2. Roughly two hours before the strike **POTUS** tweeted: “ We remain committed to a diplomatic resolution to the Iran nuclear issue! My entire Administration has been directed to negotiate with Iran. They could be a great country, but they first must completely give up hopes of obtaining a nuclear weapon. Thank you for your attention to this matter!”
3. **Rubio** shared the POTUS tweet and issued a separate statement on X after the strikes: “ Tonight, Israel took unilateral action against Iran. We are not involved in strikes against Iran and our top priority is protecting American forces in the region. Israel advised us that they believe this action was necessary for its self-defence. President Trump and the Administration have taken all necessary steps to protect our forces and remain in close contact with our regional partners. Let me be clear: Iran should not target US interests or personnel.”
4. There have been a few **Congressional reactions** this evening. Senator Risch – the Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee – tweeted: “ *We stand with Israel tonight and pray for the safety of its people and the success of this unilateral, defensive action. I am also praying for the brave U.S. service members in the Middle East who keep America safe—Iran would be foolish to attack the United States*” . Lindsey Graham tweeted: “ *Game on. Pray for Israel*” . Tom Cotton tweeted: “ *Iran is the world's worst state sponsor of terrorism, has the blood of thousands of Americans on its hands, and is rushing to build not only nuclear weapons, but also missiles that can strike the United States. We back Israel to the hilt, all the way. And if the ayatollahs harm a single American, that will be the end of the ayatollahs.*” Senator Jack Reed (D-RI), Senate Armed Services Committee Ranking Member tweeted “ *Israel's alarming decision to launch airstrikes on Iran is a reckless escalation that risks igniting regional violence. These strikes threaten not only the lives of innocent civilians but the stability of the entire Middle East and the safety of American citizens and forces. While tensions between Israel and Iran are real and complex, military aggression of this scale is never the answer. I urge both nations to show immediate restraint, and I call on President Trump and our international partners to press for diplomatic de-escalation before this crisis spirals further out of control. President Trump must be crystal clear with the American people and the international community in charting a way forward. The world cannot afford more devastating conflict born of short-sighted violence.*”

An update on immediate reactions from Washington following Israel's strikes against Iran.

2. Roughly two hours before the strike **POTUS** tweeted: "We remain committed to a diplomatic resolution to the Iran nuclear issue! My entire Administration has been directed to negotiate with Iran. They could be a great country, but they first must completely give up hopes of obtaining a nuclear weapon. Thank you for your attention to this matter!"
3. **Rubio** shared the POTUS tweet and issued a separate statement on X after the strikes: "Tonight, Israel took unilateral action against Iran. We are not involved in strikes against Iran and our top priority is protecting American forces in the region. Israel advised us that they believe this action was necessary for its self-defence. President Trump and the Administration have taken all necessary steps to protect our forces and remain in close contact with our regional partners. Let me be clear: Iran should not target US interests or personnel."
4. There have been a few **Congressional reactions** this evening. Senator Risch - the Chairman of the Foreign Relations Committee - tweeted: "*We stand with Israel tonight and pray for the safety of its people and the success of this unilateral, defensive action. I am also praying for the brave U.S. service members in the Middle East who keep America safe-Iran would be foolish to attack the United States*". Lindsey Graham tweeted: "*Game on. Pray for Israel*". Tom Cotton tweeted: "*Iran is the world's worst state sponsor of terrorism, has the blood of thousands of Americans on its hands, and is rushing to build not only nuclear weapons, but also missiles that can strike the United States. We back Israel to the hilt, all the way. And if the ayatollahs harm a single American, that will be the end of the ayatollahs.*" Senator Jack Reed (D-RI), Senate Armed Services Committee Ranking Member tweeted "*Israel's alarming decision to launch airstrikes on Iran is a reckless escalation that risks igniting regional violence. These strikes threaten not only the lives of innocent civilians but the stability of the entire Middle East and the safety of American citizens and forces. While tensions between Israel and Iran are real and complex, military aggression of this scale is never the answer. I urge both nations to show immediate restraint, and I call on President Trump and our international partners to press for diplomatic de-escalation before this crisis spirals further out of control. President Trump must be crystal clear with the American people and the international community in charting a way forward. The world cannot afford more devastating conflict born of short-sighted violence.*"

Q: Given the crisis that we're witnessing in Israel and Iran, can you set expectations for us in respect of what we can expect from this G7? What kind of agreement we should realistically hope from those G7 countries and the communique? And if you think in the end it's impossible to get consensus, what is the relevance of the G7 besides?

A: Well, there's going to be intense discussions at the G7, but there are already intense discussions going on as you would expect at every level.

