## 1. INTRODUCTION [5 MINS]

### 1.1 Interview context

- Thank you for taking the time to speak with me today. My name is ..., I work for SYSTRA's Social and Market Research team.
- SYSTRA, along with Frontier Economics and Field Locker, have been commissioned by the Department for Transport (DfT) to conduct research. This research seeks to improve understanding of the effects of the European Union (EU) and Schengen 90 in 180-day immigration rule (or 90/180 Schengen rule) on UK commercial road transport operators. This rule came into effect in January 2021 when the UK left the EU following the end of the EU exit transition period.
- This research will also explore current and anticipated impacts of the upcoming implementation of the EU's Entry and Exit System (or EES implementation), which is expected to begin on 12 October 2025.
- This research will provide DfT with a greater understanding of the ways UK commercial road operator sectors have adapted to EU or Schengen area immigration rules since the UK's exit from the EU, and ahead of the EU's EES implementation, and the impact this has had. Before we go any further, I'll briefly explain the 90/180 Schengen rule and anticipated implementation of EES:
  - Following the UK's exit from the EU in 2021, UK nationals are subject to a limit of spending 90 days in any 180-day period ("90/180") for short stays within the Schengen area. This visa-free limit applies to both permitted work and leisure journeys, is measured cumulatively across the entire Schengen area (rather than by country), and is calculated on a rolling basis. The limit is a fundamental part of the EU's conditions of entry for third country nationals. As such, it is not UK Government policy. Since EU exit, UK national hauliers and coach drivers have been subject to this limit.
  - From 12 October 2025, the EU's new EES will be implemented. This is a new digital border system that will make changes to how British nationals demonstrate compliance with the 90/180 Schengen rule, when they are travelling to the Schengen area. The Schengen area consists of 25 of the 27 EU member states<sup>1</sup> (that is all except for Cyprus and Ireland). It also includes 4 non-EU countries: Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland.
  - If you are travelling to a country in the Schengen area for a short stay using a UK passport, you will be required to register your biometric details, such as fingerprints and a photo, when you arrive. EES registration will replace the current system of manually stamping passports when visitors arrive to and leave a country in the Schengen area to calculate compliance with the 90/180 Schengen rule. Your digital EES record is valid for 3 years. If you enter the Schengen area again during this time, you will only need to provide a fingerprint or photo at the border, when you enter and exit.
  - If you frequently travel to the Schengen area for work and/or leisure purposes, you will need to ensure that your total stay in the Schengen area is no more than 90 days in every 180 days. You will need to be aware of the penalty and enforcement approach for exceeding the immigration limit in any individual Member State you plan to travel to, or through.

- How confident did you feel about your answer?
- What information or knowledge did you base your answer on?

### 2.1.3 How easy or difficult was it to answer that question? *[Ask once respondents have answered a question – test of answer option completeness]*

- What made it easy/difficult to answer this question?
- Were all the answer options relevant to the question?
- Do the answer options cover all possibilities, or are there any answer options missing?
- Are there any elements of the question you felt uncomfortable answering, or that you think anyone representing a coach or goods operator would feel uncomfortable answering?
- Do you think people will respond honestly to this question? If you don't think they'll respond honestly, what would be the reason for them not being honest?

- Why did you spend more/less time answering this question?

**3.1.1 Please can you tell me about the organisation you're representing today, and your role within it? Prompt, if needed, for:**

- Operator type, e.g. Heavy Goods Vehicle (HGV) operator, Light Goods Vehicle (LGV) operator, Mixed fleet goods operator, or Coach operator.
- The nature of their operations:
  - Goods operator types of commodities: e.g. Events/sports/exhibition hauliers; perishable goods; general haulage; manufacturing; removals; other.
  - Coach operator services: e.g. Regular services (timetabled, transporting passengers on a specified route); Special regular services (regular service with specific passengers (e.g. commuters); Occasional services (e.g. one-off tourist trips)
- Whether their organisation works in partnership with any other companies or operators to provide their services
- [If the organisation does partner with another company/operator] What the nature of the partnership is (e.g. 'sharing' drivers or vehicles)
- The number and type of vehicles in use by their organisation

**3.2 Current operations [Phase 2 duration ~5 mins]**

- *What proportion of drivers hold UK; EU or non-EU Schengen; other country passports, or, if more applicable, are nationals of the UK; EU or non-EU Schengen countries; or other countries*
- *The number of drivers (regardless of nationality and right to live and work in mainland EU and Schengen area) who make cross-border trips from the UK to the EU or non-EU Schengen area countries*

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<sup>2</sup> Only 2 EU member states are **not part of Schengen**: Cyprus and Ireland. The remaining 26 EU member states **are all part of Schengen**, and these are: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Czechia, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, and Sweden. Additionally, **four non-EU member states are part of Schengen**: Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway, and Switzerland.

