Diplomacy

Former PM hosted [E3 leaders and Zelenskyy](#) setting out five conditions for peace [6/7 June]; [UK joined the €90 billion Ukraine Loan Support](#) Initiative at the Coalition of the Willing meeting in Paris [13 July] UK-Ukraine [100 Year Partnership first anniversary](#) celebrated achievements across defence & security, science & tech, economy & trade pillars [16 Jan]
Former PM hosted Zelenskyy to conclude the first year of the UK-Ukraine [Strategic Dialogue](#), recognising progress and identifying priorities for the year ahead [17 Mar]
Supported [UNGA resolutions](#) condemning Russia's: deportation of children [Dec 25]; attacks on Ukraine's energy infrastructure [Jul 24] attempted annexation of 4 Ukrainian regions [Oct 22]; invasion [Feb 25, Feb 23, Mar 22]
At [UNSC](#), we hold Russia to account & reaffirm support for Ukraine. At OSCE, we call out Russia weekly & co-fund Support Programme for Ukraine. [6 fact-finding missions](#) reported on human rights abuses.
At IAEA, we support efforts towards nuclear safety in Ukraine. We supported the [5 March resolution](#) at the Board of Governors [5 Mar]

Military

Delivering [150,000 drones](#) and 350 air defence missiles throughout 2026 [18 June]; over [£500m in air-defence support](#), including £150m via PURL [27 Mar] [Defence Industrial Support Treaty](#) [Jul 24]; expanded export finance cover incl. [£1.6bn for Thales](#) to supply 5,000 LMM missiles [Jul 25]; hundreds of [missiles delivered 5 months ahead](#) of schedule [Oct 25]; battlefield [technology agreement](#) boosts drone production [Jun 25]; Op INTERFLEX: >63,000 trained UK-administered International Fund for Ukraine procures equipment: >[£2.6bn](#) pledged to date

Non-military

£5.6bn in non-military commitments since Feb 22. This includes: up to [£4.1bn](#) in fiscal support through World Bank loan guarantees & up to £1.5bn in bilateral assistance. Provided over [£284m](#) in 25/26 to fund humanitarian, energy, reform, recovery & reconstruction
Former FS announced nearly [£290m bilateral aid package](#) for this financial year at the Ukraine Recovery Conference 2026 [25 June]

Humanitarian

Committed >[£577m](#) assistance to Ukraine and the region [Sep 25]
At least £100m in 2025/2026, incl. [£10m](#) for Ukraine Humanitarian Fund & [£8m](#) for targeted winter assistance [Dec 25 & Nov 25]
£15.5 million for HALO Trust for mine action, incl. [£2.25m](#) for 2026.
Over 1,131,304m² land cleared [June 22 to 31 Mar]

Recovery & Reconstruction

Energy

Over £750m for energy security and resilience through grant, in-kind support and loan guarantees
[£210m](#) for Urenco to supply nuclear fuel to Energoatom for the next two years [25 June]
£173m for the Ukraine Energy Support Fund including [£87m](#) for vital electricity network repairs and critical protection for gas & power infrastructure [24 Feb, 16 Jan, Nov 25 & Sep 25]
[£1.7m](#) for Ukraine's Green Transition Office in 25/26 [Jul 25]
[£17m](#) to support UK and Ukrainian innovators through a second round of UK's Innovate Ukraine Green Energy Competition [Feb 25]

Sanctions

>3,400 individuals, entities & ships sanctioned under the Russia [sanctions regime](#), incl. >3,200 since Putin's full-scale invasion; 600 vessels sanctioned including 580 oil tankers
UK, US and EU sanctions have denied Russia access to at least \$450bn since Feb 2022 - equiv. to ~2 years funding for the invasion
The UK successfully [intercepted a Shadow Fleet vessel](#) in the English Channel for the first time [14 June]
This Government has imposed sanctions against:
- [24 individuals and entities behind cyber and hybrid operations](#) [13 July 2026]
- [Russians developing chemical weapons](#) used to kill Alexei Navalny and Dawn Sturgess [6 July]
- [Nearly 300 targets](#), including energy revenues and military supply.
Largest sanctions package since early 2022 [24 Feb]

War Crimes & Justice

The UK has provided £16.5m to support Ukraine's domestic war crimes investigations
>£4m to support return & reintegration of forcibly deported Ukr children - 20,000 identified by pilot tracing mechanism since Sep 25
Supported the resolution establishing the Operating Model of the [Special Tribunal for the Crime of Aggression](#), adopted on 15 May
[Register of Damage](#) for Ukrainians to record war-related losses. UK chairs governing body & signed CoE convention on the establishment of a [Claims Commission](#) to assess claims [Dec 25]