And, so for my part, as I think you will know, I spoke to Macron and Merz yesterday. I spoke with the Prime Minister Netanyahu. I spoke to President Trump. I've spoken to members this morning and I suspect before we even get to the G7 event that we've got many more calls and exchanges of views, on an intense basis.

As I set out yesterday, we do have longstanding concerns about the nuclear program that Iran has. We do recognise Israel's right to self-defense. But, I'm absolutely clear that this needs to de-escalate, there's a huge risk of escalation for the region and more widely in terms of conflict. You can see the impact already on the economy at oil prices. And, of course, all of this is linked to what's going on in Gaza. So you can see why my strong position is that this needs to de-escalate. And that is the primary focus of all the discussions that I've been having and will continue to have. But in relation to what might happen at the end of the G7, I think there's going to be so much intense discussions before we get there that I'll probably have to come back to you on that. Because the G7 happens to be a good occasion to have those face to face discussions, but those discussions are going on anyway and would have gone on in any event. And I'm expecting to have a series of further discussions today into tomorrow. It is the number one thing that I'm dealing with at the moment, as you would expect.

Q: Iran threatens UK, U.S. and French bases. Are there any plans for the UK to provide additional assets to those bases, in terms of defensive or defensive posture?

A: Well, I will always make the right decisions for the UK and our allies. I'm very clear

in the principles I apply to this. We are moving assets. To the region, including jets. And that is, for contingency support in the region. And so I will be clear in relation to our duties and obligations and my duty as the Prime Minister of the United Kingdom.

Q: What more can you tell us about the moving of assets into the region, precisely in terms of what engagement might be? Would they be involved in defending Israel, for instance? And would you describe what Israel did the other day as an act of self-defense?

A: Firstly, I'm not going to get into operational issues. You'll understand this is not only fast moving, but it's intense and we're having ongoing discussions with our allies all of the time. Both myself and David Lammy, as you'll see, who also spoke to the Iranians as a matter of record now. Our constant messages de-escalate and therefore, everything we're doing, and all the discussions we're having, are to do with de-escalation.

In relation to Israel, I had a good and constructive discussion with Prime Minister Netanyahu yesterday. And that included discussions about the safety and security of Israel, as you would expect between two allies.

Q: It's not been quite clear as of yet. What notice, if any, did you get in advance of Israel's strike?

A: Well, again, I'm not going to go into what information we had at the time or since. We discuss these things intensely with our allies, but I'm not going to get into precisely what we knew. There's a constant flow of information between our allies, particularly between us and the US.

Q: But it wasn't a shock when it happened?

A: I'm not going to start answering what moves around on intelligence channels.

Q: The U.S. helped shoot out Iranian missiles and drones overnight. Why did the UK choose not to and will that change?

A: We've been moving our assets to the regions. And I've just been clear about what we think should happen, which is de-escalation. And I discussed with Prime Minister Netanyahu yesterday the safety and security of Israel.

Two killed in Iran's early morning strikes on Israel – MDA

We [earlier reported](#) that 21 were injured in Iran's early morning strikes in Israel's Coastal Plain region. Two of them have died, according to emergency service Magen David Adom (MDA).

A woman in her 60s was rescued unconscious and without vital signs, and a man around 45 was pronounced dead after being evacuated, MDA said.

US media also reported that [one woman died](#) from Iranian retaliatory strikes on Friday night.

Jordan reopens airspace - reports

Jordan has reopened its airspace at 07:30 local time (04:30 GMT), the country's civil aviation commission said, according to Reuters.

It comes a day after flights were suspended in the country amid the rising tensions between Israel and Iran.

Israel is continuing strikes on Iran - IDF

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) says it is continuing airstrikes on targets in Iran. In a brief statement posted to Telegram, the IDF said that "the [Israeli Air Force] continues to strike targets to remove threats in Iran".

The comments were posted alongside a video showing footage of aerial strikes.

It comes more than 24 hours after Israel's initial strike on Iran's military bases, which killed three Iranian military commanders, according to the IDF.

Iran has since launched missile strikes on Israel into Saturday morning.

Iran retaliates - what you need to know in five bullet points

Iran launched more than 100 missiles in multiple waves at Israel, starting last night and stretching into the early hours of this morning.

That came in response to Israel's attack early on Friday, which it said was necessary to prevent Tehran getting closer to building an atomic weapon.

