

Permitting decisions - Surrender

We have decided to accept the surrender of the permit for Redenham Park Farm Poultry Unit operated by Redenham Agriculture Limited.

The permit number is EPR/KP3902LP/S002

The decision was issued on 24/09/2026.

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid any pollution risk and to return the site to a satisfactory state. We consider in reaching this decision that we have taken into account all relevant considerations and legal requirements.

Purpose of this document

Key issues of the decision

During determination the key issues highlighted and taken into account was the confirmation from the Environment Officer who confirmed that the site was satisfactory and considered a low risk surrender. A Site Condition Report was not required for this determination as the permitted activities did not take place during the length of the permit. The applicant confirmed that the land remained arable and the only land that was in use was the part of the installation used to stock 32,000 birds that were present before the permit was granted. The operator has confirmed that there have been no pollution incidents and that there is nothing to be decommissioned. The Environment Officer also confirmed that the activities did not take place at the installation.

Decision considerations

Confidential information

A claim for commercial or industrial confidentiality has not been made.

The decision was taken in accordance with our guidance on confidentiality.

Identifying confidential information

We have not identified information provided as part of the application that we consider to be confidential.

The decision was taken in accordance with our guidance on confidentiality.

Pollution risk

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to avoid a pollution risk resulting from the operation of the regulated facility.

Satisfactory state

We are satisfied that the necessary measures have been taken to return the site of the regulated facility to a satisfactory state, having regard to the state of the site before the facility was put into operation.

Growth duty

We have considered our duty to have regard to the desirability of promoting economic growth set out in section 108(1) of the Deregulation Act 2015 and the guidance issued under section 110 of that Act in deciding whether to accept this permit surrender.
