**SCREENING DECISION BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER THE
ELECTRICITY WORKS (ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT)
(ENGLAND AND WALES) REGULATIONS 2017 (“THE 2017
REGULATIONS”)**

NAME OF SCHEME: CW52274 BELVOIR SOLAR PV

Decision:

The Secretary of State concludes that the proposed works are not EIA development under the 2017 Regulations and do not require a statutory EIA as they are unlikely to have significant effects on the environment due to their nature, location and size. A copy of this letter has been sent to the LPA for information.

Screening decision for a proposed development (“the proposed development”) to:

- Modify an existing 132kV tower;
- Install downleads from tower onto new 132kV gantry



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Secretary of State considerations:

The Secretary of State has considered the factors set out in Schedule 3 of the 2017 Regulations, together with the information within the supplied documentation ("the Application") by National Grid Electricity Distribution ("the Applicant") in relation to the impacts on the environment of the proposed development and the views of Leicestershire County Council ("the LPA"). In reaching her decision the Secretary of State notes the following factors:

1. The proposed development does not fall within Schedule 1 (mandatory EIA);
2. The proposed development falls under Schedule 2 of the 2017 Regulations as the electricity line is 132kV kilovolts;
3. The proposed development does not fall within any designated sensitive areas.
4. The applicant consulted with Natural England (NE) and on 9 April 2026, NE confirmed they had no comments on the development (reference: 545504).
5. Public Notices regarding the proposed development were posted in local newspapers on 9 April 2026 and 16 April 2026. Zero representations were received regarding the proposed development by the deadline of 14 May 2026.
6. The Applicant consulted with the LPA which had no objection to the development on 19 May 2026.