It's just gone 9am in Israel and 9.30am in Iran. If you're just joining us, here's a quick recap of the situation as it stands:

- Three people have been killed in Israel, according to medics, with one in Tel Aviv and two slightly south in Rishon Lezion, and at least 53 hurt across both cities;
- Iran's UN envoy said 78 people have been killed in Israeli attacks, including three top commanders - and more than 320 injured, mostly civilians;
- Israel's defence minister said today Iran crossed a red line by firing at civilians and will "pay a heavy price";
- Both countries have reported drone attacks in the past hour, although Jordan has reopened its airspace in a sign they're not expecting imminent strikes;

- The US military helped to shoot down Iranian missiles, officials said, while Donald Trump said it's not too late for Tehran to halt Israeli bombing by reaching a deal on its nuclear programme.

Sirens sound across Israel as Iranian drones launched - IDF

The Israeli military has just said alerts have been activated in several parts of the country, warning of an incoming wave of Iranian drones.

The IDF said the air force is "working to intercept and attack wherever necessary to eliminate the threat".

Dozens injured as Israel and Iran exchange attacks

Israel launched aerial attacks across Iran yesterday, with Tehran responding last night and into the early hours today.

The Iranian ambassador to the UN, Amir Saeid Iravani, said 78 people have been killed and more than 320 injured.

Among those killed were three of Iran's top military leaders:

- General Mohammad Bagheri, who oversaw the entire armed forces;
- General Hossein Salami, who led the paramilitary Revolutionary Guard;
- And General Amir Ali Hajizadeh, the head of the ballistic missile programme.

Iravani said most of the injured are civilians.

Israel's ambulance service reported 34 people were injured on Friday night in Tel Aviv, most with minor injuries.

Police later said one person died.

Hours later, an Iranian missile reportedly hit homes in the central Israeli city of Rishon Lezion, killing two people and injuring 19.

All of these figures are based on tallies from authorities and have not been independently verified.

UK urges de-escalation at UNSC session amid rising tensions

The United Kingdom's UN envoy has called for calm as tensions escalated between Israel and Iran.

"We have urged both sides to show restraint and de-escalate tensions. We continue to engage partners across the region to ensure we are collectively doing our utmost to push for a peaceful outcome," Barbara Woodward added.

She said the UK had spoken at the highest levels to both Israeli and Iranian officials and reaffirmed its commitment to preventing further conflict.

"The UK, in partnership with the E3, has always championed a diplomatic solution to address Iran's nuclear escalation, which has no credible civilian justification," Woodward added.

The PM has also been interviewed by Bloomberg, where he mentioned that the UK has "grave concerns" about Iran's nuclear program and backed Israel's right to self-defense.

Prime Minister Keir Starmer said the UK has "grave concerns" about Iran's nuclear program and backed Israel's right to self-defense, while calling for de-escalation in a conflict that risks engulfing the Middle East.

Starmer was speaking after Israel carried out a wave of [strikes](#) on Iran, which have raised fears of a wider war in the region and caused a [spike](#) in the price of oil. Iran quickly replied by sending a wave of drones toward Israel, though it was unclear if they caused any damage.

Al Jazeera rolling update

Israel will close its diplomatic missions around the world in light of recent developments, and consular services will not be provided, according to a statement.

The embassy did not say how long the missions would be closed.

US President Donald Trump says Iran may have a second chance after claiming he gave Tehran 60 days to make a deal two months ago.

“Two months ago I gave Iran a 60 day ultimatum to “make a deal.” They should have done it! Today is day 61,” the president said in a Truth Social post.

“I told them what to do, but they just couldn’t get there. Now they have, perhaps, a second chance!”

CNN rolling update

Israeli strikes are ongoing in Iran, targeting several cities across the nation, state-run media said.

Iranian state television and state-affiliated media said the Natanz nuclear site was struck in a missile attack.

The outskirts of the cities of Tabriz and Shiraz were also targeted in what state television called “an aggressive attack”

Israel’s attack on one of Iran’s primary nuclear enrichment facilities caused “superficial damage,” according to the spokesman for the Atomic Energy Organization of Iran.

Behrouz Kamalvandi said the agency does not have an estimate of the damage to Natanz, but most of it was on the surface. Natanz’s enrichment capabilities are underground.

Guardian rolling update

The **UK** Conservative leader **Kemi Badenoch** referenced **Israel's** attack on **Iran** in her keynote address to the **Scottish Conservative conference** in **Edinburgh** this lunchtime, but only to attack Labour on energy and defence policy.

“The strikes overnight in the Middle East remind us of how vital it is that we can rely on our own energy and natural resources,” she told delegates, and went on to accuse UK Labour of “killing the oil and gas industry”, calling for the energy profits levy to be scrapped and the ban on new oil and gas licences to be lifted.