- Let's now think about **driver assignments**, primarily for cross-border routes between the UK and mainland EU and Schengen area countries.

**3.3.2 What, if any, impact does the rights held by drivers to live and work in mainland EU and Schengen area have on how your organisation hires or contracts drivers? Prompt, if needed, to understand:**

- *How they hire or contract drivers, and what the impacts have been*
- *Or why this does not impact how they hire or contract drivers*

**3.3.3 How does your organisation assign drivers to cross-border routes between the UK and mainland EU and Schengen area countries? Prompt, if needed, to understand:**

- *If drivers' rights to work and live in Schengen area countries impacts how these routes are assigned*
  - *[If so] How?*
  - *[If so] What their current driver rotation patterns are for journeys into Schengen area countries, and how these are managed*
- *If any other factors influence driver assignments to cross-border routes between the UK and mainland EU and Schengen area countries*

**3.3.4 How flexible is your organisation to make changes to its driver rotation patterns to cross-border routes between the UK and mainland EU and Schengen area countries? Prompt, if needed, on:**

- *[If flexible] What changes they could make to driver assignments to cross-border routes between the UK and Schengen area countries*
- *[If flexible] How these changes are managed*
- *[If flexible] What issues they encounter when there are changes to driver assignments, and how these issues are overcome*
- *[If not flexible] What the main challenges to adapting driver rotation patterns for international routes are*

**3.4 Understanding changes in operations since EU exit [Phase 2 duration ~10 mins]**

- *The UK's exit from the EU*
- *COVID-19*

- Cross-border haulage rules (e.g. cabotage and cross-trade restrictions<sup>3</sup>) under the UK-EU Trade and Cooperation Agreement (TCA) and attitudes towards these
- Preparing for implementation of the EU's Entry/Exit System (EES)

### 3.5 Understanding changes in operations due to 90/180 Schengen rule [Phase 2 duration ~10 mins]

- We're now going to ask about your organisation's perceptions of the 90/180 Schengen rule.
- Would you like me to briefly repeat what the 90/180 Schengen rule entails?

  - This limitation on days applies both to work and leisure and is measured cumulatively across the entire Schengen area (rather than by country) and is calculated on a rolling basis.
- The 90/180 Schengen rule has applied to UK national hauliers and coach drivers since the EU exit.
- If you frequently travel to the Schengen area for work and/or leisure purposes, you will need to ensure that your total stay in the Schengen area is no more than 90 days in every 180 days.
- You will also need to be aware of the penalty and enforcement approach for exceeding the immigration limit in any individual Member State you plan to travel to, or through.

<sup>4</sup> The 90/180 Schengen rule means that UK nationals are allowed to spend a maximum of 90 days in any 180-day period within the Schengen area. This rule has been in place since EU single market arrangements ceased to apply to the UK, on 31 December 2020.

## Annex D Technical annex

### D.1 Survey boosting

Survey respondents were recruited by sending a survey link to operators registered in the Vehicle Operator Licensing database (VOL) as holding an SIOL. In addition to company names, VOL contains information on the number of authorised vehicles each company has (the fleet size). Fleet-size information included in VOL was cross-referenced with our survey responses. This comparison showed differences in fleet size between the companies that responded to the survey and all operators featured in VOL. The differences are shown in **Error! Reference source not found.** and are broken down by fleet size for goods operators who responded to our survey, for those in VOL, and for the corresponding fleet sizes of passenger operators.

