

Air Quality and Dust Monitoring Monthly Report – June 2026

High Speed Two (HS2) Limited has been tasked by the Department for Transport (DfT) with managing the delivery of a new national high speed rail network. It is a non-departmental public body wholly owned by the DfT.

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Monthly Summary

- 1.1.1 This Summary Report is published in fulfilment of commitments detailed in the High-Speed Rail (London-West Midlands) Environmental Minimum Requirements, Annex 1: Code of Construction Practice, for the nominated undertaker to present the results of air quality and dust monitoring undertaken in Stratford-on-Avon District (SoADC) during June 2026.
- 1.1.2 Figure 1 in Appendix A present the current worksites together with the dust monitoring locations.
- 1.1.3 This summary should be read in conjunction with the overview monitoring report monthly available from www.gov.uk/government/collections/monitoring-the-environmental-effects-of-hs2, which highlights: the applicable standards and guidance, as well as the air quality and dust monitoring methodologies to be implemented by nominated undertakers throughout construction.
- 1.1.4 The current worksites, as presented in Appendix A, Figure 1, include:

Southam worksite

Harp Farm

- Earthworks and Highways for A423 re-alignment.
- Haul road and SAR movements and repairs
- Ladbroke Cutting - Bulk Earthworks
- Lorry deliveries and yard storage.
- Hydro-demolition works on A423 OB
- Structural activities for A423.
- Water management of ponds and pumps
- General Maintenance

Kineton road

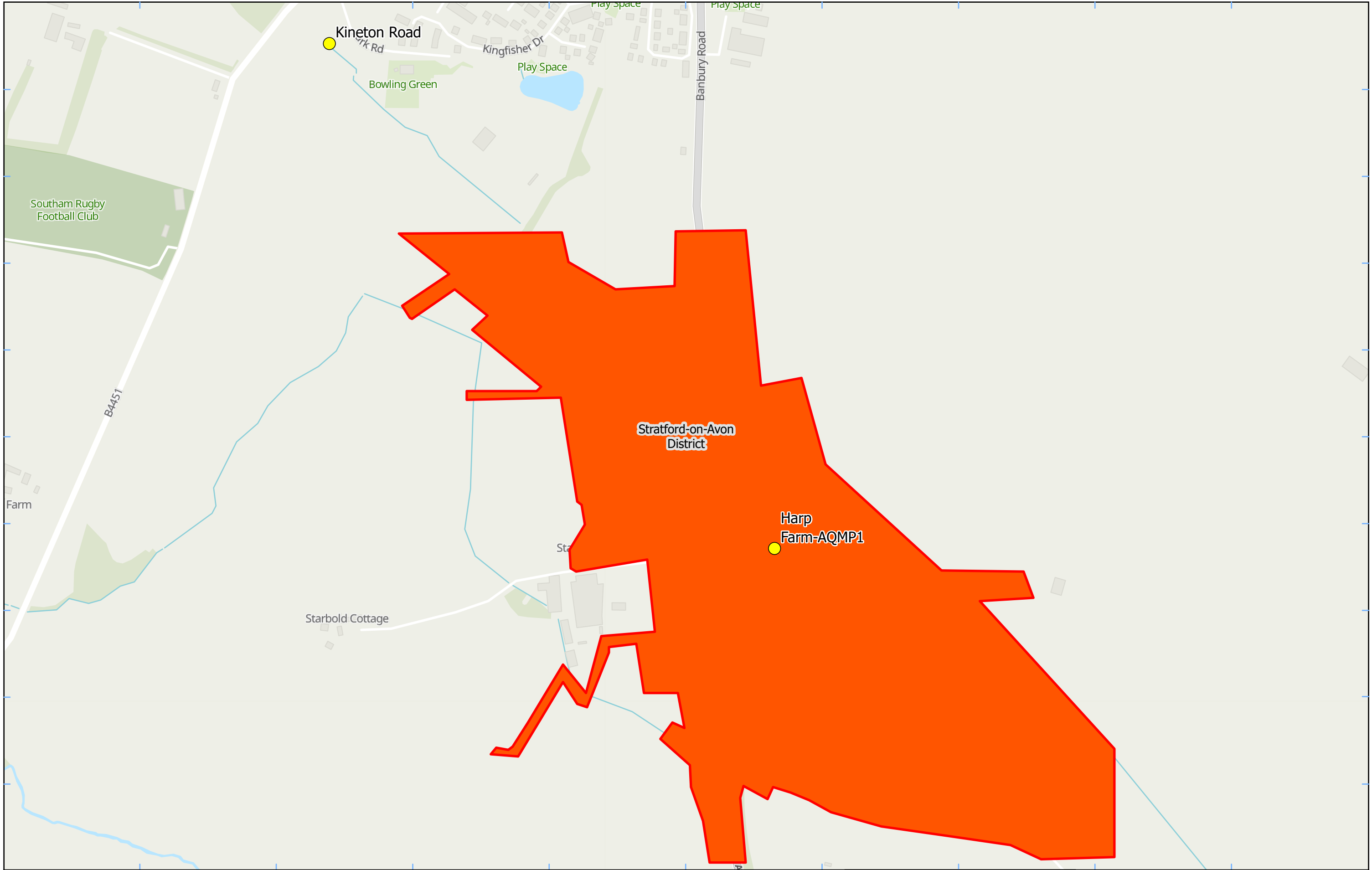
- Bulk Earthworks around Southam cutting and Southam culverts
- Kineton Road - highways and structural activities
- Water Management
- Haul Road and site access road movements and repairs
- Leamington Road Embankment Group - Bulk Earthworks
- Crushing in Southam Cutting
- General maintenance
- Water management

- 1.1.5 Two (2) dust monitors are installed around these worksites, where works are underway. These sites returned a medium dust risk rating.

- 1.1.6 The dust monitoring location and results are presented in Appendix B, Table 1, together with line charts of monthly data from each dust monitor presented in Figure 2. All continuous dust monitoring is undertaken using indicative monitors. Despite being Environment Agency (MCERTS) certified, indicative monitors carry a higher level of uncertainty than reference monitors, and therefore cannot be strictly compared with Air Quality Standards for human health and the environment. The purpose of the monitoring undertaken is to ensure the effectiveness of the on-site mitigation.
- 1.1.7 The trigger level for PM₁₀ concentrations of 190 µg/m³, over a 1-hour period, in accordance with the updated guidance document '*Guidance on Monitoring in the Vicinity of Demolition and Construction Sites – (October 2018)*' has been applied.
- 1.1.8 No (0) dust trigger alerts were recorded during the monitoring period (June 2026).
- 1.1.9 There were no (0) complaints received during the reporting period (June 2026).