Look, I'm seeing this from the inside, and am admittedly biased towards our president (and my friend), but there's a lot of crazy stuff on social media, so I wanted to address some things directly on the Iran issue:

First, POTUS has been amazingly consistent, over 10 years, that Iran cannot have a nuclear weapon. Over the last few months, he encouraged his foreign policy team to reach a deal with the Iranians to accomplish this goal. The president has made clear that Iran cannot have uranium enrichment. And he said repeatedly that this would happen one of two ways--the easy way or the "other" way.

Second, I've seen a lot of confusion over the issue of "civilian nuclear power" and "uranium enrichment." These are distinct issues. Iran could have civilian nuclear power without enrichment, but Iran rejected that. Meanwhile, they've enriched uranium far above the level necessary for any civilian purpose. They've been found in violation of their non-proliferation obligations by the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), which is hardly a rightwing organization.

It's one thing to want civilian nuclear energy. It's another thing to demand sophisticated enrichment capacity. And it's still another to cling to enrichment while simultaneously violating basic non-proliferation obligations and enriching right to the point of weapons-grade uranium.

I have yet to see a single good argument for why Iran needed to enrich uranium well above the threshold for civilian use. I've yet to see a single good argument for why Iran was justified in violating its non-proliferation obligations. I've yet to see a single

good pushback against the IAEA's findings.

Meanwhile, the president has shown remarkable restraint in keeping our military's focus on protecting our troops and protecting our citizens.

He may decide he needs to take further action to end Iranian enrichment. That decision ultimately belongs to the president. And of course, people are right to be worried about foreign entanglement after the last 25 years of idiotic foreign policy.

But I believe the president has earned some trust on this issue. And having seen this up close and personal, I can assure you that he is only interested in using the American military to accomplish the American people's goals. Whatever he does, that is his focus.

Dear all,

This morning President Trump held his first exclusive media interview since the US acted against Iran's nuclear facilities in Operation Midnight Hammer on 22 June. This came at the end of a significant week for Trump, who in addition to securing a ceasefire between Israel and Iran has come away from NATO pleased with the 5% defence spending agreement, the signing the DRC/Rwanda peace agreement, and has seen several victories in the Supreme Court.

Capturing the Iran focused elements for Iran readers. ***

1. Describing **the run up to Operation Midnight Hammer**, Trump thought negotiations over Iran's nuclear sites were getting close, but Iran said it wanted enrichment. Trump explained that he wouldn't let this happen and that he didn't feel people would have understood it if he had. Iran was weeks away from getting a nuclear weapon. The 60-day talks had delayed Iran but ultimately the US decided to 'go at it', which 'just worked out'. Trump said he wanted it to also work out for Iran and Israel who were both beaten up by what he called the 12-day war. US action was in line with what he has been saying for the last 25-30 years, i.e. Iran cannot have a nuclear weapon.

2. On the operation itself, Trump was again unequivocal in stating that **the US obliterated their target**, referring to Fordow – ‘it was obliterated like nobody’s ever seen before’. He said that alternative narratives being espoused by outlets such as CNN and The New York Times were fake news. Energy Commissions had been there and there were thousands of tonnes of rock in that room right now, the ‘whole place was just destroyed’. Trump also referenced two other sites having been destroyed. The US had used the most sophisticated bombs anywhere in the world, which could penetrate 30 stories deep into granite. He praised the pilots who had flown 36 hours in confined spaces to hit a target the size of half a refrigerator door from 50,000 feet at rapid speed – they would be invited to the White House. The US had also launched 30 rockets from submarines, with the US having the ‘finest submarines in the world’. Every single rocket launched hit its target. Israel had done damage, but it was the US that did the final damage. The US went in, destroyed Iran’s nuclear capability, and stopped. He did not directly address comments by **Third Party**

3. Trump was questioned over reports that 400kg or 800 pounds of enriched uranium had been removed from Fordow prior to the strike. Trump said this had not happened. It was hard to do, heavy to move and the Iranian’s had little warning. Trump said that no one had thought the US would go after that site as it was believed to be impenetrable. **The Iranians didn’t move anything but themselves**, as they were all trying to live. Trump understands that there were masons working to seal up the site as there were cars there.

4. When questioned over whether Iran, who was halting cooperation with the UN nuclear watch dog, was likely to start pursuing nuclear enrichment again, Trump said that he thought this was the ‘last thing they’re going to be doing right now, for a period of time at least’. **Iran was exhausted**, and whilst they might not give up completely, they would give up whilst they were exhausted and instead focus on getting back into shape. He also described Israel as being tired following what had been a very intense period.

5. On the **Abraham Accords**, Trump said that Iran had been the primary problem and that more countries may now be onboard. Trump thought Iran may have been going to join the Abraham Accords at one point previously, but they didn’t – if they had they would have been better off than they were now.