Among goods operators who responded to the survey, a larger share had 0 to 1 authorised vehicles (19%) compared to all operators in VOL (11%). The share of operators with 2 to 5 vehicles was lower among survey respondents (32%) compared to those in the database (47%). There was also a 6% greater representation of the largest HGV operators (17%) than their representation in the database (11%). For passenger operators, the fleet-size distribution of survey respondents closely matched that of all operators in the database.

Ideally, the fleet-size distribution among both operator types responding to the survey would be similar to that recorded in the VOL. A higher level of similarity between the goods operators' fleet sizes reported in our survey and in VOL would indicate that our findings are more generalisable to the total population of goods operators. The differences in goods operator fleet sizes mean that the corresponding findings may be less representative of the total GB goods operator population than findings for passenger operators. However, it is important to note the VOL does not distinguish between operators that do and don't operate internationally. Therefore, it was not feasible to isolate those who specifically run services in the EU in this analysis.

### D.2 Data cleaning

Data-cleaning code was set up in RStudio, a software for statistical analysis. The data cleaning checks conducted included:

- ensuring each respondent had a unique ID
- checking there were no duplicate IDs
- ensuring variable labels and value labels matched the survey and were clear to interpret
- breaking-out multiple response sets, so each variable within a set had its own column in the data

- generating new variables with 'netted' categories that group adjacent values for analysis, providing larger sub-base sizes (for example, 'Strongly agree' and 'Agree' responses were combined into a new 'Net Agree' category)
- identifying respondents who may have submitted contradictory answers (for example, were not aware of the 90/180 Schengen rule, but went on to rate the impact of the rule on their business)
- identifying potential flatliners (for example, a respondent giving the same response to each question in a list of Likert scale responses)
- checking that survey routing had been applied correctly, so respondents had seen only the questions relevant to them based on their previous answers

### D.3 Survey analysis methodology

As described in the phase 1 framework, analysis of the pre-implementation survey data primarily relied on descriptive analysis. This was run separately for each of the goods and passenger operator samples, with breakdowns provided for relevant sub-groups. All analysis was conducted by Frontier Economics using anonymised data.

This involved generating frequency tables in [R](#) and choosing an appropriate data visualisation to ensure clarity in the findings.<sup>6</sup>

Statistical testing was conducted to identify statistically significant differences in the views and behaviour of the sample. For example, to identify differences by operator size (measured by fleet size) and whether operators run services in the mainland EU or the Schengen area. The appropriate testing was selected depending on the variable type. Due to limited data on the population of interest, the analysis was conducted without sample weights.

The overall sample size of 435 provides a maximum margin of error of  $\pm 4.7\%$  at the 95% confidence level. However, since the sample was based on a census approach rather than proportional representation, these figures are indicative. This means that if 50% of organisations in the overall sample agree with a particular statement, there is a 95% chance that the 'true' value in the overall population is between 45.3% and 54.7%. For goods operators, the sub-sample of 365 is still large enough to draw relatively robust conclusions. However, for the smaller sub-sample of passenger operators (70), more caution should be exercised in any analysis focusing specifically on these operators.

The overall sample size in the quantitative survey was lower than the project team initially anticipated. Anecdotally, from the qualitative research, the time pressures of day-to-day operations experienced by organisations (particularly smaller businesses) may have limited some businesses' capacity to participate. While the project team sought to mitigate this by extending the fieldwork window and offering multiple response options (web and CATI), this

does not mean the sample will be fully representative of the overall population. Rather, the sample covers the sentiments from a broad range of organisations with different characteristics.

## **D.4 Qualitative thematic analysis**

The thematic analysis conducted for this research was oriented towards identifying responses to key research questions. A coding framework was created based on findings from the initial eight cognitive interviews and expanded throughout the fieldwork period as new codes emerged. Additional codes were added after discussion with DfT. The SYSTRA qualitative research team met weekly to review interview findings, identify commonalities and differences across interviews, and determine which codes applied to the interview findings. These meetings between the researchers provided quality assurance by ensuring a common understanding of codes and themes and by discussing any differences in understanding and analysis. The qualitative research team consisted of one qualitative research lead and two additional qualitative researchers. The conduct and analysis of interviews were divided among these three researchers, and the qualitative research lead reviewed and quality-assured all write-ups, coding, and interview analyses to ensure consistency in approach and analysis quality.

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