6. On **sanctions**, Trump denied that he had waived the sanctions on Iranian oil with regard to China. Trump clarified that the sanctions were on. That said, one of the things Trump was thinking about doing was waiving sanctions for countries like Iran if they ‘behave themselves’. If Iran could show that they ‘were not going to do any more harm’ and be peaceful he would take the sanctions off and said that ‘sometimes you get more with honey than with vinegar’. Doing so would make a big difference as sanctions were very difficult for the countries they were imposed on. Trump wasn’t looking to make it difficult for Iran, but they were developing a bomb and the only reason to develop a bomb like that was, according to Trump, to use it. Trump also noted that sanctions were costly for the US.

7. The interview also touched on Trump’s tweet accusing the Democrats of **leaking information** about Operation Midnight Hammer [*The Democrats are the ones who leaked the information on the PERFECT FLIGHT to the nuclear sites in Iran. They should be prosecuted!*]. Trump reiterated that those responsible should be prosecuted and said that it would be easy to find out who had done it.

2. After a morning of rapid fire social media posts and interviews from the President, we have seen less public comment from the US this afternoon as the ceasefire appears to hold for now. When asked by reporters on Air Force 1 en route to the Hague whether he supported regime change in Iran, Trump said "no", adding that the US wants to "see everything calm down as quickly as possible". In a softer tone from this morning's comments, he added "The Iranians are very good traders, very good businesspeople, and they got a lot of oil. They should be fine... They should be able to rebuild and do a good job. They're never going to have nuclear. But other than that, they should do a great job, which is exactly what I've been saying for years."
3. In a TV interview, VP Vance delivered a similar message, saying "[Trump] has been saying it for 10 years. We can't let Iran have a nuclear weapon. He accomplished it, and now he's moving on, I think, to build more peace and more prosperity all across the Middle East. I think he showed the Iranians that they're not nearly as tough as they might think that they are. An update and some analysis from BE Washington on the day after US strikes against three Iranian nuclear sites.

What message has the Administration projected publicly today?

1. Vice President JD Vance, Secretary of State Rubio, Secretary of Defense Hegseth and Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff General Dan Caine appeared on Sunday news shows and held press conferences to deliver a unified message: **the United States was not at war with Iran and remained open to a deal, but any act of retaliation would be met with overwhelming force.** They emphasised that yesterday's military action was a targeted operation aimed solely at degrading Iran's nuclear capabilities, and that these efforts had been successful in significantly setting back Iran's nuclear programme. They stressed that President Trump had made every effort to offer Iran a fair deal, but Iran had failed to engage in good faith. If Iran chose to retaliate directly or through regional proxies or if it chose to pursue a nuclear weapon, the United States would respond with overwhelming force. All reiterated that the path to diplomacy and peace remained open – the ball was now in Iran's court. Secretary Rubio restated the US path towards a deal: Iran could maintain a civilian nuclear programme, but would not be permitted to enrich uranium or develop weapons-grade capabilities. Vance stressed that the US was not interested in a protracted conflict in the Middle East, but the way to achieve this was peace through strength.

2. In a series of Truth Social statements, **POTUS warned Iran against retaliation, praised the military for causing “monumental” damage and hinted at the possibility of regime change.** Shortly after his 10pm address to the nation, President Trump warned that “ANY RETALIATION BY IRAN AGAINST THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA WILL BE MET WITH FORCE FAR GREATER THAN WHAT WAS WITNESSED TONIGHT”. This afternoon he posted “the damage to the Nuclear sites in Iran is said to be “monumental”. The hits were hard and accurate. Great skill was shown by our military”. Soon after he posted “It's not politically correct to use the term, “Regime Change”, but if the current Iranian Regime is unable to MAKE IRAN GREAT AGAIN, why wouldn't there be a Regime change??? MIGA!!!”.

How has Congress responded?

3. **Prominent Republicans have offered full support for military strikes with some urging to go further, while Democrats have questioned the legality of strikes.** Senator Lindsey Graham (R-SC) called the operation “bold, brilliant and decisive”, praising the military and President Trump. He expressed support for Trump's suggestion of potential regime change, saying the President was right in aiming to make Iran great again - whether through a change in the regime's behaviour or new leadership. House Speaker Mike Johnson (R-LA) said the strikes demonstrated that Trump “means what he says” and argued that the President fully respected Article I which gives Congress the power to declare war. Marjorie Taylor Greene (R-GA) was critical, saying “every time America is on the verge of greatness, we get involved in another foreign war”. Democrats such as Senators Shaheen and Murphy have also been critical, accusing the President of misleading the country and failing to seek Congressional authorisation for the military action.

In a White House press briefing, Karoline Leavitt shared a message directly from the President: “Based on the fact that there is a substantial chance of negotiation that may or may not take place with Iran in the near future, I will make my decision whether or not to go within the next two weeks”. When asked what her message was to Trump supporters who opposed US involvement in the war, Leavitt said “Trust in President Trump. President Trump has incredible instincts and he has kept America and the world safe in his first term as President in implementing a ‘Peace through Strength’ foreign policy agenda. And with respect to Iran, nobody should be surprised by the President’s position that Iran can absolutely not obtain a nuclear weapon. He has been unequivocally clear about this for decades. [...] That’s why he was adamantly opposed to the disastrous Iran nuclear agreement that was implemented by President Obama and it’s why he has given great latitude and given a lot of effort to achieving a diplomatic solution. But he has been very clear: wait for 60 days, when he gave them that 60 days warning without coming to the table, on day 61 Israel took action against Iran. And as I just told you from the President directly, he will make a decision within two weeks.”

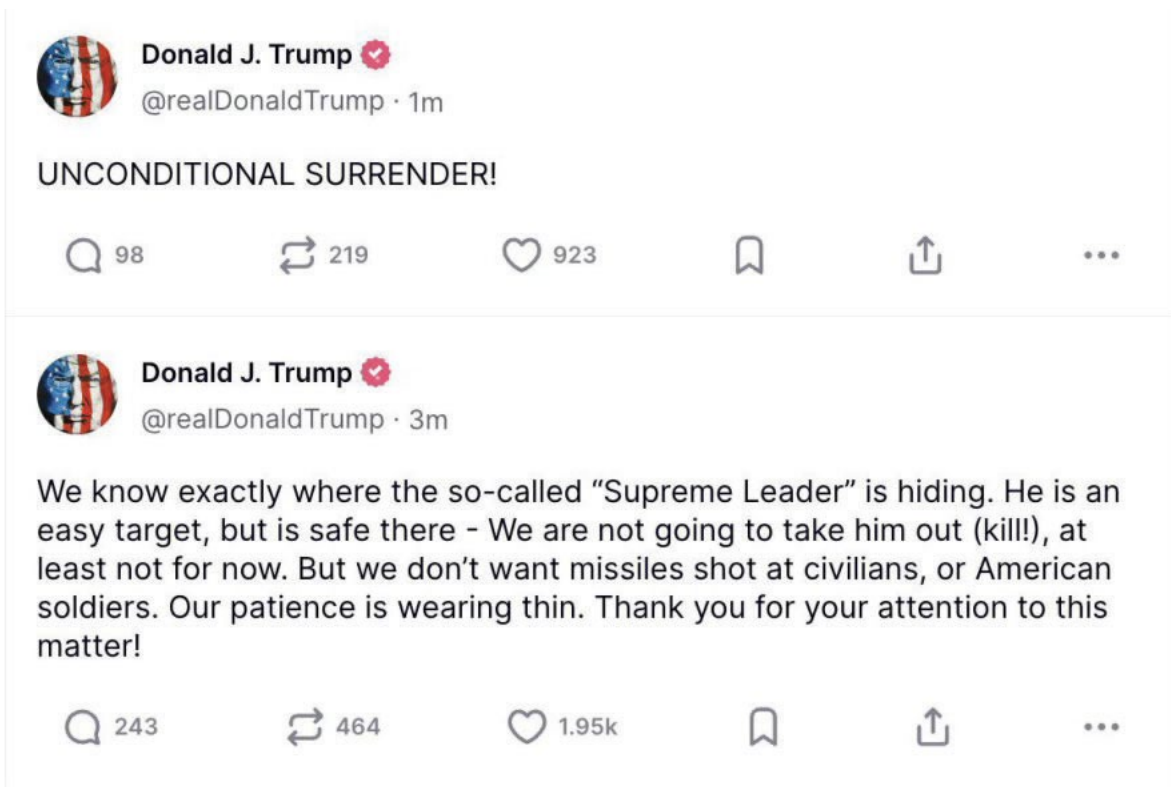

UK-US Tech Partnership

Negotiation approach

HMA British Embassy Washington, Peter Mandelson (HMA) and Minister Vallance (PV) explored the detail of the proposed, draft UK-US Tech Partnership focusing on the UK's latest text. They initially touched on the successful announcement of the UK's industrial strategy and HMA's positive recent visits relating to UK quantum research and development. HMA was struck by the equilibrium found between UK and US companies on this issue and strength of UK leadership. HMA outlined the positive opportunities of a tech partnership that could capitalise on this type of example. ***

AI infrastructure

HMA described the objectives of Pillar 1 of the draft tech partnership and the necessity of the getting AI infrastructure built out across the UK via both public and private sector investment, ***

AI will be disruptive, and we want it to be, but this is often pitched as a negative in overly cautious cross-government discussion.

Health Data

HMA highlighted previous discussions on moonshots and PV expanded on potential AI-driven opportunities for doing drug discovery end-to-end and personalising the whole approach to healthcare, albeit the latter might work better for the UK's holistic approach to healthcare rather than more specialised and disaggregated interventions in the US.

Partner of choice

HMA outlined this new area in the proposed tech partnership of how to ensure US companies consider the UK to be the partner of choice and that UK-based companies continue to prosper within that. PV set out the importance of being clear in any arrangement what the UK's growth approach; ***

Moonshots

HMA invited reflections on UK areas of strength that were either already captured by previous moonshot discussions or might be added to these.

PV expanded on the UK strengths in **quantum**, the challenges of scaling these and examples of expertise in error correction (including the potential application of AI to this). He also highlighted **fusion** as an area where the UK is particularly advanced in approaching a fusion outcome at scale. PV also described the UK's capabilities around small satellites, the potential for polar launch and earth observation in relation to **space**.

This was still felt to be something worth exploring, particularly in terms of the future focus on satellite solutions and importance of software developers in ensuring that satellites communicate effectively with one another.

It was felt that additional moonshots should be explored as well as exploring whether there were additional US-focused technologies that should be included.

Peter,

We spoke briefly in the margins of the leadership conference. I mentioned that I had run into Lord Robert Mair, chair of the Lords' Science and Technology Committee, who had been looking into why the UK's R&D in STEM is not translating into start-up success as effectively as other countries. Lord Mair is clear that we should be making competitive offers to US researchers and research teams, looking to e.g. stagger visa and associated costs over the lifetime of the visa rather than an off-putting upfront cost.

He wrote to the PM and Home Secretary on 6 May (pre-Immigration White Paper) and got a response from Minister Malhotra after its launch. Both attached. I'm afraid I can't help but think the UK is missing a trick here. You were of the same opinion and said you'd be interested in pursuing.

I refer to our conversation when we met this week on Tuesday 8th of July regarding the above.

You asked me to put in writing what I initially flagged up in a WhatsApp message to you on 28th February this year regarding the approach we received from persons of influence close to President Trump. That message related to a potential liaison gift of a personalized Despatch Box that would be presented to the President during his UK state visit. The reason I messaged you was because I was concerned that a presentation made on the fringes by anyone other than the Prime Minister or the monarch during a state visit would be potentially embarrassing both to the country and the office of the Prime Minister. For the sake of clarity I must make the distinction between the office per-se and the individual personality because over the many years, we have carefully avoided appearing to endorse anyone.

Thankfully and due in great part to a great deal of discrete hard work both here and the US, events have now taken shape and the matter will soon be on the right track, when the pre-advance team dealing with the state visit arrives next week. The discrete efforts have ensured that the initial approach we received can be discussed between ^{THIRD PARTY} and Lord Mandelson, who have a very close friendship: **Personal**

All of the above saves me the effort of having to write a circumlocutory, explanatory letter given the sensitive aspects of all the information I have been made aware of. However, I will make you aware and am happy for you to pass on this letter to whoever you consider should need to read it, of the following:

1. The initial approach regarding a bespoke Despatch Box for President Trump has been commercially costed, and we will not deviate from that cost. Those making the initial approach are aware of the costs associated with our privately commissioned bespoke Despatch Boxes.
2. President Trump's bespoke Despatch Box has already been designed and been met with approval.
3. Should either the office of the PM or BP take formal ownership of the commission, they will need to work within our lead time of 8–10 weeks for bespoke work.

This provides a short update on the Foreign Secretary's meeting with Baroness Theresa May in December last year, regarding support to the [Global Commission on Modern Slavery & Human Trafficking](#), chaired by Baroness May.

The Foreign Secretary expressed his desire that HMG continues to fund the Global Commission (see read-out below). To date, HMG has provided £500k since 2022. FCDO officials have continued to work with the Global Commission on potential future funding support following the successful launch of the Commission's inaugural [report](#) at a High-level event at the UN in April.

Following confirmation of Human Rights Department ODA budgets for SR1, we are in a position to agree further funding of £250k to the Global Commission in FY25/26, subject to agreeing deliverables as part of the necessary project proposal documentation. This will provide bridge funding to support the Commission in phase two of its work to begin implementation of the report's recommendations, whilst it secures longer term funding from private foundations and/or governments.

Before we confirm this approach to the Global Commission, we would like to check that SpAds are content given the FS's previous engagement with Baroness May.

We have agreed this approach with JCS in LCPO, in copy.

Dear all,

The Foreign Secretary met with Theresa May on 10 December following her

attendance of the FCDO Human Rights Day Reception. With thanks to JCS and JCS for the readout.

Modern Slavery

1. Baroness May spoke on the workstreams of the Global Commission on Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking: (i) forced labour in supply chains; (ii) effective implementation of international commitments; and (iii) civil society in crisis contexts. She outlined that the Commission is also examining cross-cutting themes of technology, climate change, and the cost of modern slavery. The Commission intends to complete its first report by the end of March 2025, to be launched early April 2025 at the United Nations in New York.

2. The Foreign Secretary spoke of his personal campaigns to (i) mainstream counter illicit finance work; and (ii) to address the situation of young people in institutional care globally. He noted how each of these overlapped with modern slavery work – as an enabler/driver and risk factor. The Foreign Secretary asked Baroness May if she was aware of HMG work on modern slavery internationally and she confirmed that the Commission was regularly in touch with FCDO officials.

3. The Foreign Secretary proactively raised the question of resourcing for continuation of the work of the Commission. Baroness May expressed thanks for the £500k contributed to date by HMG and indicated that the Commission expected a need for £10-12m for phase II of its work to 2030. The Foreign Secretary asked about progress with corporate and foundation donors and recommended reaching out to the Children's Investment Fund Foundation (CIFF) and Soros Foundation. He offered to contact Third Party and Alex Soros. The Foreign Secretary said that he hoped HMG would remain a funder of the Commission, without making specific commitments, and promised to remain engaged in its work.

Climate

4. The Foreign Secretary set out this government's progress in restoring its global leadership on climate, nature and green energy. The Kew Lecture firmly placed it at the centre of what the FCDO does. He highlighted the appointment of two new Special Representatives to help deliver on his priorities. The Foreign Secretary noted that UK leadership at COP29 demonstrated the importance of climate to the new Government, and that he was using his visits (Nigeria, South Africa, Barbados) to underscore this as a priority.

5. Theresa May agreed that the Government had made an impact; the Kew Lecture had received strong cut through domestically. She too was focused on this agenda through her role chairing the Aldersgate Group – which brought together businesses and also some NGOs (eg RSPB) to identify the policies business needed to drive progress towards Net Zero. She had been at COP29 and recognised what a difficult negotiation it had been. The UK announcements in Baku had been well received.

6. The Foreign Secretary highlighted the Global Clean Power Alliance – a vehicle for partnering with Barbados, Brazil and others who wanted to go faster on their energy transitions. Theresa May agreed this would be helpful. She thought there were untapped opportunities for cooperation on climate and nature through the Commonwealth, including on oceans. She recalled the 2018 Blue Ocean Initiative. The Foreign Secretary agreed: we have a moment to seize, with a new Head of the Commonwealth (HMTK), New PM and new Sec-Gen.

Further MwP and HMA's meeting on Wednesday 15 July, please find below a summary of the key points and next steps:

- **MwP** and **HMA** reaffirmed their support for the GREAT Campaign, recognising its role in promoting UK growth globally. **HMA** endorsed the upcoming 'GREATER Together' event in Los Angeles in May 2026, noting support from the British Consul General and key stakeholders such as **THIRD PARTY**
- **MwP** expressed her support for the event, having written to the Prime Minister, Chancellor, and Secretaries of State for DSIT and DBT, requesting their attendance and endorsement. The GREAT team, working with the US Network, has already made positive progress in securing support from external sponsors, including British Airways.
- **HMA** highlighted that the Prime Minister's attendance - as well as that of the Royal Family - could attract significant US engagement, particularly in light of the upcoming 250th anniversary of US independence. HMA also emphasised the long-term value of engaging US companies to reinforce the UK's investment appeal. It was also notable that ******* held a positive view of the UK and engaging him on the event could help in promoting the event to a wider audience across the US.
- **MwP** requested HMA's support in citing the Prime Minister on the event and helping to secure his attendance. HMA agreed and mentioned that he would seek opportunities to update the Prime Minister on the event during the President's upcoming State Visit to the UK.

It has afforded HMG strong relationships with figures at the highest levels of US politics, including members of the Cabinet, Congress, and the Supreme Court. ***

Iain set out his plan for a daylong event bringing together the US, UK, Australia, and Japan. He said the event would be run jointly with Center for the Study of the Presidency and Congress (CSPC), a non-partisan convener that we know well. CSPC would provide the venue for the event.
